ALTERATIONS AND AMENDMENTS TO HARBOUR TARIFF BOOK No. 1, DATED 1ST APRIL, 1928.

THE undermentioned alterations and amendments to the charges contained in Harbour Tariff Book No. 1, dated 1st April, 1928, have been approved by the High Commissioner.

Clause 16 (a), page 15—Insert the following footnote:—

IMPORTS.

Note:—"Bill of Lading Ton" means the unit of weight, measurement, or value, on which any particular Bill of Lading is based.

Clause 16 (c), page 18—Amend the first two lines to read as under:—

TRANSHIPMENT CARGO.

Where goods are entered in transhipment, landed and re-shipped, the following charges apply:—

Clause 28, page 23—Insert the under Storage Rent.—Imports.

Sundays, public holidays and other days when customs duty may not be received shall not be included for the purpose of calculation of rent.

Page 26.—Add the following clause.

37. Shipping and Re-landing Charges on Motor Cars carried Coastwise.

In the case of private and commercial motor vehicles shipped on a coastwise return voyage to and from British East African ports, a flat rate of Shs. 9 per measurement ton will be charged to cover the shipping and subsequent re-landing. The charge is payable at the time of shipping. No refund will be allowed if the car is not returned through the Port of Mombasa.

The official measurer's figures will be taken as the basis for charging in every case.

Auction of Plots, Mombasa-Mainland, Changamwe.

NOTICE is hereby given that grants in respect of the plots on the mainland, in the Changamwe area, specified hereto, will be sold by auction in the Jubilee Hall, Mombasa, on Monday, the 20th August, at 10 a.m.

The right to withdraw any plot from the auction is reserved to the Commissioner of Lands.

- 2. The amount of the advance of each bid will be regulated by the auctioneer, and no bidding shall be retracted.


