BY His Excellency Sir Edward William Macleay Grigg, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, upon whom His Majesty has conferred the decoration of the Military Cross, Lieutenant Colonel in His Majesty's Army (retired), Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by the Townships Ordinance (Chapter 82 of the Revised Edition), I do hereby declare that Proclamation No. 6, dated the 26th day of January, 1916, is hereby amended by cancelling the boundaries of the Township of Ngong set out in the Schedule thereto and substituting therefor the boundaries set out in the Schedule annexed hereto.

## SCHEDULE.

NGONG TOWNSHIP.

### *Description of Boundaries.*

Commencing at a point approximately 3,734 feet due north-west of the new Ngong station situate at the foot of the north-eastern spur of the Ngong range;

thence bounded by four straight lines each one mile in length bearing 90°, 180°, 270° and 360° respectively to the point of commencement.

The foregoing boundaries are more particularly delineated edged red on Land Survey Boundary Plan No. 42 deposited at the Land Survey Office, Nairobi, a copy of which is on record at the Senior Commissioner's Office, Ngong.

## THE NATIVE FOODSTUFFS ORDINANCE.

*(Chapter 135 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya).*

PROCLAMATION.

EDWARD GRIGG.

L.S.

BY His Excellency Sir Edward William Macleay Grigg, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, upon whom His Majesty has conferred the decoration of the Military Cross, Lieutenant-Colonel in His Majesty's Army (retired), Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, in Executive Council.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Native Foodstuffs Ordinance (Chapter 135 of the Revised Edition), it is provided that where it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that any district or area is suffering from, or threatened with a shortage of native foodstuffs, he may issue a proclamation (a) prohibiting the purchase or barter of such foodstuffs generally or of any class or classes of the same, for the purpose of re-sale in or export from the district or area in such proclamation specified, unless the written permission of the Resident Commissioner or District Commissioner, as the case may be, be first obtained; (b) prohibiting the export of such foodstuffs generally or of any class or classes of the same from any district or area; (c) prohibiting the use of such foodstuffs or of any class or classes of the same for the manufacture of liquor in any district or area; (d) prohibiting the concealment or destruction of such foodstuffs or any class or classes of the same in any district or area;

AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to me that the Baringo District is threatened with a shortage of native foodstuffs;

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the powers in me vested as aforesaid as Governor in Council I do hereby prohibit—

- (a) the purchase or barter of maize, beans, wimbe, sweet potatoes and mtama for the purpose of re-sale in or export from the Baringo District unless the written permission of the District Commissioner of the said district be first obtained;
- (b) the export of any such native foodstuffs from the said area;
- (c) the use of any such native foodstuffs for the manufacture of liquor in the said area; or

(d) the concealment or destruction of any such native foodstuffs in the said area.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 540.

THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE EXPORT  
ORDINANCE.

(Chapter 98 of the Revised Edition).

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 10 of the Agricultural Produce Export Ordinance (Chapter 98 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as "the Agricultural Produce Export (Potatoes) (Amendment) (No. 2) Rules, 1927," and shall be read as one with "the Agricultural Produce Export (Potatoes) Rules, 1927," hereinafter called "the Principal Rules" and with all amendments to the Principal Rules.

2. Rule 4 of the Principal Rules is hereby revoked and the following Rule is substituted therefor:—

"4. A certificate, hereinafter called an "Exportation Certificate," shall be issued by the inspector to the owner or shipper of a consignment of potatoes which has been inspected and passed as fit for export. The certificate shall state the grade in which the inspector has passed the potatoes for export."

3. Rule 7 of the Principal Rules is hereby revoked and the following Rule is substituted therefor:—

"7. (1) No potatoes shall be passed as fit for export which have not been graded by the inspector as one or other of the three following grades:—

Grade I Potatoes, Grade II Potatoes or Seed Potatoes.

(2) Grade I potatoes shall comply with the following descriptions:—

(a) Less than 4 per cent. by number of the tubers shall be unripe or greenish in colour.

(b) Less than 4 per cent. by number of the tubers shall be mechanically injured and/or show signs of decay externally.

(c) Less than 2 per cent. by numbers of the tubers shall pass through a sieve with mesh  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches square.

(3) Grade II potatoes shall comply with the following descriptions:—

(a) Less than 4 per cent. by numbers of the tubers shall be unripe or greenish in colour.

