2 No land within a township shall be divided, divided and let or divided and sold, unless a plan in duplicate of the proposed division or subdivision has been submitted to the Commissioner of Lands and the approval of the Commissioner of Lands has been signified thereon in writing

3 No scheme of division or subdivision having been approved as hereinbefore provided shall be withdrawn, cancelled or altered without the written approval of the Commissioner of Lands

4 The erection of more than one building within the boundaries of any one plot or holding, whether such buildings are erected on account of the owner of the land or otherwise, shall constitute division of such land for the purposes of these Rules

Provided that out-buildings or appurtenances to any building shall not be deemed buildings for the purposes of these Rules

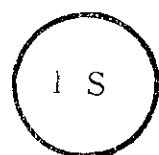

Any person convicted of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Sh 150 or to imprisonment of either description for a period not exceeding two months, or to both such fine and imprisonment

3 No person shall organise or take part in any of the native dances named in the schedule hereto Any person convicted of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Sh 150 or to imprisonment of either description for a period not exceeding two months or to both such fine and imprisonment

BOUNDARIES OF THE WASIN-SHIMONI COMMUNAL
RESERVE

Commencing at the high water mark on the left (or northern) bank of the Mwena River at the crossing of the Gasi-Vanga road,

thence by that bank of the river up-stream to a point about three-quarters of a mile distant where it is intersected by a surveyed and beaconsed line,

thence by that beaconsed line, bearing approximately $50^{\circ} 16'$ for about 5,544 feet, $52^{\circ} 34'$ for 6,871 feet, $31^{\circ} 22'$ for 3,459 feet, $20^{\circ} 39'$ for 2,485 feet and $0^{\circ} 58'$ for 420 feet,

thence bearing approximately $78^{\circ} 58'$ for about 4,749 feet,

thence bearing approximately $0^{\circ} 20'$ for about 2,582 feet, and $0^{\circ} 17'$ for 736 feet,

thence bearing approximately $114^{\circ} 49'$ for about 6,608 feet to a beacon at the northern corner of the area surveyed as the Mwangei Reserve,

thence bearing approximately $123^{\circ} 30'$ for about 11,209 feet to the north-west corner of the area surveyed as the Pongwe Reserve,

thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of that surveyed area bearing approximately $104^{\circ} 59'$ for about 15,993 feet and by a straight line bearing approximately $161^{\circ} 36'$ to its intersection with the southern boundary of the of the Vanga Gasi road reserve,

thence easterly by that road reserve to its intersection with the western boundary of the Shimoni road reserve,

thence by the latter road reserve south-easterly to the north east corner of L R No 1083,

thence westerly by the northern boundaries of L R Nos 1083 and 5031,

thence southerly and easterly by the western and part of the southern boundaries of L R No 5031 to the north west corner of L R No 1080,

thence southerly by the western boundaries of L R Nos 1080 (crossing Pongwe road reserve) and 5041 to the south-west corner of the latter,

thence easterly by the southern boundary of L R No 5041 to its south east corner on the western boundary of the Shimoni road reserve,

thence southerly by that road reserve boundary to a point due west of the south west corner of L R No 1084,

thence due west to a point one mile from that corner,

thence by a straight line due south to high water mark on the Indian Ocean,

thence in a generally westerly and north westerly direction by that high-water mark to the mouth of the Mwena River,

thence still following high water mark by the left (or northern) bank of that river to the point of commencement

The Island of Wasin down to high-water mark is included in the communal reserve

The foregoing boundaries are delineated, bordered red, on Land Surveys Boundary Plan No 65, deposited in the Survey and Registration Department Nairobi, a copy whereof is on record at the office of the Senior Commissioner, Coast Province, Mombasa

LOCUST REPORT TO 11-12-29

Staff and equipment has now been despatched to all accessible parts of the Colony from whence hoppers or laying fields have been reported. Including the staff employed on scouting, there are now 27 Locust Officers on the strength, and this number is considered sufficient to cope with the present situation which demands but a small-scale campaign.

HOPPER AREAS

Northern Frontier Province —Operations are being carried out mainly in the vicinity of the Uaso Nyiro. No recent report has been received as to the actual position.

KIKUYU PROVINCE

Embu —The hopper infestation, although scattered is serious, being most dense in the neighbourhood of Wachembis, one Locust Officer is operating here, and the District Agricultural Officer is organising the work of destruction at Njamburus. Hoppers have also been discovered at Chuka and Upper Emberre.

UKAMBA PROVINCE

Kitui —Further staff and supplies have been sent to Northern Kitui where the situation should shortly be under control.

Machakos —There are large bands of hoppers in the Katheka and Meanyeni locations, and a later report indicates a further infestation at Kwafaluki. The locust staff is being increased.

Donyo Sabuk —One Locust Officer is operating on the Nzeeni Estate using bran bait. This officer will also be able to deal with the hoppers on the adjacent parts of the Yatta and at Kampi-ya-Faro.

Voi —One Locust Officer is at work in this district. A locust train is being equipped ready to proceed to Voi at short notice. Hoppers are reported in small patches, much scattered.

Masai Reserve —Laying has been reported in the country between Simba and Kilimanjaro. The situation is under observation, but as the laying has been very scattered, it is not considered that operations on any large scale will be necessary.

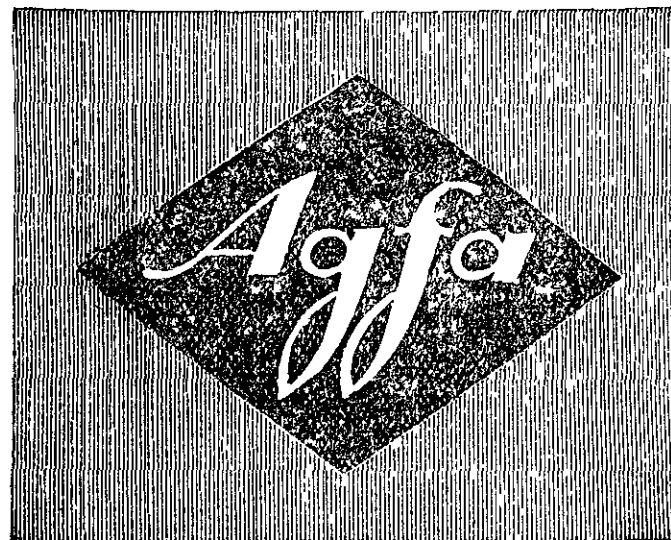
