THE SHOP HOURS ORDINANCE, 1925.

ORDER.

WHEREAS by Proclamation No. 52, dated the 9th day of August, 1927, it is appointed that the Shop Hours Ordinance, 1925, shall come into operation in the Nairobi Municipality on the 1st day of September, 1927.

AND WHEREAS by Section 8 of the said Ordinance it is provided that all shops in townships and other areas to which the Ordinance applies shall be closed for the serving of customers on Sundays except where any local authority applies for exemption from Sunday closing, in which case the Governor in Council may grant such exemption either as to the whole or part of Sunday and either generally or in respect of any particular class of shops or trades:

AND WHEREAS the Nairobi Corporation has applied for exemption from Sunday closing up to 1 o'clock in the afternoon of the trades or businesses specified in the Schedule hereto:

NOW, THEREFORE, IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by section 8 of the aforesaid Ordinance, and having taken the advice of my Executive Council, I do hereby grant exemption from Sunday closing up to 1 o'clock in the afternoon to the trades or businesses mentioned in the Schedule to this order.

#### SCHEDULE.

- 1. The sale by retail of intoxicating liquors.
- 2. The sale of refreshments.
- 3. The sale of motor, cycle, and aircraft supplies and accessories to travellers.
  - 4. The sale of newspapers and periodicals.
- 5. The sale of meat, fish, milk, cream, bread, confectionery, fruit, vegetables, flowers and other articles of a perishable nature.
- 6. The sale of tobacco and smokers' requisites and of the preparation locally known as "pansopari."
- 7. The sale of medicines and medical and surgical appliances.
- 8. Retail trade carried on at an exhibition or show, if the local authority certify that such retail trade is subsidiary or ancillary only to the main purpose of the exhibition or show.

#### THE LAWS OF KENYA.

The date shown at the beginning of each Ordinance included in the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya and of each Ordinance appearing in the Annual Volumes for 1924, 1925 and 1926 is in all cases the date on which the Ordinance (or, where more than one Ordinance has been incorporated in a Chapter of the Revised Edition, then the Principal Ordinance) was assented to by the Governor.

In the majority of instances the date of assent was the date on which the Ordinance actually came into operation. In a number of cases, however, Ordinances have come or are to come into operation on dates other than the dates of assent, for instance, on the publication of a Notice or Proclamation in the Gazette or on a date mentioned in the Ordinance itself, and in such cases the actual dates of commencement do not appear in the Revised Edition nor, except in a few instances, in the Annual Volumes of Ordinances mentioned above.

The following table shows the dates of commencement of all Ordinances passed prior to the 31st December, 1926, which came into operation on dates other than the dates of assent:—
