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Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance proposed to be amended —

Notice of death to be furnished to the Public Trustee
Power to apply to court for appointment as Administrator in certain cases Cases in which Public Trustee can administer without such appointment

4 Subject as hereinafter provided the Resident or District Commissioner of every District shall furnish the Public Trustee with a notice of the death of every person (other than of a native dying within a Native Reserve or other area set apart for Natives) in his District and on receipt of such notice or on otherwise being notified of or becoming acquainted with such death the Public Trustee shall cause enquiry to be made as to the estates of all such deceased persons possessed of or entitled to any property immovable or movable within the Colony and after ascertaining —

- (a) that any such person died intestate, or
- (b) that the deceased having made a will devising or bequeathing his estate or any part thereof, has omitted to appoint an executor, or
- (c) that the person or persons named as executor or executors in the will are dead or have renounced probate thereof or otherwise are unable or unwilling to act, or
- (d) that probate or letters of administration with the will annexed has or have not been obtained within 3 months from the death of the testator, or
- (e) that the testator has appointed the Public Trustee an executor of his will, or
- (f) that the executor or administrator of a deceased person who is resident outside the Colony has appointed the Public Trustee by power of attorney to act for him in the Colony

the Public Trustee may apply to the Court for an order authorising him to administer the estate of such deceased person

Provided always, and notwithstanding anything in this Ordinance contained it shall and may be lawful for the Public Trustee, in the case of an estate consisting only of property of an estimated gross value not exceeding Shgs 1,000 of a deceased person dying intestate or leaving a will under such circumstances that the Public Trustee may apply for leave to administer as hereinbefore provided, in either of such cases,

A Bill to Amend the Public Trustee's Ordinance, 1925

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as “ the Public Trustee's Short title
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1929”, and shall be read as one with
the Public Trustee's Ordinance, 1925, hereinafter referred to
as “ the Principal Ordinance ”

5 **2** Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of

5 The Public Trustee shall serve a notice of his intention to apply for such order upon all executors and next of kin of the deceased known to him to be resident in the Colony except in the circumstances set out in section four subsection (e) and (f) and shall cause such notice to be published in the Gazette or in one weekly newspaper or both at the discretion of the Public Trustee and to be posted in a conspicuous place at the Supreme Court and after the expiration of fourteen days from the date of such publication and posting he shall apply to the Court for an order to administer the estate of such deceased person, and the said Court shall, if satisfied by affidavit that the case is within the provisions of this Ordinance, make such order upon the petition of the Public Trustee accordingly, which order, when made, shall give to the Public Trustee the same power over all the estate wheresoever situate or left of the deceased person, except as hereby enacted, as he would have had, if letters of administration of such estate had been granted to him, subject nevertheless to any orders which may from time to time be made by the Court on petition as hereinafter mentioned touching the same or the administration thereof

Provided always that the Court may order such further notice as it may think fit to be given before making such order, and provided further that it shall not be necessary for the Public Trustee to serve such notice as is in this section mentioned in any case where the Public Trustee shall have obtained the consent in writing of the executors (if any) or of all parties interested in the estate (other than creditors), as the case may be, to make such application to the Court as in this section is provided for subject however and without prejudice to the right of the Public Trustee to take possession of and administer any estate consisting solely of property not exceeding Shgs 1,000 as hereinbefore provided

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of the Bill is to increase the monetary limit of estates that may be administered by the Public Trustee, or his *ex officio* agents, without any application to the Court

The effect of the amendment will be to enable District Commissioners, who are by virtue of the Public Trustee's (Appointment of *Ex Officio* Agents) Rules, *ex officio* agents of the Public Trustee, to deal with a greater number of estates without reference to the Public Trustee, thus avoiding considerable delay, and saving correspondence. The advantages of the Bill will be chiefly felt in the Coast Province, especially in such places as Lamu, Malindi, etc.

