## A Bill to make provision for the Prevention of Adulteration of Food and Drugs

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

**1** This Ordinance may be cited as “ The Food and Drugs (Adulteration) Ordinance, 1930 ”, and shall come into operation upon such date as the Governor may by notice in the Gazette appoint

**2** In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires —

Interpretation

“ Food ” includes every article used for food or drink by man, other than drugs or water, and any article which ordinarily enters into or is used in the composition or preparation of human food and also includes flavouring matters and condiments

“ Drug ” includes medicine for internal or external use

“ Local authority ” means a local authority as defined by the Public Health (Amendment) Ordinance, 1928

No 22 of 1928

“ Public analyst ” means a person appointed by the Governor or by a local authority with the approval of the Governor to act in the capacity of analyst for the purposes of this Ordinance

“ Medical officer of health ” means a medical officer of health as defined by the Public Health Ordinance, and includes an assistant medical officer of health

Cap 124

“ Sanitary inspector ” includes any person for the time being lawfully acting in the capacity of a sanitary inspector

### PART I

#### GENERAL PROVISIONS

**3** (1) No person shall mix, colour, stain or powder or order or permit any other person to mix, colour, stain or powder—

Restrictions  
on mixing  
food and drugs  
with other  
ingredients

(a) any article of food with any ingredient or material so as to render the article injurious to health,

(b) any drug with any ingredient or material so as to affect injuriously the quality or potency of the drug,

with the intent that the article of food or drug may be sold in that state

(2) No person shall sell any article of food or drug so mixed, coloured, stained or powdered as aforesaid

(3) If any person contravenes any of the provisions of this section he shall be guilty of an offence

Provided that a person shall not be convicted under this section in respect of the sale of any article of food or of any drug if he shows to the satisfaction of the court before whom

he is charged that he did not know, and could not with reasonable diligence have ascertained that the article of food or drug sold by him was so mixed, coloured, stained or powdered as aforesaid

*Cap 124* (4) Where any regulations made under this Ordinance 5  
or under the Public Health Ordinance prohibit or restrict  
the addition of any preservative or other ingredient or material  
to any article of food, the addition of any such ingredient or  
material, if made in contravention of the regulations, shall  
for the purposes of this Ordinance be deemed to render the 10  
article injurious to health

**4** (1) No person shall sell to the prejudice of the  
purchaser any article of food or any drug which is not of  
the nature, or not of the substance, or not of the quality, of  
the article demanded by the purchaser 15

(2) If any person contravenes the provisions of this  
section he shall be guilty of an offence

Provided that an offence under this section shall not be  
deemed to have been committed—

(a) where any ingredient or material not injurious to 20  
health has been added to the article of food or drug  
because it is required for the production or prepara-  
tion thereof as an article of commerce in a state fit  
for carriage or consumption and not fraudulently to  
increase the bulk, weight or measure of the article 25  
of food or drug, or to conceal the inferior quality  
thereof,

(b) where the food or drug is the subject of a patent in  
force, and is supplied in the state required by the  
specification of the patent or is a proprietary 30  
medicine,

(c) where the food or drug is unavoidably mixed with  
some extraneous matter in the process of collection  
or preparation

(3) In any prosecution under this section it shall be no 35  
defence to allege that the purchaser, having bought only for  
analysis, is not prejudiced

*Cap 124* (4) Where any regulations made under this Ordinance  
or under the Public Health Ordinance prescribe the composi-  
tion of any article of food intended for sale, or prohibit or 40  
restrict the addition of any preservative or other ingredient  
or material to any such article, the purchaser of such article  
shall, unless the contrary is proved, be deemed for the  
purposes of this section to have demanded an article complying  
with the provisions of the regulations as regards the presence  
or amount of any constituent, ingredient or material specified 45  
in the regulations

**5** If any person sells any compound article of food, or  
any compounded drug which is not composed of ingredients  
in accordance with the demand of the purchaser, he shall be 50  
guilty of an offence

