GOVERNMENT NOTICE NO 507.

HIS EXCELLENCY the Governor has approved of the following Bill being introduced into Legislative Council:-G. R. SANDFORD,

Clerk to the Legislative Council

Bill to Provide for the Notification and Registration of Births and Deaths and Other Matters Incidental Thereto.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:-

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as "the Births and Short title. Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1927."
- 2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise Interpretation. requires :-
 - "Birth" means the issuing forth of any child from its mother after the expiration of the twenty-eighth week of pregnancy, whether alive or dead;
 - "Police officer" means a police officer in charge of a police station;
- " Prescribed particulars " means— 10
 - (i) as to any birth, the name, sex, date and place of birth, and the names, residence, occupations and nationality of the parents;
 - (ii) as to any death, the name, age, sex, residence, occupation and nationality of the deceased, and the date, place and cause of death;
 - (iii) such other particulars as may be prescribed by the Rules;
 - "Registrar General" means the Registrar General of Births and Deaths for the Colony;
 - Registrar" means a registrar appointed to register births and deaths in any area;
 - The Rules" means Rules made under section 27 of this Ordinance;
- "The Statistician" means the Statistician to the Con-25 ference of East African Governors.

Administration.

3. The Governor shall appoint a Registrar General of Registrar Births and Deaths for the Colony.

4. The Governor may from time to time, by notice in Appointment of the Gazette, appoint any area in the Colony to be a "registration areas" and tion area " for the purposes of this Ordinance, and may appoint Registrars. fit and proper persons to be the Registrars for each registration area.

5. (1) The Registrar General shall provide each Register books Registrar with such register books and forms as may be to Registrars. required, and with such instructions as he may consider necessary, for the registration of births and deaths in his

(2) Every Registrar shall keep safely each of the said register books until it shall be filled, and shall then deliver it to the Registrar General to be kept by him with the records of his office.

REGISTRATION.

Register of births and deaths.

158 J. S. 30

6. It shall be the duty of every Registrar to keep a register of births and a register of deaths and to enter therein, respectively, the prescribed particulars of every birth and death notified to him.

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Period for registration.

7. A Registrar shall not register a birth or death after the expiration of six months from the date of such birth or death: Provided that where the registration of such birth or death is compulsory under the provisions of this Ordinance the Registrar shall enter it in the register upon receiving the 10 written authority of the Registrar General, and upon payment of the prescribed fee.

Compulsory registration of births.

8. (1) The registration of the birth of a child shall be compulsory if either one or both parents are of European or American origin or descent, or, in the case of an illegitimate 15 child, not recognised by its father, if the mother is of European or American origin or descent.

Power to extend compulsory provisions.

(2) The Governor may, by notice in the Gazette, declare that from a date to be named in the notice the registration of births of all persons in the Colony of any particular race, class, 20 tribe, or group, or of all or some of the inhabitants of any particular town, district or area, shall be compulsory.

Mode of registration of births.

9. Every person notifying the birth of a child shall, to the best of his knowledge and ability, give the prescribed particulars, which shall be entered forthwith by the Registrar in 25 the register, and the person notifying the birth shall certify to the correctness of the entry by signing or, if he be illiterate, by fixing his mark to the register.

Duty to notify births where registration is compulsory. 10. Upon the birth of any child, the registration of whose birth is compulsory, it shall be the duty of the father 30 and mother of the child, and, in default of the father and mother of the occupier of the house in which to his knowledge the child is born, and of every person present at the birth, and of the person having charge of the child, to give notice of the birth, within twenty days next after the birth, to the 35 Registrar of the registration area in which the birth occurs:

Provided that in the case of births in prisons, hospitals, orphanages, barracks or quarantine stations, the duty to give such notice shall lie on the officer in charge of the establishment in which the birth took place.

Illegitimate child.

11. No person shall be bound as father to register the birth of an illegitimate child, and no person shall be entered in the register as the father of such child except at his own request and upon his acknowledging himself to be the father of the child and signing or affixing his mark to the 45 register as such.

Duty to notify finding of exposed new born child.