THE TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE

RULES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Townships Ordinance (Chapter 82 of the Revised Edition), and of all other powers thereunto enabling him, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules —

1 These Rules may be cited as “ the Nyeri and Nanyuki Townships (Dustbin) Rules, 1929 ” and shall apply to the Townships of Nyeri and Nanyuki

2 In these Rules the expression “ nuisance ” shall include any accumulation or deposit of domestic refuse whether the same is detrimental to health or not

3 The occupier of any building or premises shall provide and maintain to the satisfaction of the Resident Commissioner or Medical Officer of Health a receptacle for ashes and other non-liquid domestic refuse of a sufficient size, of a capacity not more in any case than 6 cubic feet, of an approved pattern and fitted with a good and efficient lid. Provided that in the case of any house occupied by more tenants than one, the owner shall be deemed to be the occupier for the purposes of these Rules

4 The occupier of any building or premises shall daily cause to be placed within the dustbin provided in terms of the foregoing Rule the domestic refuse from the said building or premises in so far as such dustbin shall be sufficient to contain the same, and not elsewhere, and shall cause such dustbin to be placed and kept in an approved place on the plot or sub-plot upon which such building or premises stand and shall not cause or suffer the same to be placed or kept elsewhere and shall make and keep such dustbin accessible to the public sweepers during the whole period between 6 a m and 2 p m on Saturdays and between 6 a m and 5 p m on other days. For the purpose of this Rule premises not occupied for human habitation shall not be deemed to be occupied on any day on which they are not actually occupied after the hour of 4 p m

5 If any nuisance shall exist upon or near any premises, by reason of domestic refuse, the Resident Commissioner or Medical Officer of Health or person acting on his behalf shall serve upon the occupier of such premises a notice in writing requiring him to remove the nuisance within such period as may be specified in the notice, and to prevent its recurrence and if after the expiry of the time specified in such notice as aforesaid such nuisance shall continue or shall by the act, default or sufferance of the person upon whom such notice shall have been served, recur, then in either of such cases such person shall be guilty of an offence

6 If there shall be any accumulation or deposit of any trade refuse upon or near any premises used or occupied by any person or used or occupied by any person for or on behalf

of any such person as aforesaid for the purposes of any trade or business whatsoever, which shall, in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health or a person deputed by him be, or in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health or a person deputed by him, is likely or calculated to be injurious to health, then and in any of such cases the Resident Commissioner or Medical Officer of Health or other person acting on his behalf shall serve upon the person using or occupying the said premises, or upon the person using or occupying the said premises for or on behalf of such person as aforesaid, a notice requiring him or them to remove the said accumulation or deposit within such period as may be specified in the notice and to prevent the recurrence of such accumulation or deposit, and, if after the expiry of the time specified in the said notice as aforesaid, such accumulation or deposit shall not be removed or, by the act, default or sufferance of the person so using or occupying the said premises as aforesaid or of the person using or occupying the said premises on his behalf as aforesaid shall recur then in either of such cases, such person shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence

7 Any person contravening or failing to comply with any of the provisions of these Rules shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds or to imprisonment of either description for a period not exceeding two months or both

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT (MUNICIPALITIES)
ORDINANCE, 1928

BY-LAWS

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 69 of the Local Government (Municipalities) Ordinance, 1928, the Municipal Council of Nairobi has made the following By-laws —

1 These By-laws may be cited as “ the Nairobi Municipality (Amendment) (No 5) By-laws, 1929, and shall be read as one with the Nairobi Municipality By-laws, 1929, hereinafter referred to as “ the Principal By-laws ”

2 By-law 471 (b) of the Principal By-laws, as amended by the Subsidiary Legislation (Operation) Rules, 1928, is hereby revoked and the following is substituted therefor —

“ 471 (b) (1) No person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle drawn by horses, mules or oxen on any road specified in the First Schedule hereto

(2) No person shall draw up or park any motor lorry, tractor or trailer on any road specified in the First Schedule hereto unless for the purpose of necessarily loading or unloading goods at premises abutting on any such road and then in any such case the period during which such motor lorry, tractor or trailer may be drawn up or parked shall in no case exceed fifteen minutes in duration. Provided that a box body mounted on a touring motor car chassis shall not be deemed to be a motor lorry within the meaning of this By-law

