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Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance proposed to be amended :—

Interpretation.

**2.** In this Ordinance, unless inconsistent with the context :—

“ The tax ” means the non-native poll-tax prescribed by this Ordinance.

“ District commissioner ” includes an assistant district commissioner.

“ Non-native ” means a male person other than a native within the meaning of the Native Hut and Poll Tax Ordinance.

“ Magistrate ” means a magistrate holding a subordinate court of the first, second or third class, and the powers conferred upon a magistrate by this Ordinance may be exercised by any such magistrate notwithstanding any law limiting the jurisdiction of such magistrate over Europeans or other non-natives.

“ Temporary visit ” means a visit to the Colony not exceeding six months in duration.

Sections 5, 6, 8 and 13 of the Principal Ordinance proposed to be amended :—

Where and to whom tax to be paid.

**5.** The tax shall be paid by the person liable to pay the same to a district commissioner at the office of the officer to whom payment is made.

District commissioner to give receipt in the prescribed form.

**6.** A district commissioner shall give to the person paying the tax a receipt in the prescribed form.

Penalty for furnishing false particulars or refusing to attend or give information when required.

**8.** Any person who shall wilfully furnish a district commissioner with false particulars as to any of the information required by such officer in preparing a receipt, or who, on being required to attend at the office of a district commissioner, shall neglect or refuse to attend, or attending, shall neglect or refuse to furnish any information required as aforesaid, shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding fifteen pounds, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months.

### **A Bill to Amend the Non-Native Poll Tax Ordinance.**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “ the Non-Native Short title.  
Poll Tax (Amendment) Ordinance, 1929,” and shall be read  
as one with the Non-Native Poll Tax Ordinance (Chapter  
52 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as “ the  
5 Principal Ordinance ”.
2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Interpretation.  
amended by the insertion of the following definition:—  
“ ‘ Collector ’ includes a district commissioner,  
an assistant district commissioner, a liwali, a mudir and  
10 any person appointed by the Governor to assist in the  
collection of taxes leviable under this Ordinance ”.

3. (1) Sections 5, 6, 8 and 13 of the Principal Ordinance  
are hereby amended by the substitution of the word  
“ collector ” for the words “ district commissioner ” where-  
15 ever the latter occur.

District commissioner may require production of receipt for tax.

**13.** (1) A district commissioner may, at any time, require any non-native to produce the receipt granted to such non-native for the payment of the tax last payable and a district commissioner may retain any receipt produced for such time as he may consider necessary for the purpose of identifying the person named therein with the person producing the same.

If receipt not produced information required to be furnished to district commissioner.

(2) A district commissioner may require any non-native who refuses or neglects to produce his receipt when requested to furnish him with information as to the office at which he has paid his tax last payable, and with such further information as the district commissioner may require for the purpose of ascertaining whether such non-native has paid such tax.

Penalty for refusing to produce receipt or give information.

(3) Any non-native, who without lawful excuse, shall neglect or refuse to produce his receipt when required as aforesaid, or who, having failed or refused to produce his receipt, shall fail to furnish the information which may be required of him under the preceding subsection, shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding seven pounds ten shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.

Non-production of receipt to be *prima facie* evidence of non-payment of a tax.

(4) Evidence of the non-production of a receipt for the payment of a tax upon requisition being made as aforesaid shall, in and for the purposes of any proceedings for the recovery of such tax, be *prima facie* evidence that the tax has not been paid.

Penalty for producing a receipt granted to some other person or for giving false information.

(5) Any non-native who, being required by a district commissioner to produce his receipt, shall produce a receipt granted to some other person, or, who, having failed or refused to produce his receipt, shall furnish a district commissioner with any false particulars as to any of the information which may be required of him under sub-section (2) of this section, shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding forty-five pounds or to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding six months.

(2) Section 8 and sub-sections (3) and (5) of section 13 of the Principal Ordinance are hereby amended by the insertion of the words "by a magistrate" after the words "on conviction."

#### OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The object of this Bill is to amend the Non-Native Poll Tax Ordinance (Chapter 52 of the Revised Edition) so as to enable Liwalis and Mudirs to assist in the collection of non-native poll tax at the Coast. This will effect an economy and will avoid an ultimate increase in European staff.

It is proposed to refer to any person authorised to collect poll tax, whether he is a District Commissioner, Liwali, Mudir or other person, under the common title of "Collector", as is done in the Native Hut and Poll Tax Ordinance.

It is not intended that Liwalis and Mudirs shall try offences against the Ordinance and this is made clear by the insertion of the words "by a magistrate" after "on conviction" wherever the latter occur.

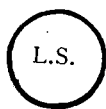

## ORDER.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Shop Hours Ordinance, 1925, it is provided that all shops in townships and other areas to which the Ordinance applies shall be closed for the serving of customers on Sundays except where any local authority applies for exemption from Sunday closing, in which case the Governor in Council may grant such exemption either as to the whole or part of Sunday and either generally or in respect of any particular class of shops or trades:

AND WHEREAS by Proclamation No. 76, dated the 24th day of April, 1929, it is appointed that the said Ordinance shall come into operation in the Nakuru Municipality on the first day of May, 1929:

AND WHEREAS the Nakuru Municipal Board has applied for exemption from Sunday closing up to 1 o'clock in the afternoon of the trades or businesses specified in the Schedule hereto :

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 8 of the aforesaid Ordinance, and having taken the advice of my Executive Council, I do hereby grant exemption from Sunday closing up to 1 o'clock in the afternoon to the trades or businesses mentioned in the Schedule to this Order.