12. Where any living new-born child is found exposed, it shall be the duty of any person finding such child, and of any person in whose charge such child may be placed, to give to the Registrar of the registration area in which such 50 child is found, within seven days of the finding of such child, such information of the particulars required to be registered concerning the birth of such child as the informant may possess.

Where the birth of any child has been registered Change of name before it has received a name, or where the name by which of child after registration. it was registered is altered, the parent or guardian of such child may within two years of the registration, on payment of the prescribed fee, and on providing such evidence as the Registrar may think necessary, register the name that has been given to the child.

14. (1) The registration of the death of every person of Compulsory European, American or Asiatic origin or descent and of every registration of deaths 10 native dying within a township, shall be compulsory.

(2) The Governor may, by notice in the Gazette, declare Power to that from a date to be named in the notice the registration extend compulsory of deaths of all persons in the Colony of any particular race, provisions. class, tribe, or group, or of all or some of the inhabitants of 15 any particular town, district or area, shall be compulsory.

15. Every person notifying a death shall, to the best of Mode of his knowledge and ability, give the prescribed particulars, deaths. which shall be entered forthwith by the Registrar in the register, and the person notifying the death shall certify to 20 the correctness of the entry by signing or, if he be illiterate, by fixing his mark to the register.

16. Upon the death of any person, the registration of whose death is compulsory, it shall be the duty of the nearest registration is relatives of the deceased present at the death or in attendance compulsory 25 during the last illness of the deceased, and, in default of such relatives, of every other relative of the deceased dwelling or being in the same registration area as the deceased, and, in default of such other relatives, of each person present at the death and of the occupier of the house in which to his know-30 ledge the death took place, and, in default of the persons hereinbefore in this section mentioned, of each inmate of such house, or of any person finding or taking charge of the body of such person or causing the body of such person to be buried, to give notice within twenty-four hours next after the death 35 or finding of the body to the Registrar of the registration

- (2) Where no certificate as to the cause of death is produced the Registrar shall forthwith notify the nearest magistrate or police officer, forwarding with the notification such of the prescribed particulars as he may have received, and no permit shall be issued by the Registrar for the interment or other disposal of the body of the deceased except by virtue of a written order from such magistrate or police officer.
- 18. (1) On the receipt of a notice from a Registrar Enquiries as a carry sub-gration (2) of the last preceding section the cause of death. under sub-section (2) of the last preceding section, the 50 magistrate or police officer, or any person specially empowered by the Governor in that behalf, shall cause such enquiries to be made as to the cause of the death as he may think fit or as may be prescribed by the Rules.

(2) If the case does not appear from such enquiries to be one to which section 141 or section 143 of the Criminal Procedure Ordinance applies, the magistrate or police officer or other person as aforesaid shall authorise the issue by the Registrar of a permit for the interment or other disposal of the body of the deceased.

19. The exercise of the powers conferred by the two last preceding sections shall, in any municipality or township, be subject to any by-law in force under the Municipal Corporations Ordinance, or any rule in force under the Town- 10 ships Ordinance, for the regulation of interments.

Penalties

20. Any person who fails to give notice of a birth or death, the registration of which is compulsory, or who refuses to furnish any of the prescribed particulars, and any person who wilfully gives any false information or particulars for the 15 purpose of registration, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty-five pounds or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and imprisonment.

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

Duty of Registrars to forward annual returns to Registrar General. 21. It shall be the duty of every Registrar, on or before 20 such date as the Registrar General may appoint, to forward to the Registrar General a return in the form prescribed showing the births and deaths registered in his registration area during the preceding year.

Duty of Plegistrars to forward weekly statements to medical officers. 22. It shall be the duty of every Registrar, at the close 25 of each week, to forward to the medical officer in charge of every district included within his registration area, and to the Statistician, a statement of the births registered by him during such week.

Preparation of indexes

23. (1) The Registrar General shall cause to be prepared 30 from the returns made to him alphabetical indexes of the births and deaths registered.

Inspection of registers, etc.

(2) Any register, return or index in the custody of the Registrar General shall, subject to the Rules, be open to inspection on payment of the prescribed fee.

Certified copies

(3) The Registrar General shall, on payment of the prescribed fee, furnish a certified copy of any entry in any register or in any return in his custody.

