- 3 No scheme of division or subdivision having been approved as hereinbefore provided shall be withdrawn, cancelled or altered without the written approval of the Commissioner of Lands
- The election of more than one building within the boundaries of any one plot or holding, whether such buildings are erected on account of the owner of the land or otherwise, shall constitute division of such land for the purposes of these Rules

Provided that out-buildings of or appurtenances to any building shall not be deemed buildings for the purposes of these Rules

3 No person shall organise or take part in any of the native dances named in the schedule hereto. Any person convicted of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding. Sh. 150 or to imprisonment of either description for a period not exceeding two months or to both such fine and imprisonment.

Staff and equipment has now been despatched to all accessible parts of the Colony from whence hoppers or laying fields have been reported. Including the staff employed on scouting, there are now 27 Locust Officers on the strength, and this number is considered sufficient to cope with the present situation which demands but a small-scale campaign

HOPPER AREAS

Northern Frontier Province — Operations are being carried out mainly in the vicinity of the Uaso Nyiro No recent report has been received as to the actual position

KIKUYU PROVINCE

Embu—The hopper infestation, although scat tered is serious, being most dense in the neighbourhood of Wachembis, one Locust Officer is operating here, and the District Agricultural Officer is organising the work of destruction at Njamburus Hoppers have also been discovered at Chuka and Upper Emberre

UKAMBA PROVINCE

Kitui —Further staff and supplies have been sent to Northern Kitui where the situation should shortly be under control

Machakos —There are large bands of hoppers in the Katheka and Meanyeni locations, and a later report indicates a further infestation at Kwafaluki The locust staff is being increased

Donyo Sabuk —One Locust Officer is operating on the Nzeeni Estate using bran bait—This officer will also be able to deal with the hoppers on the adjacent parts of the Yatta and at Kampi-ya-Faro

Voi —One Locust Officer is at work in this district. A locust train is being equiped ready to proceed to Voi at short notice. Hoppers are reported in small patches, much scattered

Masai Reserve —Laying has been reported in the country between Simba and Kilimanjaro. The situation is under observation, but as the laying has been very scattered, it is not considered that operations on any large scale will be necessary


