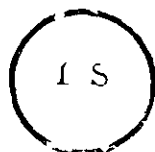

DESCRIPTION OF THE BOUNDARIES OF THOMSON'S FALLS TOWNSHIP

Commencing at the south-east corner of L R No 2915, thence bounded northerly by the eastern boundary of that portion to its north-east corner,

thence by a beacons line bearing approximately $60^{\circ} 22'$ for about 5,624 feet, $96^{\circ} 53'$ for about 2,369 feet and $147^{\circ} 55'$ for about 4,216 feet,

thence south-easterly by a straight line to the middle point of the top of Thomson's Falls,

IT is intimated for public information that on the instructions of the Secretary of State a Tribunal has been appointed under the Chairmanship of His Honour the Chief Justice to enquire whether the scheme proposed by the East African Power and Lighting Company, Limited, known as the Maragua-Tana Hydro-Electric Project, is necessary either in whole or in part in the general interests of the public of Kenya

2 The terms of reference to the Tribunal are as follows —

“ To enquire whether the scheme proposed by the East African Power and Lighting Company, Limited, known as the Maragua-Tana Electric Project, is necessary either in whole or in part in the general interests of the public of Kenya

“ If the reply of the Tribunal to the primary enquiry be in the affirmative the Tribunal will require the East African Power and Lighting Company, Limited to submit for its consideration proposals for the compensation of such natives as will by the scheme be dispossessed of land occupied by them, such compensation to take the form of land of at least equal area and equivalent agricultural utility

“ The Tribunal will consider whether the compensation proposed is adequate, and whether any pecuniary addition, and to what amount, is necessary to compensate the natives concerned fully for the present and future value of the land taken, for disturbance and for expenses of removal ”

GENERAL NOTICE NO 1592

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT (DISTRICT COUNCILS)
ORDINANCE, 1928

BY-LAWS

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by section 66 of the Local Government (District Councils) Ordinance 1928 the Kisumu-Londiani District Council have made the following By-laws —

1 These By-laws may be cited as the Kisumu Londiani District Council (Standing Orders) By-laws 1929

Meetings
of the Council

2 No business shall be transacted at a meeting of the District Council other than that specified in the agenda relating thereto, except any matters which the Chairman considers urgent or which the Council resolves by a majority of the whole Council or three-fourths of the members present to deal with as urgent

3 When a meeting of the Council is adjourned, notice of the adjourned meeting shall be sent to each member of the Council, specifying the business to be transacted

4 If, at the expiration of thirty minutes after the hour at which any meeting of the Council is appointed to be held, a quorum shall not have assembled, no meeting shall take place, unless it is decided, with the unanimous consent of the members present, to allow further time not exceeding an additional thirty minutes in order to enable a quorum to assemble

5 If during any sitting of the Council the attention of the Chairman of the Council shall be called to the number of members present he shall count them and if it be found that there is not a quorum present and if after an interval of five minutes a quorum is still not present, the Council shall stand adjourned

6 Every member of the Council attending a meeting of the Council shall sign his name in the attendance book kept for that purpose

Minutes

7 Minutes of the proceedings of every meeting of the Council shall be drawn up and printed or typewritten, and shall, if confirmed be signed at the next ensuing ordinary meeting by the Chairman

8 The minutes of the last meeting shall be taken as read, with a view to confirmation, provided that a copy of the minutes shall have been sent to each member of the Council twenty-four hours previously

9 No motion or discussion shall be allowed upon the minutes except as to their accuracy

Conduct of
Debate

10 Members of the Council shall stand when speaking, and shall address the chair

11 A member who speaks shall direct his speech strictly to the motion under discussion or to an explanation or a question of order

12 Whenever the Chairman of the Council rises during a debate, any member then speaking, or offering to speak is to sit down and the Council is to be silent, so that the Chairman of the Council may be heard without interruption

13 No speech shall exceed ten minutes in length without the consent of the Council

14 The Chairman of the Council shall call the attention of the Council to continued irrelevance, tedious repetition, unbecoming language, or any breach of order on the part of a member, and shall direct such member, if speaking, to discontinue his speech, or in the event of persistent disregard of the authority of the chair, to retire for the remainder of the sitting

15 No member shall address the Council more than once on any motion or amendment, the mover of the original motion may, however, reply, but he shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers, and shall not introduce any new matter into the debate. The right of reply shall not extend to the mover of an amendment which, having been carried, has become the substantive motion

16 Any member, whether he has spoken on the matter under discussion or not, may rise to a point of order, or in explanation, but such explanation shall be confined to some material part of his former speech which may have been misunderstood. A member so rising shall be entitled to be heard forthwith

17 A motion or amendment may be withdrawn by the mover, with the consent of the Council, which may be signified without debate, and it shall not be competent for any member to speak upon it after the mover has asked permission for its withdrawal unless such permission shall have been refused

18 The ruling of the Chairman of the Council on a point of order or on the admissibility of a personal explanation shall be final and shall not be open to discussion