Evidence.

(4) The copy of any entry in any register or return certified under the hand of the Registrar General shall be 40 primâ facie evidence in all courts of the dates and facts therein contained.

Duty of Registrar General to compile annual summary and report. 24. It shall be the duty of the Registrar General to compile, after the close of each year, a summary of the births and deaths of such year, and a report on the increase 45 or decrease of the population of the Colony and on any special causes appearing to affect the same.

Correction of errors in registers.

- 25. (1) The Registrar General may, subject to the Rules, correct any error in any register or index.
- (2) Corrections shall be made without erasing the original 50 entry, and shall be authenticated by the signature of the Registrar General.

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26. The Statistician shall have access at all reasonable Access to documents by times to all documents kept by a Registrar for the purposes Statistician. of this Ordinance, and may require a Registrar to prepare such statements of births and deaths and provide such 5 information as may be required for the preparation of statistical abstracts of births and deaths.

- 27. The Governor in Council may make Rules with Rules. regard to all or any of the following matters, namely:-
- (1) The place in each registration area and the hours at which births and deaths may be notified and registered;
 - (2) The conditions under which and the mode in which registration may be effected without personal attendance;
- 15 (3) The forms of all registers, returns, and other documents required for the purposes of this Ordinance;
 - (4) The inspection of registers, returns and indexes and the provision of certified copies;
- (5) The places at which births and deaths occurring on ships within the territorial waters of the Colony 20 shall be registered;
 - (6) The exemption from all or any of the provisions of this Ordinance of persons of any particular class or race within an area in which the registration of births or deaths has been declared to be compulsory;
 - (7) Any matter which is by this Ordinance required to be prescribed;
 - (8) Generally, for carrying into effect the provisions of this Ordinance.
- 30 The Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance Repeal. (Chapter 29 of the Revised Edition) is hereby repealed.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The Bill repeals and re-enacts the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Chapter 29 of the Revised Edition) with a number of alterations and additions.

Provision is made for the appointment of Registrars to administer the Ordinance in cases where it is applicable or in areas to which it may be extended by order of the Governor, and for the periodical preparation of various returns and statements.

The periods for compulsory registration are altered, in the case of births, from 3 months to 20 days and, in the case of deaths, from 3 months to 24 hours, and it is provided that notification shall be given of births and deaths within the same periods. It is contemplated that both processes will, in the ordinary case, be concurrent.

The issue of burial permits is introduced to meet the case of areas where provision does not already exist.

The sections of the repealed Ordinance dealing with optional registration are preserved.

NOTICE.

WHEREAS arrangements have been made between His Majesty the King and the Rulers of the Czechoslovak Republic, the Estonian Republic, the Republic of Finland, the Latvian Republic, the Republic of Lithuania and the Albanian Republic for the surrender to those States any fugitive criminals.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on me by section 3 of the Fugitive Criminals Surrender Ordinance, (Chapter 11 of the Revised Edition), I hereby direct that the said Fugitive Criminals Surrender Ordinance shall apply in the cases of the undermentioned Foreign States and their Protectorates during the continuance of the arrangements made between His Majesty the King and the Rulers of such States:—

ALBANIA (EXTRADITION) ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1927.

AT THE COURT AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE,

The 27th day of June, 1927.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (a) to 1906 (b), it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient;

AND WHEREAS a Treaty was concluded on the 22nd day of July, 1926, between His Majesty and the President of the Albanian Republic for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India;

And His Excellency the President of the Albanian Republic; having determined, by common consent, to conclude a treaty for the extradition of criminals, have accordingly named as their plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:—

William Edmund O'Reilly, Esq., His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to the Albanian Republic;

And His Excellency the President of the Albanian Republic:—

Monsieur Hussein Vrioni, Minister for Foreign Affairs and Minister of Justice ad interim;

Who, after having exhibited to each other their respective full powers, and found them in good and due form, have agreed upon the following articles:—

ARTICLE 1.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, under certain circumstances and conditions stated in the present treaty, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article 2, committed within the jurisdiction of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party.

ARTICLE 2.

Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences:—

- 1. Murder (including assassination, parricide, infanticide, poisoning), or attempt or conspiracy to murder.
 - 2. Manslaughter.
- 3. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.
 - 4. Rape
- 5. Carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have carnal knowledge, of a girl under 14 years of age.
 - 6. Indecent assault.
 - 7. Kidnapping and false imprisonment.
- 8. Child stealing, including abandoning, exposing or unlawfully detaining.
 - 9. Abduction.
 - 10. Procuration.
 - 11. Bigamy.
- 12. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
 - 13. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm.
- 14. Threats by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.
 - 15. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
 - 16. Arson.
- 17. Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, larceny or embezzlement.
- 18. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any company, or fraudulent conversion.
- 19. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or feloniously obtained.
- 20. (a) Counterfeiting or altering money, or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.
- (b) Knowingly making without lawful authority any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of the coin of the realm.
 - 21. Forgery, or uttering what is forged.
 - 22. Crimes against bankruptcy law.
- 23. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any persons travelling or being upon a railway.
- 24. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.
- 25. Piracy and other crimes or offences committed at sea against persons or things which, according to the laws of the High Contracting Parties, are extradition crimes or offences.
- 26. Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute a crime or offence against the laws of both States.

The extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes or offences, providing such participation be punishable by the laws of both High Contracting Parties.

Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the State applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which according to the law of both the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant can be made.

ARTICLE 3.

Each Party reserves the right to refuse or grant the surrender of its own subjects or citizens to the other Party.

ARTICLE 4.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial in the State applied to, for the crime or offence for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed should be under examination or under punishment in the State applied to for any other crime or offence, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

ARTICLE 5.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime or offence or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applying or applied to.

ARTICLE 6.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the crime or offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he proves that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for a crime or offence of a political character.

ARTICLE 7.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in custody or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made for any other crime or offence, or on account of any other matters, than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored, or has had an opportunity of returning, to the State by which he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes or offences committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE 8.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the diplomatic agents of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime or offence had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed in contumaciam is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

ARTICLE 9.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

ARTICLE 10.

A criminal fugitive may be apprehended under a warrant issued by any police magistrate, justice of the peace, or other competent authority in either State, on such information or complaint and such evidence, or after such proceedings, as would, in the opinion of the authority issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant if the crime or offence had been committed or the person convicted in that part of the dominions of the two Contracting Parties in which the magistrate, justice of the peace, or other competent authority, exercises jurisdiction. He shall, in accordance with this article, be discharged if within the term of thirty days a requisition for extradition shall not have been made by the diplomatic agent of the State claiming his extradition in accordance with the stipulations of this treaty. The same rule shall apply to the cases of persons accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences specified in this treaty, and committed on the high seas on board any vessel of either State which may come in to a port of the other.

ARTICLE 11.

The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime or offence had been committed in the territory of the same State, or to prove that the prisoner is the indentical person convicted by the courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime or offence of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to; and no criminal shall be surrendered until after the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his committal to prison to await the warrant for his surrender.

ARTICLE 12.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the State applied to shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or the affirmations of witnesses taken in the other State, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, or copies thereof, and certificates of, or judicial documents stating the fact of a conviction, provided the same are authenticated as follows:—

- 1. A warrant, or copy thereof, must purport to be signed by a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other State, or purport to be certified under the hand of a judge, magistrate or officer of the other State to be a true copy thereof, as the case may require.
- 2. Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified, under the hand of a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other State, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be true copies thereof, as the case may require.
- 3. A certificate of, or judicial document stating the fact of a conviction must purport to be certified by a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other State.

In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated, either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice, or some other minister of the other State, or by any other mode of authentication for the time being, permitted by the law of the State to which the application for extradition is made.

ARTICLE 13.

If the individual claimed by one of the High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers on account of other crimes or offences committed within their respective jurisdictions, his extradition shall be granted to the State whose claim is earliest in date, unless such claim is waived.

ARTICLE 14.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to, or the proper tribunal thereof, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

ARTICLE 15.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension, and any articles that may serve as a proof of the crime or offence shall be given up when the extradition takes place, in so far as this may be permitted by the law of the State granting the extradition.

ARTICLE 16.