(b) Less than 4 per cent. by numbers of the tubers shall be mechanically injured and/or show signs of decay externally.

(c) Less than 10 per cent. by numbers of the tubers shall pass through a sieve having meshes  $1\frac{1}{4}$  inches square.

(4) Seed potatoes shall comply with the following descriptions :—

(a) Less than 4 per cent. by numbers of the tubers shall be unripe.

(b) Less than 4 per cent. by numbers of the tubers shall be mechanically injured and/or show signs of decay externally.

(c) There shall be no weight or size limit in the case of seed potatoes when it is certified to the satisfaction of the inspector that such potatoes are intended for seed purposes; and provided further that each package of seed potatoes shall be clearly marked "For seed purposes" and the exportation certificate shall be similarly endorsed."

4. Rule 9 of the Principal Rules as amended by the Agricultural Produce Export (Potatoes) (Amendment) Rules, 1927, is hereby revoked and the following Rule is substituted therefor :—

" 9. Grade I potatoes shall be packed in suitable ventilated barrels, wooden crates or other rigid and ventilated receptacles to the satisfaction of the inspector, except where the Port is not further than seven days' sea journey from Kilindini, when new bags may be used.

Grade II and Seed potatoes may be packed in new bags for all Ports."

5. Rule 10 of the Principal Rules is hereby revoked and the following Rule is substituted therefor :—

" 10. (1) Each receptacle containing potatoes for which an exportation certificate has been issued in accordance with these Rules shall be stencilled in red with the letter " K " and the grade mark within a ring.

(2) The grade mark shall be as follows :—

(a) For Grade I Potatoes ... .. I.

(b) For Grade II Potatoes ... .. II.

(c) For Seed Potatoes . . . . . S. "

6. The Agricultural Produce Export (Potatoes) (Amendment) Rules, 1927, are hereby revoked.

THE INDIAN POST OFFICE ACT, 1898,  
AND  
THE POST OFFICE (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE.

## RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Indian Post Office Act, 1898, as applied to the Colony and Protectorate, and the Post Office (Amendment) Ordinance (Chapter 117 of the Revised Edition), and all other powers thereunto enabling him, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules :—

1. These Rules may be cited as “ the Post Office (Amendment) Rules (No. 2), 1927.”

2. The maximum limits of weight and size for the following classes of postal articles shall be as follows respectively :—

## THE SHOP HOURS ORDINANCE, 1925.

## ORDER.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Shop Hours Ordinance, 1925, it is provided that all shops in townships and other areas to which the Ordinance applies shall be closed for the serving of customers on Sundays except where any local authority applies for exemption from Sunday closing, in which case the Governor in Council may grant such exemption either as to the whole or part of Sunday and either generally or in respect of any particular class of shops or trades :

AND WHEREAS by virtue of Proclamation No. 52, dated the 9th day of August, 1927, the said Ordinance came into operation in the Nairobi Municipality on the 1st day of September, 1927 :

AND WHEREAS the Nairobi Corporation has applied for exemption from Sunday closing up to 1 o'clock in the afternoon of trades or businesses specified in the Schedule hereto :

NOW, THEREFORE, IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by section 8 of the aforesaid Ordinance, and having taken the advice of my Executive Council, I do hereby grant exemption from Sunday closing up to 1 o'clock in the afternoon to the trades or businesses mentioned in the Schedule to this order.

The order made under section 8 of the aforesaid Ordinance on the 9th day of August, 1927, (Government Notice No. 428), is hereby revoked.

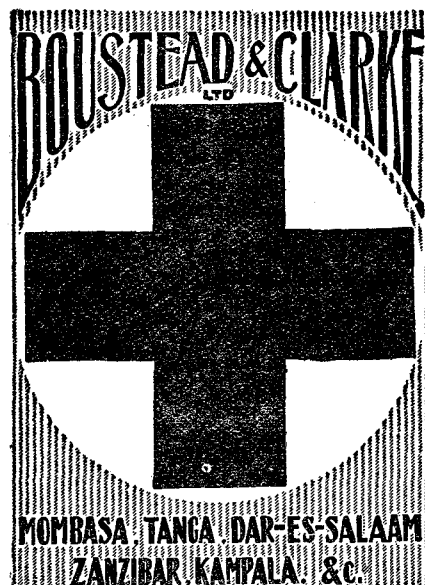
