GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 53.

His Excellency the Acting Governor has approved of the following Bill being introduced into Legislative Council.

> G. R. SANDFORD, Clerk to the Legislative Council.

A Bill to give effect to a certain Resolution adopted by an Imperial Conference held in London in the year nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

WHEREAS at an Imperial Conference held in London in the year nineteen hundred and twenty-six, a resolution was adopted recommending that arrangements should be made between the different parts of the Empire whereby sums awarded under the law relating to Workmen's Compensation in one part of the Empire to beneficiaries resident or becoming resident in another part of the Empire may, at the request of the authority by which the award is made, be transferred to and administered by a competent authority in that part of the Empire in which such beneficiaries reside, and inviting the several Governments of the Empire to take such steps by way of legislation or otherwise as each may consider necessary and appropriate for the purpose of promoting such arrangements:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Acting Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:-

- This Ordinance may be cited as "the Workmen's Short title. Compensation (Transfer of Funds) Ordinance, 1929."
- 2. In this Ordinance, "His Majesty's dominions" includes territories under His Majesty's protection and such, 5 if any, of the territories in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty, as the Governor in Council may direct.

Interpretation.

3. Where under the provisions of any law relating to Administration Workmen's Compensation for the time being in force in of funds 10 any of His Majesty's dominions, an award is made and the Authority making the award orders the transfer of the whole or any of the funds awarded to the Colony for the benefit of any beneficiaries resident in the Colony, such funds shall be received by the Registrar of the Supreme Court and shall 15 be administered by a Judge.

The Chief Justice may make Rules providing for the Power to receipt and due administration of any such funds transferred make Rules. as aforesaid.

# OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill has been prepared at the desire of the Secretary of State to enable effect to be given in this Colony to a resolution of the Imperial Conference, 1926, which recommended that arrangements should be made between the different parts of the Empire whereby sums awarded under the law relating to Workmen's Compensation in one part of the Empire to beneficiaries resident or becoming resident in another part of the Empire, may, at the request of the authority by which the award is made, be transferred to and administered by a competent authority in that part of the Empire in which such beneficiaries reside.

# A Bill to apply a Sum of Money for the Service of the Year ending the 31st day of December, 1929.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "the Appropriation Ordinance, 1929."

Public Revenue charged. 2. The Public Revenue for the year 1929, and other funds of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, are hereby charged towards the Service of the year ending the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twentynine, with a sum of three million one hundred and eighty-eight thousand one hundred and sixty-five pounds.

Application of money granted.

**3.** The money granted by this Ordinance shall be applied for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule annexed hereto.

Treasurer's authority for payment.

**4.** The Treasurer of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya is hereby authorised and required from time to time upon the warrant or order of the Governor to pay out of the revenue and other funds of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, for the several services specified in the Schedule, the said sum of three million one hundred and eighty-eight thousand one hundred and sixty-five pounds, which will come in course of payment during the year ending on the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine.

### THE MINING ORDINANCE, 1925.

### REGULATIONS.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 105 of the Mining Ordinance, 1925, His Excellency the Acting Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as "the Mining (Royalty on Gypsum) Regulations, 1929."
- 2. The royalty payable in respect of gypsum exported from claims under the provisions of section 48 of the aforesaid Ordinance shall be five per centum *ad valorem*.
- 3. When gypsum is exported from claims, but not exported out of the Colony, properly authenticated vouchers shall be produced for the inspection of the Commissioner of Mines by the Claim Holder at the end of each month showing the actual gross price realised for such exported gypsum and the royalty shall be calculated and paid on such price.
- 4. When gypsum is exported from the Colony by the Claim Holder the value thereof shall be assessed provisionally by the Commissioner of Mines before export and royalty shall be calculated and paid on the amount so assessed:

Provided that within six months of the exportation of gypsum from the Colony, or within such further period as the Commissioner of Mines may specify, properly authenticated vouchers showing the actual gross price realised for such gypsum shall be produced for inspection by the Commissioner of Mines and any adjustment necessary shall be made by payment or refund as the case may be of the difference between the royalty paid on such value provisionally assessed and the royalty payable on the actual gross price realised.

- 5. Royalty on gypsum shall be paid to the Commissioner of Mines.
- 6. Export of gypsum from the Colony shall not be permitted unless proof of payment of royalty is first produced to the Customs Authorities.