**6** (1) No person shall be guilty of any such offence as  
aforesaid in respect of the sale of an article of food or a drug  
mixed with any ingredient or material not injurious to health,  
and not intended fraudulently to increase its bulk, weight or

measure, or to conceal its inferior quality, if at the time of delivering the article of food or drug he supplies to the person receiving it a notice, by a label distinctly and legibly written or printed on or with the article or drug, to the effect that it  
5 is mixed

(2) For the purposes of this section, a label shall not be deemed to be distinctly and legibly written or printed if the notice of mixture given by the label is obscured by other matter on the label

10       **7** If any person abstracts from any article of food any part of it so as to affect injuriously its nature, substance or quality with the intent that it may be sold in its altered state without notice, or if any person sells any article so altered without making disclosure of the alteration, he shall be guilty  
15 of an offence

## PART II

### ADMINISTRATION

20       **8** (1) It shall be the duty of every local authority to put into force from time to time, as occasion may arise, and as may be, under their special circumstances, reasonably practicable, the powers with which they are invested so as to provide proper securities for the sale of food and drugs in a pure and genuine condition, and in particular to direct their officers to procure samples for analysis

Duty of local authority to enforce Ordinance

25       (2) If the Governor after communication with the local authority is of the opinion that the authority have failed to execute or enforce any of the provisions of this Ordinance in relation to any article of food and that their failure affects the general interests of the consumer, the Governor may by  
30 order empower an officer to execute and enforce these provisions or to procure the execution and enforcement thereof in relation to any article of food mentioned in the order

35       (3) The expenses incurred under any such order shall be recoverable by the Governor from the local authority and the amount so recovered shall be treated as expenses incurred by the authority under this Ordinance

40       **9** (1) Any medical officer of health, sanitary inspector, inspector of weights and measures or police officer, acting under the direction and at the cost of the local authority appointing him or charged with the execution of this Ordinance may purchase any sample of any food or drug and any such officer or inspector acting as aforesaid is in this Ordinance referred to as a "sampling officer"

Powers of sampling

45       (2) A sampling officer may take at the place of delivery any sample of any food in course of delivery to the purchaser or consignee in pursuance of any contract for the sale thereof to the purchaser or consignee

50       Provided that no sample of food other than milk shall be taken under this sub-section except upon the request or with the consent of the purchaser or consignee

55       (3) If any sampling officer applies to purchase any article of food or any drug exposed for sale or on sale by retail on any premises (including any street or open space of public resort), and tenders the price for the quantity which he requires for the purpose of analysis not being more than is reasonably requisite, and the person exposing the article or

drug for sale or having it for sale on the premises refuses to sell to the officer such quantity thereof as aforesaid, or if the seller or consignee or any person entrusted by him for the time being with the charge of any article of food of which a sampling officer is empowered to take a sample in course of delivery refuses to allow the officer to take the quantity which he requires for the purpose of analysis, the person so refusing shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding ten pounds 5

Provided that where any article of food or drug is exposed for sale in an unopened tin or package duly labelled, no person shall be required to sell it except in the unopened tin or package in which it is contained 10

**10** (1) Where a sampling officer procures a sample of food or of a drug, he shall, if he suspects the sample or the article from which the sample is taken to have been sold contrary to any provision of this Ordinance, or that the provisions of this Ordinance have otherwise been infringed with respect to that article, submit it to be analysed by the public analyst 15

(2) The public analyst shall as soon as practicable analyse any sample sent to him in pursuance of this Ordinance and shall give the sampling officer a certificate specifying the result of the analysis in the form set forth in the first schedule to this Ordinance, or a form to the like effect 20

**11** (1) Where a sampling officer procures a sample of any article with the intention of submitting it to analysis he shall, after the purchase has been completed, forthwith notify to the seller or his agent who sold the sample his intention to have it analysed by the public analyst and shall then and there divide the sample into three parts, each part to be marked and sealed or fastened up in such manner as its nature will permit, and shall— 25 30

