OBITUARY.

HIS Excellency the Governor desires on behalf of Government to express the deep regret felt by all branches of the Service at the death of JOHN OWEN WEBLEY HOPE, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, on September 15th, 1927.

Mr. Hope retired on pension on August 2nd, 1927, after 28 years' service in the Kenya Administration during which he filled with distinction the posts of District and Provincial Commissioners. For 2 years during the East African Campaign he was Chief Political Officer and was made a Companion of the Order of Saint Michael and Saint George in 1918 in recognition of that service. In 1925 he was appointed as a British Commissioner on the Anglo-Italian Boundary Commission. He was a member of the Legislative Council from April 1924 to December, 1926.

Mr. Hope earned the affectionate regard of all races by his admirable qualities, and his sound judgment and knowledge of the country. His loss will be greatly felt by his many friends throughout Kenya.

HIS EXCELLENCY the Governor has approved of the following Bill being introduced into Legislative Council :—

A Bill to Amend the Widows and Orphans Pension Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "the Widows and Orphans Pension (Amendment) (No. 2) Ordinance, 1927," and shall be read as one with the Widows and Orphans Pension Ordinance (Chapter 34 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter called "the Principal Ordinance."

2. Sub-section (1) of section 28 of the Principal Ordinance (as repealed and replaced by section 4 of the Widows and Orphans Pension (Amendment) Ordinance, 1927) is hereby amended by the deletion of all the words from and including the word "and" at the end of the ninth line thereof and by the substitution therefor of the following words :—

"and pension at the same rate shall be granted if such a contributor, having left the East African Service otherwise than on transfer to other service under

Amendment of section 28 (1) of the Principal Ordinance.

the Crown, ceases to contribute on leaving the East African Service, and dies within a period dating from the day of his leaving the service and equal to one third of the number of completed months during which he contributed."

Commencement. 3. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have commenced and come into operation on the first day of January, 1926.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

Arising out of the repeal and replacement of sections 27 and 28 of the Principal Ordinance by sections 3 and 4 of the Widows and Orphans Pension (Amendment) Ordinance, 1927, the Secretary of State points out that sections 27 and 28 (as repealed and replaced) conflict, in that section 27 provides that if a transferred officer who is married or a widower with pensionable children ceases to contribute on his transfer, his widow, or in certain events his children, will receive on his death at any time a pension corresponding to the payments he has made; whereas section 28 provides that in such a case the widow or children, as the case may be, would receive a pension at four-fifths of the rate given by the pension tables.

These conflicting provisions must be reconciled and the Secretary of State has accordingly given instructions that the latter part of section 28 (1) (as repealed and replaced) shall be so worded as to exclude such an officer leaving the East African Service on transfer, thus making it clear that if a transferred officer who is married or a widower with pensionable children ceases to contribute on his transfer, his widow, or children, as the case may be, will receive on his death at any time a pension corresponding to the payments he has made, and not a pension at four-fifths of the rate given by the pension tables.

THE ROADS PROTECTION ORDINANCE, 1924.

IN EXERCISE of the powers vested in him by section 3 of the Roads Protection Ordinance, 1924, His Excellency the Governor has, with the concurrence of the Local Authority within the meaning of the said section, been pleased to order that the section of the Kilindini Road Reserve traversing and forming part of Treasury Square, and thence from the point where it debouches from Treasury Square to the point where it makes junction with the southern end of Ndia Kuu, shall be closed to all hamali-cart and steel-shod traffic propelled by animal or man power with the exception of those portions thereof where especially prepared tracks and demarcated crossing places have been provided for the use of such traffic.

IN EXERCISE of the powers vested in him by section 3 of the Roads Protection Ordinance, 1924, His Excellency the Governor has, with the concurrence of the Local Authority within the meaning of the said section, been pleased to order that the right-hand carriage-way leading from Molo between mile 0 and mile 1 and between mile 2 and mile 14 respectively, forming part of the West Molo Road shall be closed to all kinds of wheeled traffic except the following, namely :—

- (a) Pedal cycles;
- (b) Motor cycles with or without sidecar attachments;
- (c) Light buck-boards or carts used for carrying passengers only;
- (d) Motor vehicles not exceeding 3 tons gross weight when loaded, excluding those with metal tyres.

THE COLLECTIVE PUNISHMENT ORDINANCE.

(Chapter 77 of the Revised Edition).

WHEREAS it has been proved to my satisfaction that certain cattle the property of Colonel Newell have been stolen and that the said cattle have been tracked to within the limits of north-eastern portion of the Koret of Kabore Location 7, Nandi District, Nyanza Province, and that the inhabitants of that Koret failed and neglected to restore the property or to take the tracks beyond the limits of such location and thereby rendered themselves liable to the imposition of a fine under the Collective Punishment Ordinance, (Chapter 77 of the Revised Edition), section 2 (c).