### THE TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE.

### RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Townships Ordinance (Chapter 82 of the Revised Edition) and of all, other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Acting Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "the Njoro Township (Dustbin) Rules, 1929," and shall apply to the Township of Njore.
- 2. The expression "nuisance" herein shall include any accumulation or deposit of domestic refuse whether the same shall be detrimental to health or not.
- 3. The occupier of any building or premises shall provide and maintain to the satisfaction of the Resident Commissioner or Medical Officer of Health a recptacle for ashes and other non-liquid domestic refuse of a sufficient size, of a capacity not more in any case than 6 cubic feet, of an approved pattern and fitted with a good and efficient lid. Provided that in the case of any house occupied by more tenants than one, the owner shall be deemed to be the occupier for the purposes of these Rules.
- 4. The occupier of any building or premises shall daily cause to be placed within the dustbin provided in terms of the foregoing Rule the domestic refuse from the said building or premises in so far as such dustbin shall be sufficient to contain the same, and not elsewhere, and shall cause such dustbin to be placed and kept in an approved place on the plot or sub-plot upon which such building or premises stand and shall not cause or suffer the same to be placed or kept elsewhere and shall make and keep such dustbin accessible to the public sweepers during the whole period between 6 a.m. and 2 p.m. on Saturdays and between 6 a.m. and 5 p.m., on other days. For the purpose of this Rule premises not occupied for human habitation shall not be deemed to be occupied on any day in which they are not actually occupied after the hour of 4 p.m.
- 5. If any nuisance shall exist upon or near any premises, by reason of domestic refuse, the Resident Commissioner or Medical Officer of Health, or person acting on his behalf shall serve upon the occupier of such premises a notice in writing requiring him to remove the nuisance within such period as may be specified in the notice, and to prevent its recurrence; and if after the expiry of the time specified in such notice as aforesaid such nuisance shall continue or shall, by the act, default or sufferance of the person upon whom such notice shall have been served, recur, then in either of such cases such person shall, be guilty of an offence.

- 6. If there shall be any accumulation or deposit of any trade refuse upon or near any premises used or occupied by any person or used or occupied by any person for or on behalf of any such person as aforesaid for the purposes of any trade or business whatsoever, which shall, in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health or a person deputed by him be, or in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health or a person deputed by him, is likely or calculated to be injurious to health, then and in any of such cases the Resident Commissioner or Medical Officer of Health or other person acting on his behalf shall serve upon the person using or occupying the said premises, or upon the person using or occupying the said premises for or on behalf of such person as aforesaid, a notice requiring him or them to remove the said accumulation or deposit within such period as may be specified in the notice, and to prevent the recurrence of such accumulation or deposit; and, if after the expiry of the time specified in the said notice as aforesaid, such accumulation or deposit shall not be removed or, by the act, default or sufferance of the person so using or occupying the said premises as aforesaid or of the person using or occupying the said premises on his behalf as aforesaid shall recur then in either of such cases, such person shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence.
- 7. Any person contravening or failing to comply with any of the provisions of these Rules shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds or to imprisonment of either description for a period not exceeding two months or both.

DATES FOR THE STRIPPING OF THE TERMINATING CROP.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me, I hereby declare that the following date shall be the time limit for the stripping of the terminating crop, as defined in Rule 11 for the group referred to.

The groups have been more completely defined in notices prominently displayed at the Post Offices, and the attention of all concerned is drawn to the provisions of Rule 10 which states —

"Each separate coffee plantation shall, where practicable, be included in a group, and it shall be the duty of the owner or occupier of such plantation to ensure that his plantation is included in its appropriate group."

THE CIVIL PROCEDURE ORDINANCE, 1924. Rules.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by section 83 of the Civil Procedure Ordinance, 1924, the following Rules are made by the Rules Committee:-

- These Rules may be cited as "the Civil Procedure (Amendment) Rules, 1928," and shall be read as one with the Civil Procedure Rules, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Rules."
- 2. Rule 8 of Order I of the Principal Rules is revoked and the following is substituted therefor:
  - "8. (1) Where there are numerous persons having o. I r. 8. the same interest in one suit, one or more of such persons One person may sue or may sue or be sued, or may be authorised by the Court to defend on defend in such suit on behalf of or for the benefit of all behalf of all persons so interested. The Court shall in such case direct interest. the plaintiff to give notice of the institution of the suit to all such persons either by personal service or, where from the number of persons or any other cause such service is not reasonably practicable, by public advertisement as the Court in each case may direct.
  - " (2) Any person on whose behalf or for whose benefit a suit is instituted or defended under sub-rule (1) may apply to the Court to be made a party to such suit.'
- 3. Rule 15 of Order V of the Principal Rules is amended by the insertion of the words " or such agent or other person ' after the word "defendant" in the proviso.
- 4. Rule 23 of Order V of the Principal Rules is amended by the insertion of the following sub-rule after sub-rule (e):—
  - " (e) (e) The suit is founded on a tort committed within the jurisdiction.'
- 5. Rule 27 of Order V of the Principal Rules is revoked and the following is substituted therefor:
  - "27. Where leave to serve a summons out of the O. V r. 27. jurisdiction has been granted under Rule 23 and the de-Service where fendant is a British subject or British protected person or defendant resides out resides in the United Kingdom or in any British Dominion Colony. or Protectorate or Mandated Territory out of the Colony the summons shall be served in such manner as the Court may order."

