



IN COUNCIL, 1925 and 1927.

ORDER OF THE HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR TRANSPORT.

WHEREAS by the Kenya and Uganda (Transport) Order in Council, 1925, the Office of the High Commissioner for Transport (in the said Orders in Council referred to as "the High Commissioner") for the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya and the Protectorate of Uganda is established.

AND WHEREAS it is provided *inter alia* by Article 3 (1) of the said Order in Council, 1925, that the Services mentioned in the said Order in Council shall include all such railways, ports, harbours, wharves and steamship services as are now or may hereafter be owned, controlled or managed by the Government of Kenya or the Government of Uganda and as are declared by an Order of the High Commissioner, with the approval of the Secretary of State, to be included in the Services :

NOW THEREFORE, I, Jacob William Barth, Knight, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Acting Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, High Commissioner for Transport for the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya and the Protectorate of Uganda, with the approval of the Secretary of State and in pursuance of the powers given to me by Article 3 (1) (ii) of the said Order in Council, do hereby order and declare the railways, ports, harbours, wharves, steamship services and other items mentioned in the schedule hereto which are owned, controlled or managed by the Governments of Kenya and Uganda respectively to be included in the said Services :

Orders dated the 3rd of February, 1926, and the 13th day of October, 1926, published in the Official Gazettes of the 3rd of February, 1926, and the 13th of October, 1926, respectively, are hereby cancelled.

FURTHER reports of flying swarms have been
received again from practically every district from
Kisumu to the Coast.

Rapidly maturing locusts are reported from
points on the Sabaki River.

Swarms in the Coastal area appear to be moving
northwards. Those in the districts near the Lake
are reported to be moving southwards. One large
swarm moved from the Plateau, and is now reported
as entering the Lumbwa Reserve. Swarms in the
Mwanza region are reported to be moving north-
wards. Tanganyika reports generally that the main
mass of locusts is to be found in the Coastal areas
from Kilossa northwards, with a strong tendency
to move north.

Egg laying is suspected in Tanganyika, but not
verified. Later report verifies egg laying in Rufigi
Valley.

No yellow specimens taken in Kenya and
examined are ready to lay.

The movements of swarms are most erratic, due
to climatic influences. It is now improbable that
swarms will travel far out of the Colony before
they are mature.


