HIS EXCELLENCY the Governor has approved of the following Bills being introduced into Legislative Council :—

A Bill to Amend the Wireless Telegraphy Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “ the Wireless Telegraphy (Amendment) Ordinance, 1927,” and shall be read as one with the Wireless Telegraphy Ordinance (Chapter 118 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as “ the Principal Ordinance.”

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion of the following definition :—

Definition of “ transmission.”

“ The expression ‘ transmission,’ in relation to wireless messages, includes the reception as well as the sending of messages.”

3. Sub-section (1) of section 6 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition of the following paragraph :—

Amendment of section 6 (1) of the Principal Ordinance.

“(vii). For the licensing of dealers in wireless apparatus and for otherwise controlling and regulating the importation, sale, letting on hire, or other disposition of complete broadcasting receivers, or parts of wireless apparatus; and generally for regulating and controlling all matters which may be necessary or convenient to be regulated or controlled for the purpose of carrying out or giving effect to this Ordinance.”

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

In view of the establishment in the near future of a broadcasting station in this Colony, it is desired to strengthen the existing Wireless Telegraphy Ordinance in order—

- (1) to make it quite clear that licences will have to be taken out by those who receive messages, as well as by those who send them;
- (2) more effectively to cope with “ piracy,” *i.e.*, the use of wireless receivers and the reception of broadcast programmes by persons who have not taken out the necessary licence and paid the prescribed fee therefor; and
- (3) to extend the rule-making powers under the Ordinance of the Governor in Council.

Clause 2 of the Bill carries out object (1).

With regard to object (2) one of the most effective ways of checking “ piracy ” is by controlling and regulating the sale, letting on hire or disposal otherwise of wireless apparatus. Clause 3 of the Bill enables this to be done. This clause also extends generally the rule-making powers of the Governor in Council, a necessary provision in view of the development of wireless telegraphy since the Principal Ordinance was passed.

A Bill to Amend the Drugs and Poisons Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “ the Drugs and Poisons (Amendment) Ordinance, 1927,” and shall be read as one with the Drugs and Poisons Ordinance (Chapter 120 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as “ the Principal Ordinance.”

2. Section 8 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and in lieu thereof shall be read the following :—

“ 8. (1) It shall be lawful for the Governor to appoint a board for the purposes of this Ordinance which shall consist of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, who shall be chairman thereof, and such other persons who shall be either duly qualified medical practitioners or druggists licensed under this Ordinance as the Governor may from time to time appoint.

(2) The Governor may revoke appointments to and fill vacancies in the board. Every appointment made or revoked under this section shall be notified in the Gazette.

(3) In the absence of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services or for any other necessary or reasonable cause the senior Government medical officer present shall preside at any meeting of the board.

(4) The chairman together with two other members shall form a quorum.

(5) The board shall keep a record of proceedings.”

No licence to act as a druggist shall be granted by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services to any person unless such person shall satisfy the board that he is a duly qualified chemist and druggist in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland or holds a certificate or diploma of competency as a chemist or druggist from any college, society, council, or board recognised by the board under rules made by the Governor in Council.”

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill amends the Drugs and Poisons Ordinance so as to exclude the provisions made therein for local qualifying examinations in respect of chemists and druggists, and to provide that licences to act as such shall only be issued to persons who have qualified as chemists or druggists in the United Kingdom or who hold a certificate or diploma recognised by the board appointed for the purposes of the Ordinance.

The provision hitherto made for examination of candidates for licences is somewhat misleading as there are at present no facilities in the Colony for instruction in the subjects on which the examination is held.

A Bill to Amend the Supplementary Appropriation (Railway) Amendment Ordinance, 1926.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “ the Supplementary Appropriation (Railway) (Amendment) (No. 2) Ordinance, 1927.”

2. The Supplementary Appropriation (Railway) Amendment Ordinance, 1926, is hereby amended by the insertion of 5
the following section between sections 1 and 2 thereof :—

“ 1A. The words “ two million six hundred and eighty-four thousand three hundred and ninety-six pounds ” which appear in sections 2 and 4 of the Principal Ordinance are hereby deleted, and the words “ two million 10
eight hundred and seventy-four thousand and nine pounds ” are substituted therefor.”

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill has been drafted to remedy a defect in the Supplementary Appropriation (Railway) Amendment Ordinance, 1926.

That Ordinance was passed for the purpose of augmenting the sum granted by the Appropriation Ordinance, 1924, to the use of the Railway. The sum granted in the 1924 Ordinance was £2,684,396, the sum eventually required amounted to £2,874,009. The Supplementary Appropriation (Railway) Amendment Ordinance, 1926, altered the sum in the Schedule to the 1924 Ordinance from £2,684,396 to £2,874,009, but similar alterations (which were required) were not made in sections 2 and 4 of the 1924 Ordinance.

This fact having been brought to the attention of Government, this Bill has been prepared to remedy the omission.

A Bill to Amend the Supplementary Appropriation (Railway) Amendment Ordinance, 1927.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “ the Supplementary Appropriation (Railway) (Amendment) (No. 3) Ordinance, 1927.”

2. The Supplementary Appropriation (Railway) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1927, is hereby amended by the insertion of 5
the following section between sections 1 and 2 thereof :—

“ 1A. The words “ two million, seven hundred and forty-five thousand, eight hundred pounds ” which appear in sections 2 and 4 of the Principal Ordinance are hereby 10
deleted, and the words “ two million seven hundred and ninety-four thousand seven hundred and eleven pounds ” are substituted therefor.”

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill has been drafted to remedy a defect in the Supplementary Appropriation (Railway) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1927.