#### SCHEDULE.

1. The sale of refreshments.
2. The sale of motor, cycle, and aircraft supplies and accessories to travellers.
3. The sale of newspapers and periodicals.
4. The sale of meat, fish, milk, cream, bread, confectionery, fruit, vegetables, flowers and other articles of a perishable nature.
5. The sale of tobacco and smokers' requisites and of the preparation locally known as " pansopari."
6. The sale of medicines and medical and surgical appliances.
7. Retail trade carried on at an exhibition or show, if the local authority certify that such retail trade is subsidiary or ancillary only to the main purpose of the exhibition or show.
8. Retail sales by auction.
9. The business of a barber or hairdresser.

2. (1) No motor vehicle may be driven at a speed exceeding twelve miles per hour upon any road within the boundaries of the City Park, Nairobi.

(2) Rule 43 of the Traffic Rules, 1929, is hereby amended accordingly.

THE DISEASES OF PLANTS PREVENTION  
ORDINANCE.

## RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Diseases of Plants Prevention Ordinance (Chapter 155 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Acting Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules :—

1. These Rules may be cited as “ the Diseases of Plants Prevention (Coffee) (Amendment) Rules, 1929,” and shall be read as one with the Diseases of Plants Prevention (Coffee) Rules, 1928, hereinafter referred to as “ the Principal Rules.”

2. Rule 16 of the Principal Rules is hereby revoked and the following Rule substituted therefor :—

“ 16. No person shall move any coffee from the plantation on which it was grown to any warehouse or other place and no person shall receive into any warehouse or other place any coffee so moved unless—

- (1) such warehouse or other place is licensed for that purpose in accordance with the provisions of these Rules; or
- (2) a permit for such movement has been granted by the Director or other person authorised by him in that behalf :

Provided that—

- (a) coffee being despatched to a licensed warehouse or other place, or, coffee intended for immediate export, may be delivered for such purpose at a railway station ;
- (b) trade samples not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  lb. in weight may be forwarded to merchants under the following conditions :—
  - (i) that such samples be registered on arrival and kept under such conditions as the Director may think fit.
  - (ii) that all such samples be either despatched by post to a destination outside the Colony or if not further required for trade purposes handed to an Inspector for destruction.”

3. Rule 17 of the Principal Rules is hereby revoked and the following Rule substituted therefor :—

“ 17. Special conditions applicable to the storage of coffee in licensed warehouses may be imposed by the Director who may also decline to license any warehouse unless he is satisfied that such warehouse contains facilities for the treatment of coffee and for the

destruction of *Stephanoderes* either by fumigation or by heating or by any other method approved by the Director. All such licensed warehouses as aforesaid shall be subject to inspection at any reasonable time by an Inspector ”.

4. The term “ *Stephanoderes* ” wherever it occurs in the Principal Rules shall include the Longicorn Beetle *Sophronica*.

## LOCUST REPORT TO 24TH APRIL, 1929.

The Nandi concentration, approximately 10 square miles in extent, has moved nearer to Kipkarren.

There are swarms in Elgeyo and Maraquet.

A laying swarm has moved from Kajiado to Ngong, and there divided into smaller swarms. Laying has taken place near Ngong, near Kiambu and Ruiru. A portion of the swarm remained in trees near Dagoretti. This swarm is parasitised, and contains only about 20 per cent. of females. Laying has taken place above ground, in trees and bushes, and also on the surface. The inference is that the swarm is approaching its end. The same behaviour was observed in the Voi District towards the end of 1928, with swarms in the same condition.

Swarms have laid in the Voi District. The swarms reported as being between Kiu and Voi have mainly moved off to the north, commencing flight early in the morning. They have been observed crossing the Machakos Reserve and Kitui. Laying is reported from Tiva in Kitui. Most locusts seen as stragglers are found to be males.

Swarms last reported as having flown up the slopes of Mount Kenya, and therefore having become inaccessible for further flame throwing operations, have now reached Meru in masses, and have destroyed young food crops in many locations. They are departing in the direction of Garba Tula. They are not sufficiently mature to lay.

The Ngobit concentration, approximately 30 square miles in extent, has been centered about Major Carnegie's farm, being reinforced by swarms from the direction of Thomson's Falls where great numbers have concentrated. Flame throwing has been conducted on this concentration for four nights, but the mass is so great that little impression has been made on the swarm. This concentration is not yet mature.

Flame throwing has been carried out at Longonot and Naivasha, also in the Lower Molo area and Njoro. The Lower Molo swarm flew east, probably to join the concentration at Thomson's Falls which is beginning to mature.

There is no news of further swarms, Elburgon will next be visited by the flame throwing unit, whilst one unit will continue operations on the Laikipia Plateau.

So far laying appears to have taken place mainly to the east of Nairobi. Laying is suspected in the direction of Narok, and in the Rift Valley up to Gilgil.

An estimate of the area of the Colony covered by roosting swarms is about 100 square miles. When flying, such swarms cover an area very much greater.

## RECENT DAMAGE.

Sisal has been damaged in the Voi District. Coconut trees have been stripped at Kilifi. Young crops have been consumed in Meru. Grass has been cut down, and trees in the forests and elsewhere have been defoliated, and bark consumed.

A close look out should be kept for yellow swarms, and observations made frequently to determine whether laying is taking or has taken place.
