7 (1) A claim for obtaining repayment under section 2 of this Ordinance shall be made within six months from the date of the purchase of the oil

(2) For the purpose of making such claim the purchaser shall make and subscribe a Statutory Declaration in the Form C in the Schedule hereto before a Magistrate and shall attach thereto the original Supply Form or Forms to which such Statutory Declaration relates

(3) Such Declaration, together with the Supply Forms referred to therein, shall thereupon be sent by the purchaser to the Treasurer and the Treasurer shall pay to the purchaser, out of such funds as may be provided by the Legislative Council for that purpose, such sum as may be due under the provisions of this Ordinance

A Bill to Amend the Kerosene Oil (Repayment of Duty) Ordinance, 1928

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as “ the Kerosene Oil Short title (Repayment of Duty) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1929 ”, and No 1 of 1928 shall be read as one with the Kerosene Oil (Repayment of Duty) Ordinance, 1928, hereinafter referred to as “ the Principal Ordinance ”

2 Sub-section (2) of section 7 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion of the words “ or justice of the peace ” after the word ‘ Magistrate ’ in line three thereof Amendment to section 7 (2) of the Principal Ordinance

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of this amending Bill is to increase the facilities available to the public for making statutory declarations, for the purpose of the Principal Ordinance

By including justices of the peaces, with magistrates, as persons before whom a statutory declaration may be made, it is thought that in places remote from a magistrate's office the presentation of claims will be facilitated

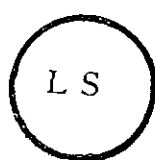

PROCLAMATION

EDWARD GRIGG



BY His Excellency Sir Edward William Macleay Gigg, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, upon whom His Majesty has conferred the decoration of the Military Cross, Lieutenant-Colonel in His Majesty's Army (retired), Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by Article 3 (1) of the Kenya Colony and Protectorate (Boundaries) Order in Council, 1921, I, with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, do hereby declare that the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya shall be and is hereby divided into ten Provinces, comprising 32 districts, the names of which said Provinces and districts are contained in the Schedule hereto

And I do hereby declare that Proclamation No 54, dated the 25th day of February, 1924, appearing at page 1 of the Revised Subsidiary Legislation, as amended by the Subsidiary Legislation (Operation) Regulations, 1928, is amended accordingly

THE ROADS PROTECTION ORDINANCE, 1924

ORDER

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Roads Protection Ordinance, 1924, His Excellency the Governor with the concurrence of the local authority, has been pleased to order that the carriage-way on the public road described in the schedule hereto shall be closed to all kinds of wheeled traffic except the following, namely —

- (a) Pedal cycles
- (b) Motor cycles with or without sidecar attachments
- (c) Light buckboards or carts used for carrying passengers only
- (d) Motor vehicles or trailers fitted with pneumatic tyres of not less than 30 inches in diameter, the total load on any wheel not exceeding 500 lb per inch (nominal width of tyre)
- (e) Motor vehicles or trailers fitted with solid rubber tyres of not less than 30 inches in diameter, the total load on any wheel not exceeding 300 lb per inch (net) width of tyre

And that all other vehicles shall use the waggon track which is situated parallel to the aforesaid carriage-way

LOCUST REPORT TO 26/9/29

FLYING SWARMS

The swarm previously reported from Thomson's Falls moved off northwards, and was subsequently reported as travelling north-east on to Mount Kenya.

There is a small swarm in the region of Ravine.

Another was reported from Naivasha, and it should soon enter the Kikuyu Reserve.

From Suk, two swarms were reported moving east and north east, and one in the Kerio Valley moving south.

HOPPER AREAS

Operations are confined to Suk, Northern and Southern Turkana.

Northern Turkana—On both sides of the Turkwell River for a distance of sixty miles, there is a heavy infestation, and varying largely in width. Poison may not be used near to the river bed as the opinion is held that dead hoppers and poison may render the water in the shallow pools unfit for consumption. Outside the guard area, baiting and spraying is being carried out. The area mainly affected is Loiyapua-Kadudung and Kadudung-Lodwar. Further laying has taken place near the Kakuma River.

In *Suk*, three officers are still engaged on the infestation in the north east of the district.

From *Southern Turkana* there is no further report.

Northern Frontier—Negative report.

The easterly and northerly general movement continues on the east side of the Rift Valley. Should no heavy flying infestation occur during the next 30 days, the December-January campaign, if any, will be on a small scale.

Up to date no authentic news of serious damage on any scale has been received, and it is now possible to consider that the risk of damage to this year's crops is greatly lessened. No estimate of damage done is as yet possible, but it is considered to be small.

Scouting is constant in the Northern Frontier, 3 officers, Masai Reserve, 1 officer, Baringo, 2 officers, Maraquet, 1 officer, and in Suk and Turkana, officers are operating.

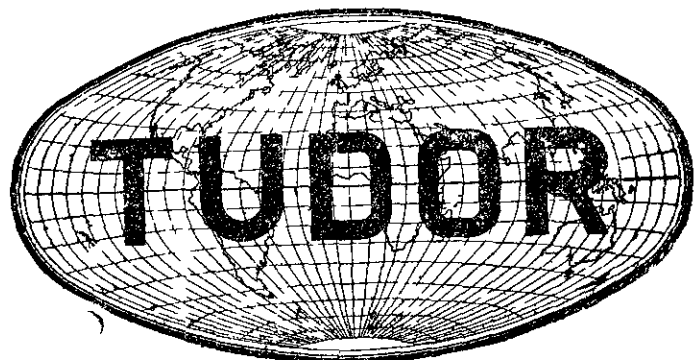

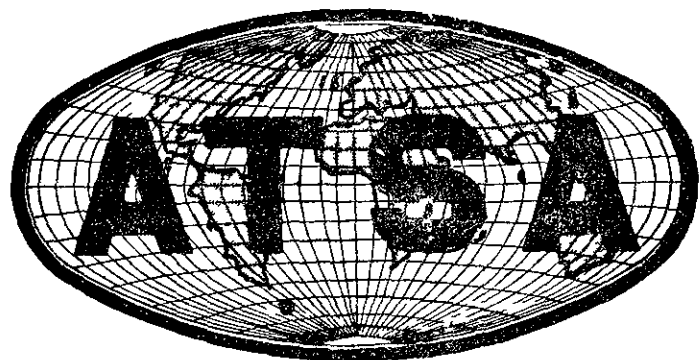