(3) No person shall draw up or park any motor vehicle on any road specified in the First Schedule hereto unless such motor vehicle shall be brought to a stationary position on the left-hand side of such road with its near or left-hand front wheel within nine inches of the kerb or other line demarcating the footpath and the near or left-hand side of the body thereof forming an angle of approximately forty-five degrees with such kerb or line

(4) No person shall draw up or park any vehicle on any road specified in the Second Schedule hereto, unless such vehicle is brought to a stationary position either with both its near or left-hand wheels within nine inches of the kerb of the footpath on the south-eastern side of the said road or both its off or right-hand wheels within nine inches of the boundary of the Law Courts enclosure (Plot No 547) on the north-western side of the said road

(5) No person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle in Court Lane except in the direction of Government Road

(6) No person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle on the road abutting on the north-western boundary of the Law Courts enclosure (Plot No 547) except in the direction of Victoria Street

(7) No person shall park any vehicle on the main Sixth Avenue roadway or draw up or park any vehicle on any road or thoroughfare specified in the Third Schedule hereto except for the purpose of loading or unloading goods at premises abutting on the said roads or thoroughfares

(8) No driver of any vehicle shall cause or permit such vehicle to remain stationary on any road specified in the First and Fourth Schedules hereto for a longer period than one hour

(9) No person shall draw up or park any vehicle on that part of Victoria Street abutting on the Law Courts enclosure (Plot 547) and demarcated by notice boards prohibiting parking

(10) No person shall draw up or park any vehicle on any road specified in the Fourth Schedule hereto unless such vehicle is brought to a stationary position with both its near or left-hand wheels within nine inches of the kerb or other line demarcating the footpath

(11) No person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle used for commercial or trade purposes on that portion of Eliot Street between Fifth Avenue and Whitehouse Road except for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods at premises adjacent thereto

(12) No person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle on either of the side roads adjacent to and running parallel on each side with that portion of Sixth Avenue between the Railway Crossing and Hardinge Street except in an easterly direction in the case of the side road on the northern side of Sixth Avenue and in a westerly direction on the side road on the southern side, and no person shall draw up or park any vehicle on either of the said side roads unless such vehicle shall be brought to a stationary position with its off or right-hand front wheel within nine inches of the kerb of the island between the side road and Sixth Avenue and the body of the vehicle forming an angle of approximately forty-five degrees with the said kerb

(13) No person shall draw up or park any vehicle within any area delimited by notice boards authorised by the Municipal Council prohibiting parking therein

(14) No person shall, upon any road within the commercial area as defined by By-law 2 of the Principal By-laws, draw up or park any vehicle on the outside of any other vehicle and between such other vehicle and the travelled portion of any such road

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

LOCUST REPORT TO 27-11-29

Reports indicate that the locust swarms in the Colony have deposited eggs in the north east and east. Flight is continuing in a southerly direction, some swarms having reached the Coast, and a few having entered Tanganyika Territory.

The following information has been received from districts —

Northern Frontier Province — The Locust Scout stationed at Marsabit has just completed a 500 mile safari, proceeding westwards from Marsabit to Lake Rudolf, thence northwards nearly to the Kenya and Abyssinia boundary. A few yellow swarms of locusts were encountered, and breeding on a small scale is taking place in difficult country.

There are now seven trained Locust Officers operating in the Province. Large bands of newly hatched hoppers are reported in the country through which the Archer's Post-Marsabit road runs. They have been found as far north as Lasamis, but the most heavily infested area is between Kenya and Kauo, and along the north bank of the Uaso Nyiro River. In the Baisalo area, hoppers have not as yet appeared, although laying grounds have been located.

A report from Moyale states that large swarms of locusts appeared in that district, and continued their flight in a south and south-easterly direction. Two small bands of hoppers have been destroyed by the K A R in the vicinity of Waji.

Meru — Laying has taken place, and hoppers in small numbers are appearing in the Tharaka area.

