BY THE KING.

A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by the Royal and Parliamentary Titles Act, 1927, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for Us by Our Royal Proclamation under the Great Seal of the Realm issued within six months after the passing of the said Act to make such alteration in the style and titles at present appertaining to the Crown as to Us may seem fit :

AND WHEREAS our present style and titles are, in the Latin tongue, "Georgius V. Dei Gratia Britanniarum et terrarum transmarinarum quae in ditione sunt Britannica Rex, Fidei Defensor, Indiae Imperator," and in the English tongue, "George V. by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India :"

AND WHEREAS We have received a recommendation from the representatives of Our Governments in Conference assembled that Our style and titles should be altered as in manner hereinafter appearing :

WE HAVE thought fit, and We do hereby appoint and declare, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, that henceforth so far as conveniently may be, on all occasions and in all instruments wherein Our style and titles are used, the following alteration shall be made in the style and titles at present appertaining to the Crown, that is to say, in the Latin tongue, for the word "Britanniarum" there shall be substituted the words "Magnae Britanniae, Hiberniae," and in the English tongue, for the words "the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of" the words "Great Britain, Ireland and."

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Thirteenth day of May, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and in the Eighteenth year of Our Reign.

PROCLAMATION No. 46.

THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance (Chapter 157 of the Revised Edition) it is provided that the Governor may at any time by Proclamation declare any area to be an infected area; extend, diminish, or otherwise alter the limit of an area declared to be an infected area; declare an infected area to be free from disease; and/or for the purpose of preventing disease prohibit the removal of animals from one district, place or area, to any other district, place or area.

And whereas by Government Notice No. 231, dated the 3rd day of July, 1919, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 13 of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Chapter 1 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to depute the person for the time being holding the office of Chief Veterinary Officer to exercise on his behalf the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers so conferred and all other powers thereunto enabling me, I hereby declare the following farms to be

infected areas for the purposes of the said Diseases of Animals Ordinance.

EAST COAST FEVER.

Farm L.O. No. 2914, Sir Graham Moon, Thomson's Falls, Laikipia District.

RINDERPEST.

Farm L.O. No. 3777/58, Sir John Ramsden, Kipipiri Estate, Gilgil, Naivasha District.

Farm L.O. No. 827, Messrs. Barnes Bros., Hoey's Bridge, Uasin Gishu District.

And further I do hereby declare that the following Proclamation is revoked:—