(a) if required to do so deliver one part to the seller or his agent,

(b) retain one part for future comparison, 35

(c) if he thinks fit to have an analysis made submit one part to the analyst

(2) In the case of a sample taken of milk in course of delivery the person taking the sample shall, if the name and address of the consignee appear on the can, bottle or other receptacle containing the milk sampled, forward to him by registered parcel or otherwise a portion of the sample marked, and sealed, or fastened up 40

**12** The Director of Medical and Sanitary Services may, in relation to any matter appearing to him to affect the general interests of the consumer, and the Director of Agriculture may, in relation to any matter appearing to him to affect the general interests of agriculture in the Colony, or any other person who may be authorised by the Governor so to do may, direct an officer to procure for analysis samples of any article of food or any drug and thereupon the officer shall have all the powers of a sampling officer under this Ordinance and this Ordinance shall apply as if the officer were a sampling officer 45 50

**13** (1) The provisions of this Ordinance relating to the taking of samples, and proceedings in connection therewith, shall, in relation to milk, have effect subject to the provisions of the second schedule to this Ordinance 55



(2) So much of any contract as requires a purveyor of milk, on a sample of his milk being taken under this Ordinance, to send to the person from whom he procured the milk any part of such sample, or to give that person notice  
5 that a sample has been so taken, shall be void

(3) For the purpose of this section and the said schedule the expression "purveyor of milk" includes a seller of milk whether wholesale or by retail

10 **14** Any person who wilfully obstructs or impedes any inspector or other officer in the course of his duties or by any gratuity, bribe, promise, or other inducement prevents, or attempts to prevent the due execution by the inspector or officer of his duty under this Ordinance shall be guilty of an offence

### PART III

#### LEGAL PROCEEDINGS

**15** (1) Where a public analyst having analysed any article has given his certificate of the result from which it appears that an offence under this Ordinance has been committed,  
20 the sampling officer may take proceedings under this Ordinance before any magistrate having jurisdiction in the place where the article of food or drug sold was actually delivered to the purchaser or the sample taken

(2) A person found guilty of an offence for which no  
25 special penalty is imposed by this Ordinance shall be liable on conviction—

(a) in the case of a first offence to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds, and

(b) in the case of a second offence, to a fine not exceeding  
30 fifty pounds, and

(c) in the case of a subsequent offence, to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds, or if in the opinion of the court, the offence was committed by the  
35 the personal act, default, or culpable negligence of the person accused, and the court is of opinion that a fine will not meet the circumstances of the case, to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding three months

(3) In any prosecution under this Ordinance the sum-  
40 mons shall state the particulars of the offence or offences alleged and also the name of the prosecutor and shall not be made returnable in less than fourteen days from the date on which it is served

(4) In any prosecution under this Ordinance for selling  
45 any article of food or drug contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance, it shall be lawful for the prosecutor to proceed against the person who actually sold the article or against the person on whose behalf the article was sold or against both such persons

(5) Where an employer is charged with an offence under  
50 this Ordinance he shall be entitled upon information duly laid by him to have any other person whom he charges as the actual offender brought before the court at the time appointed for hearing the charge, and if, after the commission  
55 of the offence has been proved, the employer proves to the satisfaction of the court that he had used due diligence to

enforce the execution of this Ordinance and that the said other person had committed the offence in question without his knowledge, consent or connivance, the said other person shall be summarily convicted of the offence and the employer shall be exempt from any penalty 5

**16.** (1) Where a certificate of analysis has been obtained on behalf of a prosecutor, a copy thereof shall be served with the summons

(2) Where a certificate of analysis is intended to be produced by a defendant, a copy thereof shall be sent to the prosecutor at least three clear days before the day appointed for hearing the case 10

(3) In any proceedings for an offence under the foregoing provisions of this Ordinance, the production by one of the parties of a certificate of a public analyst in the form prescribed by this Ordinance shall be sufficient evidence of the facts stated therein unless the other party requires that the analyst shall be called as a witness 15

