## GOVERNMENT NOTICE NO 272.

AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE EXPORT  
ORDINANCE.

## RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 10 of the Agricultural Produce Export Ordinance (Chapter 98 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules :—

1. These Rules may be cited as “ the Grading of Wheat Rules, 1928,” and shall take effect from the 1st day of July, 1928.

2. In these Rules “ Wheat ” shall mean the grain of *Triticum vulgare* and *Triticum durum*.

3. It shall be unlawful for any person to export or cause or permit to be exported or attempt to export any wheat unless and until such wheat shall have been inspected by the inspector at Kilindini Wharf or Mbaraki Pier or at such place at the Coast as the Director of Agriculture may from time to time prescribe.

4. For purposes of export there shall be two grades of wheat, as follows :—

(a) *Grade A*.—Shall be wheat which is clean, dry, plump and free from weevils and of fair average quality or over, and contains not more than 10 per cent. of grains of varieties other than the variety under the name of which it is shipped and shall have a bushel weight of not less than 60 lbs.

(b) *Undergrade*.—Shall be any wheat which does not conform to the description of Grade A.

5. A certificate, hereinafter called an “ Exportation Certificate,” shall be issued by the inspector to the owner or shipper of a consignment of wheat which has been inspected and passed as fit for export.

6. Any person intending to export any wheat shall first give notice of such intention to the inspector. Such notice shall be given at least four days before the date of shipment, and shall contain all particulars of the consignment, including the name of the consignee, name of ship on which consignment is being shipped, destination, and number of bags.

When required to do so by the inspector, the owner or shipper of a consignment shall have such consignment ready for inspection at either of the places mentioned in Rule 3 hereof at least two days before shipment.

7. Inspection shall ordinarily be made within seven days of shipment and, if in the opinion of the inspector such is necessary, re-inspection may be made at any subsequent time before shipment.

8. The exportation certificate shall be delivered to the shipper only on production of the “ shipping order ” or “ bill of lading ”.

9. Every bag of wheat in a consignment shall be examined before a certificate is granted in respect of such consignment.

10. It shall be lawful for the inspector to abstract, remove and retain samples from each bag examined, provided that the sample from any one bag shall not exceed one-half per cent. of the total contents of the bag.

11. Wheat intended for export shall be contained in new twill bags "A" quality,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  lb. weight, 8 x 8 (Porter and Shot), in good condition, and securely doubly sewn with overlapping edges.

12. The inspector may refuse to grade any consignment of wheat when the average weight of each bag of wheat is less than 224 lbs. nett, and grading fees as prescribed in Rule 18 shall be charged in respect of any such wheat rejected and again when re-submitted for grading. It shall be lawful for the administration or for the inspector to determine the weight of wheat offered for grading at any one time by any one person by weighing ten per centum of the number of bags offered for grading.

13. Each bag of wheat graded in accordance with these Rules shall be branded with "K" and the description of the grade within a ring.

14. The consignor of weevily wheat to be carried by the Kenya and Uganda Railway Administration to any of the places mentioned in Rule 3 shall clearly state on the consignment note that the wheat referred to thereon is weevily.

15. Upon receipt of notice from the inspector, wheat which is found to be weevily on re-inspection, or which has been railed as sound but is found on arrival at the Port to be weevily, shall be removed forthwith by and/or at the expense of the owner or owners to a place set aside for such produce.

16. Weevily wheat shall be stored separately from other grain.

17. In the event of any consignor electing to store wheat rejected for export in private sheds away from the wharf, such action shall be permitted, but should the owner of such wheat thereafter decide to dispose of it locally he may do so on payment of the difference between the special export railway rate and the ordinary rate obtaining between the station of origin and the Port. If the wheat rejected is not re-submitted for grading and exported within a period of thirty days from the date of rejection, payment of such difference must then be made.

18. A charge shall be made by the inspector at the rate of twelve cents per bag in respect of all wheat submitted for grading under these Regulations, and payment therefor shall be made prior to issue of certificate or removal of wheat. If wheat has been removed and later re-submitted for inspection the same charge shall again be levied.

19. Government or the inspector shall not be liable for any loss or damage sustained in connection with the forwarding or submitting wheat for inspection under these Rules, nor shall Government or the inspector undertake any responsibility in respect of any certificate which may be issued under these Rules.
