ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, to the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Kenya, in regard to the constitution of the Executive and Legislative Councils thereof.

Dated 7th July, 1928.

ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS to Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of Kenya, or other Officer for the time being administering the Government of Our said Colony.

WHEREAS by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Recites Letters Our United Kingdom bearing date the Eleventh day of September, 1920, We did constitute, order, and declare that ber, 1920. there should be a Governor and Commander-in-Chief (therein and hereinafter called the Governor) in and over Our Colony of Kenya (therein and hereinafter called the Colony):

Patent of 11th Septem-

AND WHEREAS We did thereby authorise, empower and command the Governor to do and execute all things that belong to his said office, according to the tenor of Our said Letters Patent and of any Orders in Council relating to the territories formerly known as the East Africa Protectorate, save in so far as any provision of any such Order in Council might be repugnant to any of the provisions of Our said Letters Patent, and of such Commission as might be issued to him under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, and according to such Instructions as might from time to time be given to him under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, or by Order in Council or by Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and to such laws as were then or should thereafter be in force in the Colony:

AND WHEREAS certain Instructions bearing date the Recites Eleventh day of September, 1920, were issued under the Royal of 11th Septem-Sign Manual and Signet for the guidance of the Governor or ber, 1920. other Officer administering the Government of the Colony, and providing amongst other things for the constitution of the Executive and Legislative Councils of the Colony:

AND WHEREAS by certain Additional Instructions Recites bearing date the Twenty-eighth day of December, 1925, We Instructions did amend the Fourth and Sixteenth clauses of the said of 28th December, 1920. Instructions of the Eleventh day of September, 1920:

ADDITIONAL INSTUCTIONS to the Governor and Commander-in-Chief, COLONY OF KENYA.

AND WHEREAS We are minded to make other provision in regard to the constitution of the said Executive and Legislative Councils:

Revokes Instructions of 28th December, 1925. NOW, THEREFORE, We do, by these Our Additional Instructions under Our Sign Manual and Signet, revoke as from the date hereof so much of Our said Additional Instructions of the Twenty-eighth day of December, 1925, as has not already been revoked, but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and instead thereof We do direct and enjoin and declare Our will and pleasure that, from the date of these Our Additional Instructions, the aforesaid Instructions of the Eleventh day of September, 1920, shall be read and construed as if in the place of the Fourth and Sixteenth clauses thereof as amended by Our said Additional Instructions of the Twenty-eighth day of December, 1925, the following clauses had been inserted therein:

Constitution of Executive Council.

"IV. The Executive Council of the Colony shall consist of the persons for the time being lawfully discharging the functions of Colonial Secretary, of Attorney General, of Treasurer, of Chief Native Commissioner, of Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement, of Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, of Director of Agriculture, and of Director of Education, who shall be styled ex officio Members of the Executive Council, and such other persons holding office in the Public Service of the Colony as the Governor, in pursuance of Instructions from Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, may from time to time appoint by an Instrument under the Public Seal, who shall be styled Official Members of the Executive Council, and further of such persons (if any) not holding office in the Public Service of the Colony as the Governor, in pursuance of Instructions from Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, may from time to time appoint by an Instrument under the Public Seal, who shall be styled Unofficial Members of the Executive Council."

Extraordinary Members. "Whenever upon any special occasion the Governor desires to obtain the advice of any person within the Colony or the Protectorate of Kenya relating to affairs in the Colony, he may, by an Instrument under the Public Seal, summon for special occasion any such person as an Extraordinary Member of the Executive Council."

Ex-officio Members of Legislative Council. "XVI. The ex officio Members of the Legislative Council shall be the persons for the time being lawfully discharging the functions of Colonial Secretary, of Attorney General, of Treasurer, of Chief Native Commissioner, of Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement, of Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, of Director of Agriculture, of Director of Education, of General Manager of the Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours, of Director of Public Works, and of Commissioner of Customs."

#### EDWARD GRIGG.



BY His Excellency Sir Edward William Macleay Grigg, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, upon whom His Majesty has conferred the decoration of the Military Cross, Lieutenant-Colonel in His Majesty's Army (retired), Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, in Council.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Native Liquor Ordinance (Chapter 133 of the Revised Edition), it is provided that the Governor in Council may by proclamation apply the aforesaid Ordinance to any area in the Colony at the request of the local authority, and where there is no local authority at the request of the administrative officer in charge of the area;

AND WHEREAS the Acting Senior Commissioner of the Masai Province, has requested that the aforesaid Ordinance be applied to the Townships of (1) Ngong, as defined in Proclamation No. 73, dated 22nd day of October, 1927, (2) Narok, as defined in Proclamation No. 6, dated January 26th, 1916, (3) Kajiado, as defined in Proclamation No. 59, dated 24th August, 1927, and to the following areas in the said Province:

- (a) L.O. No. 1026 around Lake Magadi, having an area of approximately 308 square miles;
- (b) L.O. No. 1883 between mile 27/6, Magadi Railway, and the Kajiado River, having an area of approximately 1,013 acres;
- (c) L.O. No. 4456 between miles 46 and 48 Magadi Railway and to the north thereof, having an area of approximately 2,000 acres;

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the powers in me vested as aforesaid I do hereby, having taken the advice of my Executive Council, proclaim that the aforesaid Ordinance shall apply to and have effect in the above-named townships and areas from the date hereof. And, further, I do hereby proclaim that Proclamation No. 38 of the 31st day of March, 1922, is hereby repealed.


