THE FISH PROTECTION ORDINANCE.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 2 of the Fish Protection Ordinance (Chapter 163 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules :—

1. These Rules may be cited as “ the Trout Protection (Amendment) Rules, 1927,” and shall be read as one with the Trout Protection Rules, 1923, hereinafter referred to as “ the Principal Rules ”.

2. Rule 3 of the Principal Rules is hereby revoked and the following Rule is substituted therefor :—

“ 3. The following licences may be granted, at his discretion, by a Senior Commissioner or District Commissioner or by such other person as may be authorised in that behalf by the Governor, on payment of the following fees :—

- (1) For a year Shs. 60
- (2) For a fortnight „ 20
- (3) For a period of 24 hours „ 5

A yearly licence shall expire on the 31st day of December of the year in which it is granted.

A licence for a period of 24 hours shall be in the form provided in the Schedule.”

3. The Principal Rules are hereby amended by the addition of the Schedule attached to these Rules.

4. The Trout Protection (Amendment) Rules, 1926, are hereby revoked.

THE PUBLIC TRAVEL AND ACCESS ROADS
ORDINANCE, Ch. 113 OF THE REVISED EDITION

AND

THE REVISED EDITION OF THE LAWS
(OPERATION) ORDINANCE, 1926.

NOTICE.

NAIVASHA LAKE ROAD.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Public Travel and Access Roads Ordinance, Chapter 113 of the Revised Edition, as amended by the Revised Edition of the Laws (Operation) Ordinance, 1926, it is enacted that whenever it is made to appear to the Governor that requirements exist for the establishment, alteration or cancellation of a line of public travel, or the conversion of a road of access into a line of public travel, the Governor may, by order published in the Gazette, dedicate a line of public travel which shall be clearly described in such order, and from such date of publication such line of public travel shall be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public road within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force, and such public road shall be of such width as the Governor shall direct.

AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to me that requirements exist for the cancellation of the public road described in the Schedule hereto.

AND WHEREAS it has been further made to appear to me that requirements exist for the establishment in substitution therefor of the line of public travel described in the said Schedule hereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said section, I hereby order that the said public road and the notice gazetted it be hereby cancelled and I hereby further order that the said line of public travel be dedicated as a public road for the purposes of the said Ordinance and I also direct that such public road shall be 120 feet wide.

SCHEDULE.

CANCELLATION.

The public road hereby cancelled is that established by Government Notice 93 of the 24th February, 1926, and as shown by a firm black line on the plan marked P.W.D. No. 3479, filed at the Head Office of the Public Works Department, Nairobi, and commencing where it joins the main Naivasha-Gilgil Road at level crossing on Kenya and Uganda Railway mile post 396/9 to junction on Lake Road at a point distant approximately 2,946 feet on Farm 4 (423).

DEDICATION.

The line of public travel hereby dedicated as a public road is that shown by a red dotted line on the plan marked P.W.D. No. 4496 filed at the Head Office of the Public Works Department, Nairobi, and leaving the main Naivasha-Gilgil Road at mile 396/18 on the Kenya and Uganda Railway and joining the Lake Road at a point approximately 1,200 feet distant on Farm 4 (423).

GRAZING RIGHTS, NAKURU LAKE FOREST.

TENDERS are invited for the grazing rights for a period of two years from January 1st, 1928, for the following areas in the Nakuru Lake Forest.

AREA A.—A triangular area of 5,300 acres in extent consisting of grassland and patches of forest and scrub bounded on the east and north-east by the Naishi River, on the south by the Makalia River and on the west and north-west by the edge of thick forest.

AREA B.—An area of approximately 2,000 acres of grassland and scrub to the west of Farms L.O. 4336 and 4337 and bounded on the north by the Shalman Nala River.

2. Tenders should be rendered separately for each area. The basis of tender to be an annual licence fee payable in advance before the issue of the licence and thereafter on the 1st of January the following year.

3. The successful tenderers will be given licences the terms of which may be ascertained from the Forester, Elburgon Forest Station, where also a plan of Area A may be seen and information obtained about both areas.

4. The successful tenderers will be required to demarcate roughly their respective areas. To each area only one road of access through the forest will be allowed, to be agreed to by the Forest Officer.

5. All regulations imposed by the Veterinary Department with regard to the movement of cattle will have to be strictly observed.

It should be noted that Area A is in a "dirty" zone and Area B in the "clean" area of the Nakuru District.

6. Tenders should be forwarded to the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Londiani and will be received by him up to and including the 30th instant.

7. The highest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

WILD FIBRE CUTTING CONCESSIONS.

NOTICE.

UNDER THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE, 1915.

TENDERS are invited for the rights to cut wild fibre (*Sansevieria*) over area where such fibre is to be found.

2. Tenderers will be required to submit plans showing the area over which they desire such rights, the basis of tender to be a royalty per ton on all fibre produced.

3. The concession will be for the period of five years and in addition to the fibre cutting rights, will carry the right to construct such roads and milling stations as are necessary. Rent at the rate of cents five per acre per annum will be charged.

4. The Government reserves the right to alienate the land during the currency of the concession but any such alienation would be subject to the concession.

5. The right to use a reasonable quantity of water sufficient for domestic and other ordinary purposes will be granted if such water be available, but no guarantee can be given that the use of water for decorticating and fibre washing purposes will be permitted. The right to the use of water for any purpose will be subject to previous application having been made to and any necessary permit having been obtained from the Director of Public Works by the concessionaire.

6. Sealed tenders marked "Tender for Fibre Concession" should be deposited with the Commissioner of Lands by noon on the 31st day of December, 1927.

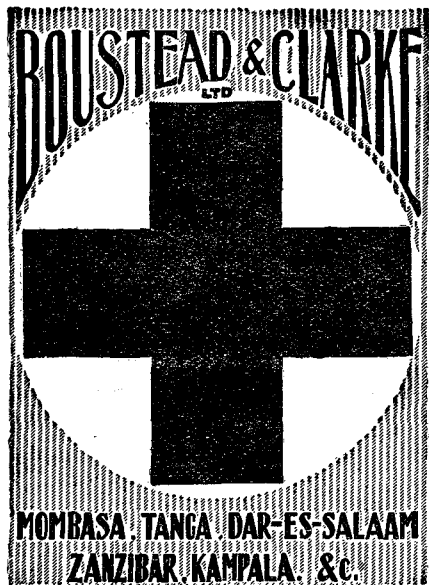