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Edward William Macleay Grigg, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, upon whom His Majesty has conferred the decoration of the Military Cross, Lieutenant-Colonel in His Majesty's Army (retired), Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Collective Punishment Ordinance do hereby impose a collective fine of Shs. 1,500 upon the inhabitants of Location 7, Koret Kabore, Nandi District, Nyanza Province.

DECORATION.

GEORGE R.I.

George the Fifth by the Grace of God of Great Britain Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King Defender of the Faith Emperor of India to all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting!

WHEREAS by Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the ninth day of June one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one we were graciously pleased to make, ordain and establish rules and ordinances for the governance of The Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration reserving to Ourselves Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling altering abrogating augmenting interpreting or dispensing with those rules and ordinances or any part thereof by a notification under Our Sign Manual :

AND WHEREAS the riband for the suspension of the said Decoration which was approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was one inch and a quarter in width and it is provided in Our said Warrant that the Decoration shall be suspended from the left breast by a green riband of one inch and a half in width from a silver brooch :

AND WHEREAS reproductions of the said Decoration known as Miniature Decorations are worn on certain occasions and it appears to Us to be expedient that the size and pattern of such Miniature Decorations should be clearly defined :

NOW, THEREFORE, WE do by these Presents for Us Our Heirs and Successors ordain and appoint that the second rule and ordinance in Our said Warrant shall be cancelled and annulled and the following rule and ordinance shall be substituted therefor :

Secondly : It is ordained that the Decoration shall be worn after all British War Medals suspended from the left breast by a green riband of one inch and a-quarter in width, from a silver brooch :

AND WE do further make ordain and establish the following additional rule and ordinance :—

It is ordained that reproductions of the Decoration in miniature which may be worn on certain occasions by those to whom the Decoration is awarded shall be half the size of the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration and that a Sealed Pattern of the said Miniature Decoration shall be deposited and kept in the Central Chancery of Our Orders of Knighthood.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's this 22nd day of June in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven and in the eighteenth year of Our Reign.

THE CROWN OFFICE RULES (No. 2) ORDER, 1927.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 27th day of June, 1927.

PRESENT,

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Royal Proclamation made in pursuance of section 1 of the Royal and Parliamentary Titles Act, 1927, ^(a) His Majesty has appointed and declared, amongst other things, that henceforth, so far as conveniently may be, on all occasions and in all instruments wherein the style and titles appertaining to the Crown are used, the following alteration shall be made in the style and titles now appointed namely, for the words " the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of," there shall be substituted the words " Great Britain, Ireland and " :

AND WHEREAS it is provided by section 2 of the said Act that Parliament shall hereafter be known as and styled the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and that in every Act passed and public document issued after the passing of that Act the expression " United Kingdom " shall unless the context otherwise requires mean Great Britain and Northern Ireland :

AND WHEREAS it is provided by section 3 of the Crown Office Act, 1877, ^(b) that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, make and when made from time to time revoke, add to or alter Rules prescribing the form in which documents to which that Act applies, are to be worded :

AND WHEREAS the provisions of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, ^(c) have been complied with :

NOW, THEREFORE, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

1. The following Rule shall apply to any document of such a character or belonging to such a class as would, when this Order comes into operation, be required to be, or usually would be, authenticated by being passed under the Great Seal :—

RULE.

Where any of the expressions set out in the first column of the Schedule hereto occurs in the prescribed or customary form of any document to which this Rule applies, then the corresponding expression or one of the corresponding expressions set out in the second column of that Schedule may be substituted therefor, if the context so permits, for the purpose of documents issued after this Rule comes into operation.

TENDERS are invited for the supply of general provisions, sweets, tea, coffee beans, wines, spirits, beers, local mineral waters, tobacco, cigarettes, etc., from the 1st January to 31st December, 1928.

1. Only approximate quantities of requirements can be given, as per lists which can be inspected at the Railway Stores Offices at Nairobi and Kilindini, where any further information can be obtained that is desired. The Railway does not undertake to order all the items or quantities shown on such lists.

2. Orders will be placed from time to time during the period stipulated for such articles and for such quantities as may be required. In regard to beer, mineral waters, wines, spirits, cigarettes, tobacco, etc., the Railway does not bind itself to any particular brand, or make, but will sell such brands and makes as are selected for the year as required.

3. Quotations should be for delivery either at the Railway Stores, Nairobi or Kilindini, (Depot to be specified in the Tender) and should include cost of packing, etc.

4. The brands, makes and sizes of the packing to be specified against each item, and prices to include the full quantity in sound condition.

5. Tenders in sealed envelopes marked "Tenders for Catering Stores" should reach the Acting Chief Storekeeper, Kenya and Uganda Railway (P.O. Box 40), Nairobi, on or before the 26th October. Tenders received after that date will not be considered.

6. The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.
