A Bill to Amend the Stock and Produce Theft Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “ the Stock and Produce Theft (Amendment) Ordinance, 1927,” and shall be read as one with the Stock and Produce Theft Ordinance (Chapter 79 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as
5 “ the Principal Ordinance.”

2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires :—

“ Stock,” in addition to the animals included in the definition of stock in section 2 of the Principal Ordinance, includes the meat, hide, skin or any part
10 of any stock;

“ Produce ” includes milk, eggs, fruit, tea, maize, coffee beans, coffee berries and any other article whatever produced or derived from agricultural or horticultural operations which the Governor in Council may from
15 time to time by proclamation declare to be produce;

“ Sell ” includes barter or exchange;

“ Proclaimed district ” means any area to which sections 4 and 5, or either of them, of this Ordinance may
20 from time to time be applied by the Governor in Council by proclamation.

3. (1) If any native is found in possession of produce on any farm or in the immediate vicinity thereof under circumstances which may reasonably lead to the belief that such
25 produce has been stolen, such native shall be deemed to have stolen the same and shall, unless he proves affirmatively (the onus being on him) that the possession was lawful, be liable to the penalties prescribed by section 3 of the Principal Ordinance.

Liability to account for possession of produce in certain cases.

(2) It shall be lawful for the owner or manager of any farm to apprehend and detain, without a warrant, any native found in possession of any produce upon such farm or in the immediate vicinity thereof which such owner or manager may have reasonable cause to suspect to have been stolen or unlaw-
35 fully obtained from such farm :

Power to arrest natives conveying produce suspected to be stolen.

Provided that any native apprehended under this sub-section shall, with all practical speed, be either handed over to a police officer or brought before a magistrate to be dealt with according to law.

4. If any stock is found in the possession or on the premises of any native in a proclaimed district under circumstances which may reasonably lead to the belief that such stock has been stolen, such native shall be deemed to have stolen the same and shall, unless he proves affirmatively (the onus being on him) that the possession was lawful, be liable to the penalties prescribed by section 3 of the Principal Ordinance. 5

5. It shall not be lawful for any native to sell any stock or produce in a proclaimed district between sunset and sunrise, and any native so doing and any person buying any stock or produce which is sold in contravention of this section shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five pounds or to imprisonment of either description for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and imprisonment. 10 15

6. All offences under this Ordinance shall be cognizable to the police.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill is designed to give effect to certain recommendations of the Stock and Produce Theft Committee which was appointed to enquire into and report upon the administration of the Stock and Produce Theft Ordinance and to make recommendations thereon.

As is pointed out in the Report of this Committee, it is most difficult to secure convictions for the theft of stock or produce, particularly the latter, owing to its frequently being impossible to identify the stolen property.

In accordance with the Committee's recommendations, therefore, it is proposed by this Bill to place the onus of proof of lawful possession of produce or stock, as defined in Clause 2, upon the person in whose possession such produce or stock is found.

Clause 3 of the Bill relates to produce and is intended to apply to the whole Colony and Protectorate. It provides that if any native is found in possession of produce on any farm or in the immediate vicinity thereof under circumstances which may reasonably lead to the belief that such produce has been stolen he shall be deemed to have stolen the produce unless he can prove the contrary. Special powers are conferred by sub-clause (2) upon an owner or manager of a farm to arrest, without a warrant, any native found upon the farm or in the immediate vicinity thereof in possession of any produce which the owner or manager may reasonably suspect to have been stolen from that farm.

Clause 4 relates to stock but is intended to apply only to such areas as may from time to time be proclaimed by the Governor in Council. The Clause provides that where stock is found in the possession or on the premises of any native in a proclaimed district under circumstances of suspicion the onus of proof of lawful possession shall rest upon such native, and if he fails to discharge this onus he shall be deemed to have stolen the stock.

Clause 5 gives effect to a further recommendation of the Committee by prohibiting the sale by and purchase from natives of stock or produce during the night-time. This Clause is also intended to apply only to such areas as are proclaimed by the Governor in Council.

Under Clause 2 the Governor in Council may apply Clauses 4 and 5, or either of them, to any area or areas in the Colony or Protectorate.

All offences under the Ordinance are made cognizable to the police.

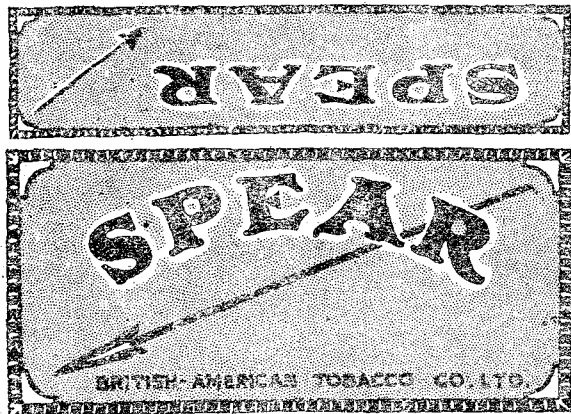

3. The concession will be for the period of five years and in addition to the fibre cutting rights, will carry the right to construct such roads and milling stations as are necessary. Rent at the rate of cents five per acre per annum will be charged.

4. The Government reserves the right to alienate the land during the currency of the concession but any such alienation would be subject to the concession.

5. The right to use a reasonable quantity of water sufficient for domestic and other ordinary purposes will be granted if such water be available, but no guarantee can be given that the use of water for decorticating and fibre washing purposes will be permitted. The right to the use of water for any purpose will be subject to previous application having been made to and any necessary permit having been obtained from the Director of Public Works by the concessionaire.

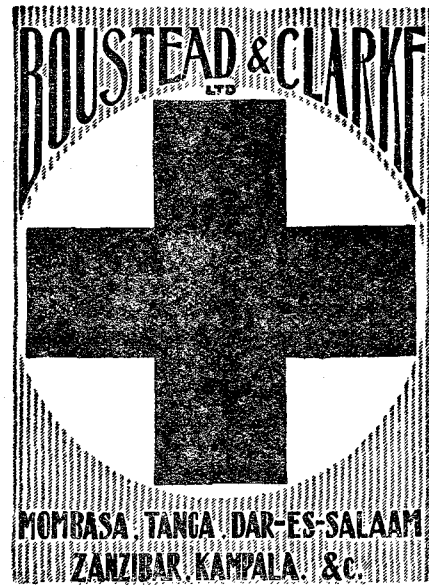