19 The Council may resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council

20 The quorum of the Committee of the whole Council shall not be less than one-half of the members of the whole Council

21 Every motion proposed and seconded shall be sub- Voting
mitted to the Council by the Chairman of the Council, who shall call upon the members in favour of the motion to say "Aye," and those against to say "No", and he shall thereupon declare what he collects to be the sense of the Council. Provided it shall always be in the power of any member to challenge the declaration of the Chairman of the Council, and to demand a division, whereupon the Chairman of the Council shall take the vote of each member separately, which shall be recorded in the minutes, and the motion shall be declared carried or lost, according to the numbers voting for or against it

22 Previously to the Chairman taking the division the question before the Council shall be put again by the Chairman of the Council, and every member then present, save any member prohibited from exercising a vote under any provisions of the Local Government (District Councils) Ordinance (with the exception of the member occupying the chair, with whom it shall be optional whether he votes or not) shall record his vote either for or against the question

23 No member shall vote in a division unless he shall have been present when the question was put the second time

24 When the clerk shall have recorded all the votes cast the Chairman of the Council shall announce the result of the division

Financial

25 All receipts shall be deposited weekly to the credit of the Council's banking account without abatement

26 Written receipts on printed and numbered forms bearing the name of the District of which duplicate copies shall be kept, shall be issued for all moneys received by or on behalf of the Council

27 All work, not carried out departmentally, the amount of which exceeds seventy-five pounds, must, except in cases of emergency, be put up for public tender, and all work not carried out departmentally, the amount of which does not exceed seventy-five pounds shall, when possible, be put up for public tender

28 Tenders shall be received only in closed envelopes, and placed in a box appointed for the purpose

29 The tenders shall be opened by two members of the Council, or of a Committee duly authorised to deal with such tenders, in conjunction with the Clerk, who shall sit in public for that purpose fifteen minutes before the time fixed for the sitting of the Council or Committee, as the case may be, and one of the members of the Council or Committee so present shall date and sign each tender received. All tenders received shall be recorded in the minutes of the Council or Committee, as the case may be

30 If a Committee shall accept or recommend the acceptance of a tender other than the lowest they shall state their reasons in a report thereon to the Council

31 All orders for works and goods shall be given on official order forms and copies of such orders shall be attached to all accounts before payment is made

32 All payments shall be made by cheque

33 No cheques shall be drawn for any amount the account for which is not signed by the Chairman of the Committee directing the expenditure, the Clerk and the Engineer

ORDINANCE, 1928

BY-LAWS

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon it by section 69 of the Local Government (Municipalities) Ordinance, 1928, the Nairobi Municipal Council has made the following By-laws —

1 These By-laws shall be cited as “ the Nairobi Municipal (Public Service Vehicles) By-laws, 1929, ” and shall be read as one with the Nairobi Municipal By-laws, 1926

2 No person other than a person licensed as a driver of a public service vehicle with his vehicle shall stand on any place set apart by the Municipal Council as a stand for public service vehicles

5 The first and second vehicles in order upon a stand shall at all times be attended by the drivers in charge of such vehicles

6 No person other than a *bona fide* passenger shall occupy a seat next to the driver in any public service vehicle

7 Offences against these By-laws shall be cognisable by the Police

LOCUST REPORT TO 20 11-29

FLYING SWARMS

Further reports now indicate definitely that the swarms of yellow locusts in the Northern Frontier Province and Meru have invaded the Colony from the north as was originally assumed, and do not emanate from the few swarms that caused destruction in Kenya.

On 13th November, a large swarm of yellow locusts passed over North Tigania and the whole of Upper Ingembe, in the Meru District, this swarm came from the direction of Isiolo, and flew east towards Garba Tulla. Slight damage was done to native crops.

The Embu swarm has now left and entered the Kitui District. Heavy rains have greatly diminished their numbers and their movements are very slow. No eggs have been found in the Embu District, but 25 per cent of the native crops in the Njamburi area have been destroyed, the natives are busily engaged in replanting.

In Kitui the locusts have laid in the Mivukoni area, and in the vicinity of Tseikuru. The density of swarms that have appeared in the district is not intense although they cover a considerable amount of country, but the impending hopper infestation is not expected to be on any large scale. A small hopper campaign on restricted lines may be necessary at a later date.

The Locust Scout who was sent to investigate the reported laying on the Nzene Estate, Donyo Sabuk, reports that he has discovered 300 acres of eggs, a great proportion of which have been deposited in land that is now under water. He followed the swarm which after laying, proceeded in the direction of Kitui.

Two swarms of yellow locusts passed over Athi River on the 13th November and flew in a southerly direction whilst at Pondoni and between the Athi and Mbumi Rivers laying has taken place, but not on an extensive scale.

The District Commissioner, Voi, reports that swarms of yellow locusts have now arrived in his district from the north, and continued their flight south towards Tanganyika Territory.

Another scattered swarm of yellow locusts is stated to be in the Rombo area on the eastern slopes of Kilimanjaro. The Locust Scout in the Masai Reserve has been instructed to proceed there and investigate.

HOPPER AREAS

Northern Frontier Province—Hoppers have begun to appear in isolated bands in most of the country just north of the Guaso Nyiro River. The infestation is, however, not so severe as that of a year ago. Three Locust Officers are on the spot, and further trained staff is being despatched.

Hoppers have not as yet hatched out elsewhere in the Colony.
