## LOCUST REPORT TO 23-10-29

## FLYING SWARMS

A few small swarms of pink locusts are reported on the Mau, mainly along the Uaso Muru, which flows into Lake Naivasha. On the 17th and 18th October, a dense swarm of red and yellow locusts passed over Meru. This swarm, which was forty miles long and five miles broad, flew in a north-easterly direction, but it is expected that it will turn north on meeting the Jombeni Range. There are scouts in the area.

Another large yellow swarm is reported by a Scouting Officer as being at Ngare Nanyuki, eighteen miles south-west of Baisalo. These locusts are gravid.

No reports of flying locusts in the settled areas have been received, except one that a swarm entered the Trans Nzoia

Tanganyika reports that the swarm previously in the Pare Hills has moved to above Kisiwani

Such plans etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the District Commissioner, Kisumu-Londiani District, Kisumu, for necessary action.

3 Grants will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance, and the term of each grant will be 25 years from the 1st day of December, 1929, subject to extension to 99 years as provided in Special Condition No 4.

4 The grantee shall not at any time subdivide the plot, or assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of any portion of the plot without the previous written consent of the Governor.
