IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Indian Telegraph Act, 1885, as applied to the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, and other powers thereunto enabling him, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules —

- These Rules may be cited as "the Telegraph (Amendment) (No 4) Rules, 1929, and shall be read as one with the Telegraph Rules appearing at page 1482 of the Revised Subsidiary Legislation, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Rules," and shall have effect as from the 1st day of September, 1929
- 2 "Plain Language Cable Letter Telegiams" referred to in Rules 35, 36, 37, 38 and 41 of the Principal Rules will be accepted for transmission from all Telegiaph Offices in the Colony to places in Switzerland on payment of the following rates —

Minimum charge for 20 words or less than
20 words

Each additional word over 20 words

3 When such telegrams are handed in at a Telegraph Office in the Colony on any week-day up to midday on Saturday for delivery the following Monday morning, the minimum charge shall be reduced to eleven shillings sixty cents for 20 words or less than 20 words and the rate for each additional word over 20 shall be fifty-eight cents

#### THE INDIAN TELEGRAPH ACT, 1885

#### RULES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Indian Telegraph Act, 1885, as applied to the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, and other powers thereunto enabling him, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules —

- 1 These Rules may be cited as "the Telegraph (Amendment) (No 5) Rules 1929," and shall be read as one with the Telegraph Rules appearing at page 1482 of the Revised Subsidiary Legislation (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Rules") and shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1929
- (1) Rule 2 II (a) of the Principal Rules is hereby cancelled and the following substituted therefor —

#### II (a) TELEGRAMS IN CODE

Code language is composed either of artificial words or of real words used with a meaning other than that normally attributed to them in the language to which they belong and consequently not forming intelligible phiases in one or more languages authorised for telegraphic correspondence in plain language, or again of a mixture of real words and of artificial words

Code words may consist of not more than ten letters having at least one vowel if they contain not more than five letters, at least two vowels if they contain six, seven or eight letters and at least three vowels if they contain nine or ten letters. In words of more than five letters one vowel at least must be in the first five letters and at least one vowel in the rest of the word, it being understood that words of nine or ten letters must contain at least three vowers in all. The vowels are a, e, i, o, u, y Combinations of two or more plain language words contrary to the custom of the language to which such words belong are not allowed

(2) The following is added to the Principal Rules —

#### PART XXI

#### FOREIGN TELEGRAMS

41 Code language is composed either of artificial words or of real words used with a meaning other than that normally attributed to them in the language to which they belong and consequently not forming intelligible phrases in one or more languages authorised for telegraphic correspondence in plain language, or again of a mixture of real words and of artificial words

There are two categories of telegrams in code ianguage, viz —

Category A—Telegrams of which the text contains code words of not more than ten letters having at least one vowel if they contain not more than five letters, at least two vowels if they contain six, seven or eight letters and at least three vowels if they contain nine or ten letters. In words of more than five letters one vowel at least must be in the first five letters and at least one vowel in the rest of the word, it being understood that words of nine or ten letters must contain at least three vowels in all. The vowels are a, e i, o, u, y. Combinations of two or more plain language words contrary to the custom of the language to which such words belong are not allowed.

Category B—Telegrams of which the text contains code words of not more than five letters without condition or restriction as regards the formation of such words Figures and groups of figures are not admitted, commercial marks formed of a mixture of figures and letters are however accepted if the sender can prove that they are really commercial marks

In both categories of telegrams, A and B, code words must not contain the accented letters a, á, â, é, ñ, o, u, and the groups ae, aa, ao, oe, ue, ch are each counted as two letters

Telegrams of category A are subject to the full rate

Those of category B are charged for at two-thirds of the full rate rounded up to the nearest five cents and with a minimum charge as for four words

# THE WEIGHTS AND MEASURES (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 1929

Notice to Traders under Sections 33 and 34

- 1 All weights, measures, weighing and measuring instruments used in trade must be examined and stamped by an Inspector of Weights and Measures
- 2 The following will be examined upon trader's premises —

Weighing machines exceeding 250 lb actual dead weight

Automatic and self-indicating scales

Petiol pumps, fixed and portable

Oil pump cabinets

Measures of length screwed to a counter

Notification in writing giving situation and type of instrument must be sent to the appointed stamping station

- 3 With the exception of the above, all articles must be submitted at the appointed stamping station. An inspector will attend as under to examine all articles submitted and to receive notifications.
- 4 No articles will be examined or notifications received after these dates

Penalty for failure to submit or notify, £10

- 5 Articles already stamped "29" need not be re-stamped
- 6 No article will be examined unless clean and free from dirt, grease and rust
  - 7 All fees must be paid at the time of stamping

#### FLYING SWARMS

During the last three months, six small scattered swarins have visited the Rongai and Lower Molo Districts. Some damage has been done to beans and peas and, in certain cases, maize

On the 24th October a small swarm of locusts, just turning yellow, were seen at Pesi, Rumuruti and continued their flight in a north easterly direction, whilst another small swarm passed over Naurobi on 28th October, proceeding east No damage reported

The large swarm of yellow and red locusts that passed over Meru on the 17th and 18th October, have apparently turned then direction of flight from north east to south-east, as they are now reported at Mbere, in the Einbu District. A Locust Scout is proceeding to the Kitur area, in order to witch for laying, etc. A red swarm entered the Kitur District at Musoya. They came from the Kikuyu Reserve, and departed eastwards.

Wireless reports from the Northern Frontier Province state that small swarms of pink locusts have been seen in the vicinity of Mandeia and Walli. A large swarm of red and yellow locusts is reported as having passed over Maragat, in Baringo, on the 19th October. The swarm was flying high, in an easterly direction

Tanganyika reports a small swarm of red locusts near Mbulu No further information has been received

Throughout the Colony the situation is well in hand, and the movements of locusts swarms is being carefully watched by scouts


