THE DISEASES OF PLANTS PREVENTION ORDINANCE.

Rules.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Diseases of Plants Prevention Ordinance (Chapter 155 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "the Diseases of Plants Prevention (Amendment) Rules, 1928," and shall be read as ne with the Diseases of Plants Prevention Rules, 1927, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Rules."
- 2. Rule 2 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the addition of the following definition after definition (b) thereof:—
 - " (c) "Maize" shall include "sorghums" and "millets."
- 3. Rule 8 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the insertion of the words "planting or" before the word "growing" in line 5 thereof.
- 4. Rule 18 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the addition of the following paragraph after paragraph (12) thereof:—
 - " (13) Banana plants."
- 5. Rule 23 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following words:—
 - "Provided that when shelled cores are reasonably required for fuel their destruction shall not be compulsory if such shelled cores are stored in a dry building to the satisfaction of an inspector."