Kitui — The Embu swarm has entered this district and laid in the same area as did the swarms of two weeks ago. The Muvukuni, Katae and Ndatani areas have been heavily laid over, but no hoppers have as yet appeared in the district.

Machakos — One Locust Officer has proceeded to this district to scout and investigate the small laying areas reported.

Coast — Swarms of yellow locusts have reached Malindi, but no reports of laying have been received.

N. Turkana — A laying ground four square miles in extent has been located in the Kotabui area. It is considered that the hopper infestation in this district will be but slight.

Tanganyika reports swarms of yellow locusts along the Longido Arusha road. Extensive laying has taken place in the Pare District, and preparations are being made for an anti-hopper campaign.

The succession of events recorded at this time last year is being repeated, and in view of the impossibility of destroying hopper bands in the north-eastern areas of this Colony, pink flying swarms should arise after the middle of January. As laying has proceeded and is proceeding in a general southerly direction, these new swarms should fly southwards towards Tanganyika, over the area between Mount Kenya and the Coast.

Plans of the plots may be seen at the Public Map Office attached to the Survey and Registration Department, Nairobi, and at the office of the District Commissioner at Naivasha, or may be had on application to the Surveyor General on payment of Shs 3, post free.

The right to withdraw any plot from the auction is reserved to the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement.

In the following General and Special Conditions of Sale the term 'Authority' means the District Commissioner, Naivasha, or such other Municipal Authority as may be hereafter established by law.

CONDITIONS OF SALE

(a) AUCTION

- 1 Each plot will be auctioned separately.
- 2 The amount of the advance of each bid will be regulated by the auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted.
- 3 The highest bidder will be the purchaser, but, if any dispute arise as to any bid the plot will be reoffered at the last undisputed bid.
- 4 Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer a deposit of 25% of the purchase money. In default of such payment, the plot may be immediately reoffered for sale, and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.
- 5 Each purchaser shall on paying the deposit inform the auctioneer of the name or names of the person or persons on whose behalf the plot is purchased, the grant will be issued in accordance with this information.
- 6 The balance of the purchase money together with the rent due to the 31st December, 1930, shall be paid to the District Commissioner, Naivasha, while the survey fees, the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the grant (Shs 110), and the stamp duty payable in respect of the grant and all other expenses, if any, shall be paid to the Surveyor General, Nairobi, all the amounts to be paid within seven days from the date of the sale, and upon such payments being duly made the purchaser shall, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140 Revised Edition), and of the Conditions of Sale having been complied with, be entitled to a grant of the plot which grant shall be presented to him duly executed as soon as conveniently may be. Provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the time stated or thereafter unless and until the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement can present to the purchaser the grant duly executed.

7 Subject to the proviso contained in Condition No 6, if the amounts therein mentioned are not paid as therein laid down within seven days from the date of sale, the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited, and the purchaser shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

(b) GENERAL

1 The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot, and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground and the grantees shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

2 No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the Authority and by the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement, or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the District Commissioner for necessary action.

3 Grants will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance and the term of each grant will be 99 years from the 1st day of January, 1930.

4 The grantee shall not at any time subdivide the plot, or assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of any portion of the plot without the previous written consent of the Governor.

5 Any building erected shall conform to a building line decided upon by the Authority.

(c) SPECIAL

1 The plots may be used for business purposes only.

2 Not more than ninety per cent of the area of any plot shall be built upon.

3 In no case shall the area of any plot required to remain unbuilt on be less than 300 sq. ft., and the said area shall be free from any erection thereon above the level of the ground except latrine accommodation constructed in accordance with all laws and by-laws in force relating thereto, and in accordance with a design approved by the Authority.

Such open space shall be at the rear of the building and shall extend along the entire width of the building or for a distance of not less than 200 ft. whichever shall be the less, and the distance across such open space from every part of the building to the rear boundary of the plot shall be not less than 10 feet.

4 Each purchaser of a plot shall erect thereon within two years of the commencement of his grant a building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick or concrete on proper foundations.