(4) In any proceedings under this Ordinance the part of the sample retained by the sampling officer who procured it shall be produced at the hearing 20

**17** (1) Subject to the provisions of this section, a defendant shall be discharged from the prosecution if he proves to the satisfaction of the court in respect of the sale of an article, that he had purchased the article in question as the same in nature, substance and quality as that demanded of him by the person to whom he sold the article, and with a written warranty to that effect, and that he had no reason to believe at the time he sold it that it was otherwise, and that he sold the article in the same state as when he purchased it 25 30

(2) A warranty or invoice shall only be a defence to proceedings under this Ordinance if—

(a) the defendant has within seven days of the service of the summons sent to the prosecutor a copy of the warranty or invoice with a written notice stating that he intends to rely on it and specifying the name and address of the person from whom he received it and has also sent a like notice of his intention to that person, and 35 40

(b) in the case of a warranty or invoice given by a person resident outside the Colony the defendant proves that he had taken reasonable steps to ascertain, and did in fact believe in, the accuracy of the statement contained therein 45

(3) The person by whom the warranty or invoice is alleged to have been given shall be entitled to appear at the hearing and to give evidence and the court may, if it thinks fit, adjourn the hearing to enable him to do so

(4) Where the defendant is the servant of the person who purchased the article under a warranty or invoice, he shall be entitled to rely on the provisions of this section in the same way as his employer would have been entitled to do if he had been the defendant, provided that the servant further proves that he had no reason to believe that the article was otherwise than that demanded by the prosecutor 50 55

**18** (1) Every person who wilfully applies to an article of food, or drug, in any proceedings under this Ordinance, a certificate or warranty given in relation to any other article of food or drug, or who wilfully gives a label with any article of food or drug sold by him which falsely describes the article sold, shall be guilty of an offence

(2) Every person who, in respect of an article of food or drug sold by him as principal or agent, gives to the purchaser a false warranty in writing, shall be guilty of an offence, unless he proves to the satisfaction of the court that when he gave the warranty he had reason to believe that the statement or description contained therein was true

(3) Where the defendant in a prosecution under this Ordinance has been discharged under the provisions of this section for giving the warranty relied on by the defendant in the prosecution may be taken as well before a court having jurisdiction in the place where the article of food or drug to which the warranty relates was purchased for analysis as before a court having jurisdiction in the place where the warranty was given

## SECOND SCHEDULE

## SPECIAL PROVISIONS AS TO MILK

1 Where a sample of milk is procured from a purveyor of milk, he shall, on being required to do so by the person by whom or on whose behalf the sample was taken state the name and address of the seller or consignee from whom he received the milk

2 The local authority in whose district the sample was taken, may take or cause to be taken one or more samples of milk in course of transit or delivery from such seller or consignee

Within sixty hours after the sample of milk was procured from the purveyor he may serve on the local authority a notice stating the name and address of the seller from whom he received the milk and the time and place of delivery to

the purveyor by the seller or consignor of milk from a corresponding milking, and requesting them to take immediate steps to procure, as soon as practicable, a sample of milk in the course of transit or delivery from the seller or consignor to the purveyor, unless a sample has been so taken since the sample was procured from the purveyor, or within twenty-four hours prior to the sample being procured from the purveyor

Provided that the purveyor shall not have any such right to require that such a sample shall be taken in cases where the milk from which the sample procured from the purveyor was taken was a mixture of milk obtained by the purveyor from more than one seller or consignor

If a purveyor has served on the local authority such a notice as aforesaid, and the local authority have not procured a sample of milk from the seller or consignor in accordance with the foregoing provisions, no proceedings under this Ordinance shall be taken against the purveyor in respect of the sample of milk procured from him

3 Any sample of milk so taken in the course of transit or delivery shall be submitted for analysis to the analyst to whom the sample procured from the purveyor is or was submitted