- 6. Rule 11 of Order VIII of the Principal Rules is hereby revoked and the following is substituted therefor:
  - "11. Any person named in a defence as a party to o. VIII r. 11. a counterclaim thereby made may, unless some other or Reply to counterclaim. further order is made by the Court, deliver a reply within fifteen days after service upon him of the counterclaim."

7. Rule 1 of Order IX of the Principal Rules is amended by the substitution of the word "any" before the word "summons" in the first line.

- 8. Rule 3 of Order IX of the Principal Rules is amended by the insertion of the words "if required by the Court" after the word "shall" in the fourth line.
- 9. Rule 8 of Order IX of the Principal Rules is amended by the deletion of the words "suit may proceed as if such party had entered an appearance" and the substitution therefor of the words "plaintiff may set down the suit for hearing ex parte."
- 10. Rule 10 of Order IX of the Principal Rules is revoked and the following is substituted therefor:—

Right of plaintiff to set down suit for hearing after defence ordered.

- "10. (1) At any time after the defence or, in a suit in which there is more than one defendant, the last of the defences has been filed, the plaintiff may, upon giving notice to the defendant or defendants as the case may be, set down the suit for hearing.
- "(2) Where the time allowed for filing a defence, or in a suit in which there is more than one defendant, the time allowed for filing the last of the defences has expired and the defendant or defendants as the case may be has or have failed to file his or their defences, the plaintiff may set down the suit for hearing ex parte."
- 11. Order XXXIV of the Principal Rules is amended by the insertion of the following Rule after Rule 3:—

O. XXXIV r. 3 A. Summons by mortgagee or mortgagor.

"3A. Any mortgagee or mortgagor, whether legal or equitable, or any person entitled to or having property subject to a legal or equitable charge, or any person having the right to foreclose or redeem any mortgage, whether legal or equitable, may take out as of course an originating summons, returnable before the Judge in Chambers, for such relief of the nature or kind following as may be by the summons specified, and as the circumstances of the case may require; that is to say, sale, foreclosure, delivery of possession by the mortgagor, redemption, reconveyance, delivery of possession by the mortgagee."

O. XXXIV r. 7. Form and issue of originating summons.

- 12. Rule 7 of Order XXXIV of the Principal Rules is revoked and the following is substituted therefor:—
  - "7. An originating summons shall be in the form No. 13 in Appendix B with such variations as circumstances may require. It shall be prepared by the applicant or his advocate and shall be filed in Court. Service where necessary shall be effected in accordance with the provisions of Order V of these Rules."

WEEKLY LOCUST REPORT TO JANUARY 24TH, 1929.

## HOPPERS.

In Suk.—The swarms reported in the direction of Masol are now under control, as are those in the direction of Nepau Pass. There is no news from farther north. Rains appear imminent and fresh hatchings may be expected after that event.

In Turkana.—Hoppers are being dealt with on the new Lokichar Road. They are also reported at various parts of Lake Rudolph area for sixty miles, and near the mouth of the Turkwell. There is a fresh infestation near Muressi. These areas are being dealt with by headmen. The area between Kalilokwell Soyi and Kwalang is infested; a reinforcement of men has been sent up by the District Commissioner, Northern Turkana, to assist in destruction. Hoppers seen up to the present are in the young stage, and it would apear that outbreaks are being dealt with expeditiously.

South Turkana.—In Karpeddo, which district may now be reached by road, hoppers are old, and a few have reached the winged stage. The Lokapel area has been cleared. Khalatata is reported clear, as also Lokinei. In the Lokichar area a large number of swarms have been destroyed.

In the above districts much good work has been

done and is continuing.

Njemps and Northwards.—No operations report to hand.

The Acting Senior Commissioner of the above province has been constantly on the move from the early part of December, and active interest has been aroused and maintained in the prosecution of the work.

Northern Frontier Province.—Operations will shortly cease as hoppers remaining are nearing the winged stage. No detailed report to hand.

Ukamba: Kitui.—Two heavily infested areas thoroughly cleared. Reinforcements have been sent into the north-east where, in view of recent rains, hatchings are expected to recur. Work has continued with unabated energy and it is confidently expected that maturings will be on a small scale.

Konzo-Tsavo.—Operations proceeding on sisal estates and in native shambas where eggs were mainly laid. Tank truck in use in bush in the Masongoleni area. The poison train has been used on the main line, and delays to train since its use have been infrequent.

