## **A Bill to Apply a Sum of Money for the Service of the Year ending the 31st day of December, 1928.**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “ the Appropriation Ordinance, 1927.” Short title.
2. The Public Revenue for the year 1928, and other funds of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, are hereby charged Public Revenue charged.  
5 towards the service of the year ending the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, with a sum of two million eight hundred and forty thousand, one hundred and ninety-seven pounds.
3. The money granted by this Ordinance shall be applied Application of money granted.  
10 for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule annexed hereto.
4. The Treasurer of the Colony and Protectorate of Treasurer's authority for payment.  
Kenya is hereby authorized and required from time to time upon the warrant or order of the Governor to pay out of the   
15 revenue and other funds of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, for the several services specified in the Schedule, the said sum of two million eight hundred and forty thousand, one hundred and ninety-seven pounds which will come in course of payment during the year ending on the thirty-first day of   
20 December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight.

No. 2896/2, east of the south-western branch of the Ngusishi River occupied by Major Wilson, Nanyuki, North Nyeri District, to be infected areas (Contagious Bovine Pleuropneumonia).

## THE IMMIGRATION RESTRICTION ORDINANCE.

## RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 31 of the Immigration Restriction Ordinance (Chapter 62 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules :—

1. These Rules may be cited as “ the Immigration Restriction (Examination of Immigrants) Rules, 1927.”

2. Any person desiring to enter the Colony may be required by the Immigration Officer to complete and give to him a statement in the form in the Schedule hereto or, if so required, to furnish such information as will enable such Officer to complete such statement.

NOTE (I) The attention of all intending immigrants is drawn to sections 5 and 6 (1) of the Immigration Restriction Ordinance which state :—

“ 5. The immigration into the Colony by land or sea of any person being or appearing to be of any of the classes defined by the following sub-sections (hereinafter called “ prohibited immigrant ”) is prohibited, that is to say :—

(a) Any person without visible means of support, or any person who is likely to become a pauper or a public charge.

(b) Any idiot or insane person.

(c) Any person suffering from a loathsome or a dangerous contagious disease or from trachoma.

(d) Any person who, not having received a free pardon, has been convicted in any country other than the Colony of murder or any offence for which a sentence of imprisonment has been passed for any term, and who by reason of the circumstances connected therewith is deemed to be an undesirable immigrant; but this provision shall not apply to offences of a political character not involving moral turpitude.

(e) Any prostitute, and any person living on or receiving or who may have lived on or received any part of the proceeds of the prostitution of others.

(f) Any person deemed by the Immigration Officer to be an undesirable immigrant in consequence of information or advice received from any Secretary of State or Colonial Minister, or through diplomatic channels or any minister of a foreign country, or from any other trusted source.

(g) Any person who has been ordered to leave the Colony.

(h) Any person being a passenger or serving on any vessel calling at any port in the Colony who not having received a free pardon has been convicted in the Colony of murder or of any offence for which a sentence of imprisonment has been passed for any term.

“ 6. (1) Any person desiring to enter the Colony shall, before being allowed to do so, appear before the Immigration Officer, who shall, after such examination as he may consider necessary, inform such person and the master of the ship, if any, which has conveyed him to the Colony, whether he is a prohibited immigrant or not. Provided that if such person withholds or conceals from the Immigration Officer any fact or information which would bring such person within any of the classes of prohibited immigrants defined in section 5, he shall be deemed to have contravened this Ordinance.”

(II) Under section 11 of the Immigration Restriction Ordinance a deposit before landing, in the case of a native of Asia or Africa of a sum of ten pounds or such other sum as the Governor in Council may from time to time order, and in the case of any other person of a sum of thirty-seven pounds ten shillings, may be demanded by the Immigration Officer in respect of any person without visible means of support or who is likely to become a pauper or a public charge.

These Rules may be cited as “ the Diseases of Animals (Scale of Fees) (Amendment) (No. 2) Rules, 1927,” and shall be read as one with the Diseases of Animals (Scale of Fees) Rules, 1926, hereinafter referred to as “ the Principal Rules,” as amended by the Diseases of Animals (Scale of Fees) (Amendment) Rules, 1927.

2. The Principal Rules are hereby amended by the addition in Schedule A of the following :—

## East Coast Fever inoculation—

herd (any number from 1 up to 80  
head) including the preliminary

## WILD FIBRE CUTTING CONCESSIONS.

## NOTICE.

UNDER THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE, 1915.

TENDERS are invited for the rights to cut wild fibre (*Sansevieria*) over area where such fibre is to be found.

2. Tenderers will be required to submit plans showing the area over which they desire such rights, the basis of tender to be a royalty per ton on all fibre produced.

3. The concession will be for the period of five years and in addition to the fibre cutting rights, will carry the right to construct such roads and milling stations as are necessary. Rent at the rate of cents five per acre per annum will be charged.

4. The Government reserves the right to alienate the land during the currency of the concession but any such alienation would be subject to the concession.

5. The right to use a reasonable quantity of water sufficient for domestic and other ordinary purposes will be granted if such water be available, but no guarantee can be given that the use of water for decorticating and fibre washing purposes will be permitted. The right to the use of water for any purpose will be subject to previous application having been made to and any necessary permit having been obtained from the Director of Public Works by the concessionaire.

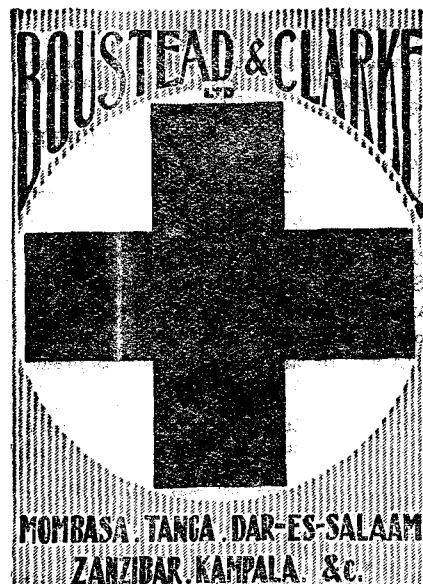
