## GENERAL NOTICE No. 260.

## LAND DEPARTMENT—REORGANISATION.

IT is intimated for public information that under the scheme for reorganising Land Administration, the procedure to be followed in future for the treatment of land matters is as follows:—

1. The District Commissioners, Kisumu-Londiani, Kericho and Ravine Districts, and the Resident Commissioners of the Uasin Gishu, Trans Nzoia, Nakuru, Naivasha and Mombasa Districts are now the local authorities for dealing in the first instance with all applications regarding land which require ultimate reference to the Commissioner of Lands or to Government through him, with the exception of applications for permission to sub-divide farms.

2. Applications for permission to sub-divide farms whether these be held on title under the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1902, or the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1915, should in future be made to the Surveyor-General, Nairobi. Such application should be accompanied by sketch plans in triplicate.

3. Applications for permission to sub-divide township plots should be submitted to the District or Resident Commissioner of the district in which the township is situate, accompanied by sketch plans prepared in quadruplicate.

4. Each of the administrative officers of the districts referred to in paragraph 1 above has been appointed an Assistant Land Officer and is empowered to grant temporary occupation licences of land not exceeding 10 acres in area for the purposes of clay, sand, lime stone, quarrying and brick-making concessions, and for ordinary trading or residential purposes.

5. Building plans in townships in the aforementioned districts which require the approval of the Commissioner of Lands, or such authority as he may depute to act for him in this respect, will henceforth be approved by the District or Resident Commissioner concerned advised by the local Medical Officer of Health and Executive Engineer who have been deputed so to act by the Commissioner of Lands.

6. Correspondence on land matters arising in the remainder of the Colony should be addressed direct to the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement, The Secretariat, Nairobi, pending the completion of similar arrangements for decentralization.

7. The collection of rents due in 1928 is being undertaken from Nairobi, and all future communications on this subject should be addressed to the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement (Rents Division), c/o District Commissioner's Office, Nairobi.

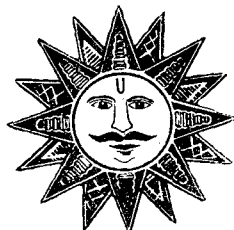