4 If proceedings are taken against the purveyor of milk, a copy of the certificate of the result of the analysis of every sample so taken in the course of transit or delivery shall be furnished to the purveyor and every such certificate shall, subject to the provisions of section 16 of this Ordinance, be sufficient evidence of the fact stated therein, and shall be admissible as evidence on any question whether the milk sold by the purveyor was sold in the same state as he purchased it

5 The local authority of the district in which the first-mentioned sample was taken may, instead of, or in addition to, taking proceedings against the purveyor of milk, take proceedings against the seller or consignor

6 If a sample of milk of cows in any dairy is taken in course of transit or delivery from that dairy, the owner of the cows may, within sixty hours after the sample of milk was procured, serve on the local authority a notice requesting them to take immediate steps to procure as soon as practicable a sample of milk from a corresponding milking of the cows, and the foregoing provisions shall apply accordingly

Provided that the person taking the sample shall be empowered to take any such steps at the dairy as may be necessary to satisfy him that the sample is a fair sample of the milk of the cows when properly and fully milked

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#### OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of the Bill is to prevent the adulteration of articles of food and drugs with ingredients and materials of an inferior nature and the fraudulent sale of such articles to the prejudice of the consumer

The provisions of the Bill closely resemble those of the Food and Drugs (Adulteration) Act, 1928, of the United Kingdom

The Bill restricts the mixing of food and drugs and prohibits the sale of articles not of the nature, substance and quality demanded

It confers powers and duties for the enforcement of its provisions on local authorities and details the duties of sampling officers and procedure to be followed in the taking of samples and their submission for analysis. Provision is made for the making of regulations prescribing standards of quality in regard to foods the constituents of which are liable to variation

1 Owners of maize and/or wheat to be conditioned should notify the Grader and Inspector, Department of Agriculture, Kilindini, giving full particulars as to the number of bags to be conditioned, kind of conditioning required, and date of shipment, prior to delivery at the Conditioning Plant

2 Maize and/or wheat will be delivered to the Conditioning Plant through the Uganda Railway only. Owners must supply any new bags found necessary on re bagging. Such bags must be of the kind prescribed by the Maize and/or Wheat Grading Rules for the time being in force

## 3 Charges —

(a) For maize and/or wheat, which has been rejected in the process of grading at Kilindini Pier or Mbaraki and is received for treatment at the Plant, a charge of 60 cents per bag will be made

(b) A charge of 50 cents per bag will be made on all maize and/or wheat consigned direct from up country stations to the Conditioning Plant, provided however that the Chief Grader and Inspector shall give preference to maize and/or wheat rejected in the process of grading at Kilindini Pier or Mbaraki, and sent to the Plant for conditioning

4 In addition to the charges laid down in Rule 3 above, the following charges will be made by the Uganda Railway —

(a) For maize and/or wheat rejected by the Inspector at Kilindini Pier or Mbaraki, a charge of 15 cents per bag will be made. This charge will include handling from grading sheds into truck, haulage of truck to the Conditioning Plant, haulage back to the grading sheds, and handling into grading sheds

(b) For maize and/or wheat delivered direct to the Conditioning Plant from up country stations, a charge of 5 cents per bag will be made for haulage to and from the Conditioning Plant

5 All charges, both for conditioning and handling, shall be payable to the Inspector before delivery of the maize and/or wheat from the Conditioning Plant. The Agricultural Department may sell such quantity of the maize and/or wheat by auction as is calculated to be sufficient to meet all charges due to it and to the Uganda Railway for conditioning services

6 After conditioning of the maize and/or wheat, the Agricultural Department may deliver the maize and/or wheat so conditioned to the Uganda Railway for storage pending export

## LOCUST REPORT TO 8TH JANUARY, 1930

Hoppers in infested districts are fast reaching the stage prior to flying

## HOPPER AREAS

*Northern Frontier Province*—Work is now progressing, but it is considered that owing to the vast arid waterless nature of the country some locust swarms will come to maturity

