### RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Diseases of Plants Prevention Ordinance (Chapter 155 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules :—

1. These Rules may be cited as “ the Diseases of Plants Prevention (Amendment) Rules, 1928,” and shall be read as one with the Diseases of Plants Prevention Rules, 1927, hereinafter referred to as “ the Principal Rules.”

2. Rule 2 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the addition of the following definition after definition (b) thereof :—

“ (c) “ Maize ” shall include “ sorghums ” and “ millets.”

3. Rule 8 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the insertion of the words “ planting or ” before the word “ growing ” in line 5 thereof.

4. Rule 18 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the addition of the following paragraph after paragraph (12) thereof :—

“ (13) Banana plants.”

5. Rule 23 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following words :—

“ Provided that when shelled cores are reasonably required for fuel their destruction shall not be compulsory if such shelled cores are stored in a dry building to the satisfaction of an inspector.”