Each of the High Contracting Parties shall defray the expenses occasioned by the arrest within its territories, the detention, and the conveyance to its frontier, of the persons whom it may have consented to surrender in pursuance of the present treaty.

ARTICLE 17.

The stipulations of the present treaty shall be applicable, so far as the laws permit, to all His Britannic Majesty's Dominions, except to the self-governing Dominions hereinafter named-that is to say, the Dominion of Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia (including for this purpose Papua and Norfolk Island), the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, the Irish Free State, and Newfoundland—and India, provided always that the said stipulations shall be applicable to any of the above-named Dominions or India in respect of which notice to that effect shall have been given on behalf of the Government of such Dominion or India by His Britannic Majesty's Representative at Durazzo, and provided also that it shall be competent for either of the High Contracting Parties to terminate separately the application of this treaty to any of the above-named Dominions or India by a notice to that effect not exceeding one year and not less than six months.

ARTICLE 18.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal, who has taken refuge in any of His Britannic Majesty's self-governing Dominions, Colonies, or Possessions to which this treaty applies, shall be made to the Governor-General, Governor, or chief authority, of such self-governing Dominion, Colony, or Possession by the appropriate consular officer of Albania.

Such requisition may be dealt with, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such self-governing Dominion, Colony, or Possession will allow, to the provisions of this treaty, by the competent authorities of such self-governing Dominion, Colony, or Possession, provided, nevertheless, that if an order for the committal of the fugitive criminal to prison to await surrender shall be made, the said Governor-General, Governor, or chief authority may instead of issuing a warrant for the surrender of such fugitive refer the matter to His Britannic Majesty's Government.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any self-governing Dominion, Colony, or Possession of His Britannic Majesty shall be governed, as far as possible, by the rules laid down in the preceding articles of the present treaty.

ARTICLE 19.

It is understood that the stipulations of the two preceding articles apply in the same manner as if they were Possessions of His Britannic Majesty, to the following British Protectorates, that is to say, the Bechuanaland Protectorate, Gambia Protectorate, Kenya Protectorate, Nigeria Protectorate, Northern Rhodesia, Northern Territories of the Gold Coast, Nyasaland, Sierra Leone Protectorate, Solomon Islands Protectorate, Somaliland Protectorate, Swaziland, Uganda Protectorate and Zanzibar, and to the following territories in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, that is to say, British Cameroons, British Togoland, the Tanganyika Territory and Palestine.

It is also understood that if, after the signature of the present treaty, it is considered advisable to extend its provisions to any British protectorates other than those mentioned above, or to any British-protected State, or to any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty other than those mentioned above including the territories in respect of which mandates are being exercised on behalf of His Britannic Majesty by the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand and the Government of the Union of South Africa, the stipulations of the two preceding articles shall be deemed to apply to such protectorates or States or mandated territories from the date and in the manner prescribed in the notes to be exchanged for the purpose of effecting such extension.

It it is further understood that the provisions of the present treaty which apply to British subjects shall be deemed also to apply to natives of any British protectorate or protected State or mandated territory to which the stipulations of the two preceding articles apply or shall hereafter apply.

ARTICLE 20.

The present treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties by a notice not exceeding one year and not less than six months.

It shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Tirana as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective plenipotentiaries have signed the treaty and have affixed thereto their respective seals.

Done at Tirana in duplicate in the English and Albanian texts, of which the former is considered authoritative, this twenty-second day of July, in the year 1926.

NOW, THEREFORE, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 11th day of July, 1927, the said Acts shall apply in the case of the Albanian Republic under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 22nd July, 1926.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada, being Part I of chapter 155 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

Provided further that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the self-governing Dominions hereinafter named, that is to say, the Commonwealth of Australia (including for this purpose Papua and Norfolk Island), the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, the Irish Free State and Newfoundland, and India, until notification shall have been made in the "London Gazette" that the Treaty has been made applicable thereto, and that on such notification being made in respect of any such Dominion or India the said Acts shall apply in such Dominion or India in the case of the Albanian Republic under and in accordance with the said Treaty as from the date of the said notification.

This order may be cited as the "Albania (Extradition) Order in Council, 1927."