*Meru*—Two Locust Officers are working in the Tharaka area

*Kitui*—Owing to the improvement in transport and road conditions, less difficulty is now being experienced to maintain an adequate supply of bran bait in the district. Even where the vegetation is of the most luscious nature the hoppers eat the bran bait readily, and great destruction is being done. The infestations at Kampi-ya-Faro, Katse, Mivukoni, Tsekuro and Nditani are now under control

*Embu*—In order to hasten and facilitate operations another Locust Officer has been transferred to this district. The heaviest infestation is now in the vicinity of Matongo River

*Voi*—The locust train is operating daily between Voi and Tsavo, and many small bands of hoppers have been destroyed. The country between Machakos and Voi has been scouted, no hoppers were found except in close proximity to Voi itself

*S Masai and Taveta*—No hoppers have as yet appeared, and more intense scouting indicates that few, if any, may be expected

Farmers in the Machakos area, and natives in Meru and Embu and Ukamba Province generally should prepare fire heaps for smoking, in order to ward off any threatening swarm. Swarms of flying locusts are expected to be of restricted dimensions, and if efforts are made losses should at the most be slight

The extent to which anti-hopper operations have been hampered by bad weather and broken communications is emphasised especially in the Meru District, and the Northern Frontier where transport has been delayed from two to three weeks. Disease in hoppers has been reported from every hopper area. Flocks of Greater Locust Buds are gathering in Meru and Kitui, presumably in readiness for flying swarms

## AUCTION OF FARMS

## CONDITIONS OF SALE

- 1 Each farm will be auctioned separately.
- 2 With the exception of subdivisions of L.R. Nos. 1596 and 1597, Kibos, these farms are in the Highlands. Except for the aforementioned subdivisions, the purchase will be confined to Europeans only (or their accredited agents), in conformity with the decision of His Majesty's Government.

(Shs 110) and the stamp duty payable in respect of the grant and all other expenses, if any, shall be paid to the Surveyor General, Nairobi, all the amounts to be paid within seven days from the date of the sale, and upon such payments being duly made the purchaser shall, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140, Revised Edition) and of the Conditions of Sale having been complied with, be entitled to a grant of the plot, which grant shall be presented to him duly executed as soon as conveniently may be. Provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the time stated or thereafter unless and until the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement can present to the purchaser the grant duly executed.

7 Subject to the proviso contained in Condition No 6, if the amounts therein mentioned are not paid as therein laid down within seven days from the date of sale, the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited, and the purchaser shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

## (b) GENERAL

- 1 The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantees shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.
- 2 No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings) drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the Authority, and by the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement or such other person as he may appoint. 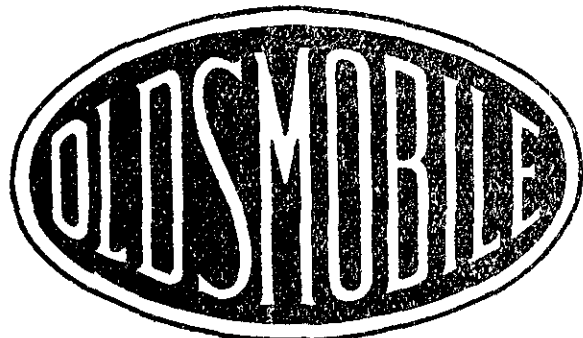

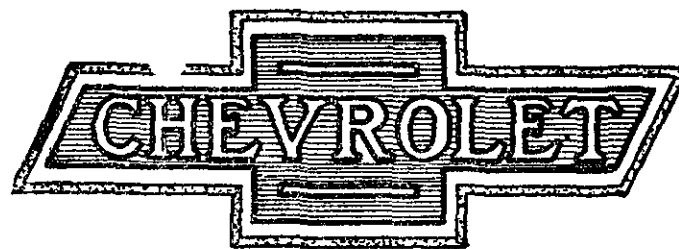
