PROCLAMATION No. 47.

THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance (Chapter 157 of the Revised Edition), it is provided that the Governor may at any time by Proclamation declare any area to be an infected area; extend, diminish, or otherwise alter the limit of an area declarea to be an infected area; declare an infected area to be free from disease; and/or for the purpose of preventing disease prohibit the removal of animals from one district, place or area, to any other district, place or area.

And whereas by Government Notice No. 231, dated the 3rd day of July, 1919, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 13 of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Chapter 1 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to depute the person for the time being holding the office of Chief Veterinary Officer to exercise on his behalf the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers so conferred and all other powers thereunto enabling me, I hereby declare the following farms to be infected areas for the purposes of the said Diseases of Animals Ordinance.

RINDERPEST.

Farm L.O. No. 422, The Hon. G. Cole, Kekopey, Gilgil, Naivasha District.

EAST COAST FEVER.

Those portions of Farms L.O. Nos. 430, 431, 1155, and 1857, The Rt. Hon. Lord Delamere, Soysambu, Elmenteita, Nakuru District, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the northera boundary of the Kenya and Uganda Railway, 100 feet reserve opposite Telegraph Post No. 426/8; thence easterly by a fenced line bearing roughly 85° for a distince of approximately 4,000 feet; thence north-easterly by a fenced line bearing roughly 30° for approximately 7,500 feet to a gate; thence northerly by a fenced line bearing roughly 360° for a distance of approximately 9,000 feet to a tank; thence generally easterly by fenced lines bearing roughly 75° for approximately 4,200 feet, 50° for 3,000 and 90° for 2,300 feet to a point in the vicinity of a cattle dip; thence generally south-easterly and southerly by fenced irregular lines the bearings and distances of which are very approximately 180° for 1,000 feet, 105° for 3,000 feet, 180° for 2,200 feet, 80° for 3,000 feet, 145° for 1,300 feet, 185° for 3,800 feet, 225° for 6,000 feet, 270° for 2,000 feet, 170° for 3,500 feet, 145° for 6,500 feet and 170° for 3,000 feet to a beacon on the generally northern boundary of Farm L.O. No. 1857; thence generally westerly by part of the northern and the whole of the western boundaries of that portion by fenced lines bearing 208° 13′ 09″ for 5,200 feet, 268° 07′ 19″ for 3,002·8 feet, 289° 51′ 42″ for 8,540·7 feet and 2020 44' 20" for 2,415 4 feet to a beacon on the northern boundary of the Kenya and Uganda Railway 100 feet reserve in the vicinity of Telegraph Post No. 423/14; thence by that northern reserve boundary up-line to the point of commencement.

Farm L.O. No. 3357, Captain D. Sharp, Ngobit, Laikipia District.

And further I do hereby declare that the following portions of Proclamations are revoked:—

That portion of Proclamation No. 13, dated the 11th day of February, 1926, declaring Farms L.O. Nos. 2497 and 2498, Captain Cottar, Laikipia District, to be infected areas (East Coast Fever).

Those portions of Proclamation No. 9, dated the 28th day of January, 1926, declaring that portion of the Rumuruti Township (L.O. No. 3671) north-west of the River Narok, excluding the river, Laikipia District, the main Rumuruti-Nyeri Road from the Rumuruti Township boundary to the southern boundary of Farm L.O. No. 6192, Segara Outspan, Laikipia District, Farm L.O. No. 2585, Messrs. G. & T. Crawford, Ngobit River, Laikipia District, to be infected areas (East Coast Fever).

That portion of Proclamation No. 75, dated the 16th day of September, 1923, declaring Farm L.O. No. 5134, Capt. N. P. Tucker, Rumuruti, Laikipia District, to be an infected area (East Coast Fever).

That portion of Proclamation No. 5, dated the 7th day of January, 1926, declaring Farm L.O. No. 2431, (Crown Land), Rumuruti, Laikipia District, to be an infected area (East Coast Fever).

That portion of Proclamation No. 20, dated the 4th day of March, 1926, declaring that portion of Farm L.O. No. 2432, (Crown Land), Laikipia District, commencing at a point on the southwestern boundary of the above farm where the River Aiyam crosses the boundary; thence following that boundary in a northerly direction to a point crossed by a tributary of the River Aiyam; thence following this tributary in a south-easterly direction to its junction with the River Aiyam, and following the River Aiyam in a westerly direction to the point of commencement, to be an infected area (East Coast Fever).

That portion of Proclamation No. 95, dated the 17th day of April, 1924, declaring Farm L.O. No. 3358, Captain L. V. Adair, Ngobit, Laikipia District, including the road passing through the farm, to be an infected area (East Coast Fever).

That portion of Proclamation No. 77, dated the 23rd day of September, 1926, declaring that portion of Farm L.O. No. 2152 occupied by Messrs. Pearson and Waverton, Trans Nzoia District, to be an infected area (Contagious Bevine Pleuro-pneumonia).

STRIGA WEED.

DISEASES OF PLANTS PREVENTION ORDINANCE, 1910.

UNDER Regulation No. 7 of the above Ordinance, I hereby direct that every occupier of land on whose holding the parasitic weed *Striga Hermonthica* occurs shall uproot every striga plant before it shall set seed.

Striga Hermonthica is a square-stemmed, erect plant, one to two feet high, rough and hairy. Leaves undivided, 1 to 3 inches long and up to ½ an inch wide. Pink or red flowers are produced on a spike up to 6 inches long. The seeds are very minute. On drying and when dead the plant turns quite black.

The weed is generally to be found growing upon the roots of maize plants but may also be found near sugar cane, mtama and wimbi or any member of the grass family.