Voi.—The infestation in this area is now well under control, and very few hoppers are expected to mature in the entire district. This area has been well handled, and in good time. The District Officer has been treated for arsenical poisoning.

The Senior Commissioner has paid regular visits to the infested areas, and has taken great interest in the work, using his staff to the best advantage.

Masai Province.—Hoppers have been found near Rombo, two officers with trucks and equipment are in the area. Scouting continuing.

Coast Province: Kilifi.—Infestation cleared up.

Malindi.—Work continuing on north bank of the Sabaki River from Mambrui for fifty miles upstream

Tanaland.—Operations continuing. No detailed report to hand.

The Locust Officer for the Laikipia District met the Rumuruti farmers on January 13th. There are no hoppers in the dictrict. Farms which were infested with mature fliers last year were visited, but no trace of hoppers or eggs was found. No locust hoppers are reported from the Crown land north of Rumuruti for a distance of 100 miles.

Captain Nigel Graham has been appointed Locust Officer for the Nakuru District. Nominations are awaited for the Naivasha-Gilgil, Plateau, Trans Nzoia and Lumbwa Districts. Meetings with Locust Committees are to be held at Thika on January 19th, and at Machakos on January 31st. Up to the present no large hopper swarms have been found in areas above the 5,000 feet contour.

# Young Flying Swarms.

Southern Turkana.—Three swarms of pink flying locusts appeared from the west, and on January 8th, 9th and 10th were attacked by means of fire and smoke during the hours of darkness. The remnants flew south-west, and were reported on January 14th on the east side of the Elgeyo Escarpment.

Nakuru.—A swarm of young fliers was reported by Mr. Stanning, Lower Molo, on December 18th, and in the Rongai on the same date.

Northern Frontier.—A large swarm proceeded southwards from Meru to Isiolo, and then southeast on to North Kenya. After doing some damage to wheat the swarm flew north-east. Large swarm moved round the shoulder of Mount Kenya past Meru and has flown in a south-easterly direction.

Ukamba.—On January 14th, and to the evening of January 15th, a large swarm passed into the Kitui District flying from the east out of Galla country. These swarms reached the neighbourhood of Kitui boma on January 18th, and joined up near the Thua River. The latest news is that the swarm is settled round the Tiva and Mwita Syano Rivers, and the tendency of flight is south. A swarm was reported at Konzo on January 21st, at Masongaleni on January 22nd. A swarm was reported at Kapiti Plains on January 22nd. One swarm is reported to be 30 miles long by 2 miles wide. On the same day a large swarm was reported south of Kajiado moving south.

Coast.—Two flying swarms reached the Sabaki River from the north on January 20th.

Whilst the general tendency of movement of young flying swarms is east and south, up to the present no significance attaches to the direction of flight. It is expected that the fly parasites (Bomby) which were found in the mature fliers in November and December are now much more numerous on the old settling grounds of mature fliers so that parasitisation of young fliers may be confidently expected if the flight follow the route of old fliers of December, namely, southwards.

The flame throwers which were expected this month will not be landed until February 10th. Arrangements are well in hand for their utilisation next month.



- 6. The balance of the purchase money may be paid in full to the Surveyor General on or before the 1st April, 1929, or may be paid in nine equal annual instalments payable on the 1st day of January in each year, the 1st instalment being payable on the 1st January, 1930, and the purchaser

shall inform the Surveyor General on or before the 1st April, 1929, which method of payment he desires to adopt.

- 7. If the purchaser shall have elected to pay the balance of the purchase money by instalments no assignment of the land granted or any part shall be valid until the whole of the purchase money shall have been paid.
- 8. The rent due to the 31st day of December. 1929, the survey fees and the fees payable for the preparation (90/-), and registration (20/-) of the grant, and the stamp duty payable (approximately 2% ad valorem) in respect of the grant and, if the purchaser shall have elected to pay the balance of the purchase money in full, the balance of the purchase money, shall be paid to the Surveyor General at the Survey and Registration Department, Nairobi, on or before the 1st April, 1929, and upon such payments being duly made, the purchaser shall, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140, Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya), and, if the conditions of sale have been complied with, be entitled to a grant of the farm, which grant will be presented to him duly executed as soon as conveniently may be.
- 9. If the payments mentioned in Condition No. 8 are not made on or before the 1st April, 1929, the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement may order that the deposit paid by the purchaser be forfeited to the Government, and in such case the purchaser shall have no further claim to a grant of the farm.
- 10. The grants will be under the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya), and the Registration of Titles Ordinance (Chapter 142 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya), and will be for 999 years commencing from the 1st day of April, 1929. Rent will be payable from that date.