That Ordinance was passed for the purpose of augmenting the sum granted by the Appropriation Ordinance, 1925, to the use of the Railway. The sum granted in the 1925 Ordinance was £2,745,800, the sum eventually required was £2,794,711. The Supplementary Appropriation (Railway) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1927, altered the sum in the Schedule to the 1925 Ordinance from £2,745,800 to £2,794,711, but similar alterations (which were required) were not made in sections 2 and 4 of the 1925 Ordinance.

This fact having been brought to the attention of Government, this Bill has been prepared to remedy the omission.

A Bill to Amend the Land Titles Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “ the Land Titles (Amendment) Ordinance, 1927,” and shall be read as one with the Land Titles Ordinance (Chapter 143 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as “ the Principal Ordinance.” Short title.

5 2. Section 59 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the deletion of the proviso thereto and by the substitution therefor of the following :— Amendment of section 59 of the Principal Ordinance.

10 “ Provided, however, that nothing in this section shall be deemed to affect the provisions of the Equitable Mortgages Ordinance or the lien of any advocate in respect of taxable costs, charges or expenses incurred by him in connection with the holding or any interest therein.” Cap. 145.

15 3. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have commenced and come into operation on the first day of July, 1926. Commencement.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

Section 59 of the Land Titles Ordinance (Chapter 143 of the Revised Edition) reproduces section 10 of the Land Titles Amendment Ordinance, 1910. The latter section enacted that no lien, charge or mortgage should be valid unless created by a last will or by an order of a Court or by an instrument duly executed and registered. It was provided, however, that this section should not affect the provisions of the Equitable Mortgages Ordinance or the lien of an advocate.

In the preparation of the Revised Edition of the Laws of the Colony the words “ the provisions of the Equitable Mortgages Ordinance or ” were inadvertently omitted from the proviso mentioned above, and the object of this Bill is to re-insert them in the Principal Ordinance.

A Bill to Amend the Arms and Ammunition Ordinance, 1925.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "the Arms and Ammunition (Amendment) Ordinance, 1927," and shall be read as one with the Arms and Ammunition Ordinance, 1925, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance."

2. Section 12 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) Sub-section (1) is amended by the deletion of the words:—

"under this Ordinance for such purpose"
and by the substitution therefor of the words:—

"to him in respect of each firearm so
possessed."

(b) Sub-section (5) is repealed and the following sub-section is substituted therefor:—

"(5) The fee for the first arms licence
issued to any person in any year shall be six
shillings. No fee shall be charged upon the
issue of any subsequent arms licence or licences
to any person producing to the licensing officer
a valid arms licence issued to him."

(c) Sub-section (6) is repealed and the following sub-section is substituted therefor:—

"(6) Nothing in this section contained shall
apply to the possession of any antique or obsolete
firearm kept as a curiosity or ornament."

3. This Ordinance shall commence and come into operation on the first day of January, 1928.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The object of this Bill is to make it clear that a licence issued under the Ordinance must be a licence for each firearm.

The first licence issued to any one individual in any one year shall cost Shs. 6/-. Subsequent licences for other arms will be issued free.

No licence is to be required for an antique firearm kept as a curiosity.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 520.

ORDER.

UNDER THE COLLECTIVE PUNISHMENT
ORDINANCE.*(Chapter 77 of the Revised Edition).*

WHEREAS in or about the month of November, 1925, the bodies of three people believed to have been unlawfully killed were found within the Wajir area of the Northern Frontier Province of the Colony of Kenya, and the inhabitants of the said Wajir area have not shewn (a full enquiry into the matter having been held) that they had not an opportunity of preventing the offence or arresting the offender or offenders, nor have they shewn that they have used all reasonable means to bring the offender or offenders to justice.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Edward William Macleay Grigg, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, upon whom His Majesty has conferred the decoration of the Military Cross, Lieutenant Colonel in His Majesty's Army (retired), Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the Collective Punishment Ordinance (Chapter 77 of the Revised Edition), do hereby impose a fine of shillings nine thousand upon the Sakuye and Boran of the said Wajir area in the said Northern Frontier Province of the said Colony.

WILD FIBRE CUTTING CONCESSIONS.

NOTICE.

UNDER THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE, 1915.

TENDERS are invited for the rights to cut wild fibre (*Sansevieria*) over area where such fibre is to be found.

2. Tenderers will be required to submit plans showing the area over which they desire such rights, the basis of tender to be a royalty per ton on all fibre produced.

3. The concession will be for the period of five years and in addition to the fibre cutting rights, will carry the right to construct such roads and milling stations as are necessary. Rent at the rate of cents five per acre per annum will be charged.

4. The Government reserves the right to alienate the land during the currency of the concession but any such alienation would be subject to the concession.

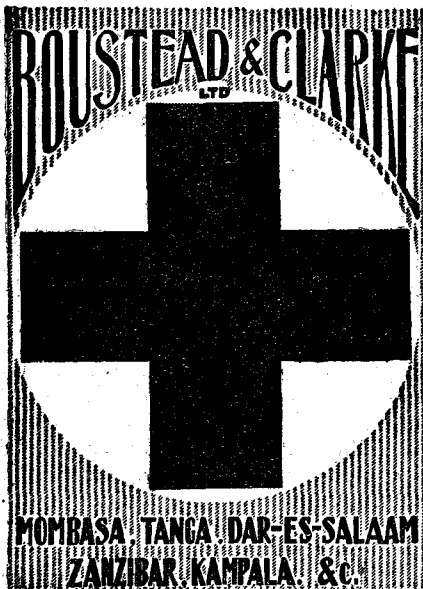
