## RINDERPEST

An area in the Thika, Punda Mili and Makuyu Districts, bounded by a line commencing at the junction of the Ndarugu and Athi River,

thence following the latter river up-stream to its intersection with the eastern boundary of the Kiambu Native Reserve,

thence along the eastern boundary of the Kiambu Native Reserve in a generally north easterly direction to the point where that boundary meets the Chama River,

thence following the latter river down-stream to the western corner of Farm L R No 2955/1/1,

thence in a north easterly and easterly direction by the generally easterly boundary of the Fort Hall Native Reserve to the point where that boundary meets the western boundary of the Fort Hall Road Reserve,

thence in a northerly direction following the western boundary of the Fort Hall Road Reserve to the point where that boundary meets the Maragua River,

thence following the latter river down-stream to its junction with the Tana River,

## GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 23

## THE TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE

## RULES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Townships Ordinance (Chapter 82 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules —

1 These Rules may be cited as “ the Thika Township Rules, 1930,” and shall apply to the Township of Thika

2 In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires —

“ local authority ” means the administrative officer in charge of the Township of Thika,

“ native ” includes a native of the Comoro Island and a native of Madagascar,

“ night ” means the interval between nine o'clock in the evening and six o'clock in the morning of the next succeeding day,

“ nuisance ” includes any accumulation or deposit of domestic refuse whether the same shall be detrimental to health or not

*Dustbins*

3 The occupier of any building or premises shall provide and maintain to the satisfaction of the local authority or Medical Officer of Health a receptacle for ashes and other non-liquid domestic refuse of a sufficient size, of a capacity not more in any case than 6 cubic feet, of an approved pattern and fitted with a good and efficient lid. Provided that in the case of any house occupied by more tenants than one, the owner shall be deemed to be the occupier for the purposes of Rules 3-6

4 The occupier of any building or premises shall daily cause to be placed within the dustbin provided in terms of the foregoing Rule the domestic refuse from the said building or premises in so far as such dustbin shall be sufficient to contain the same, and not elsewhere, and shall cause such dustbin to be placed and kept in an approved place on the plot or sub-plot upon which such building or premises stand and shall not cause or suffer the same to be placed or kept elsewhere and shall make and keep such dustbin accessible to the public sweepers during the whole period between 6 a m and 2 p m on Saturdays and between 6 a m and 5 p m, on other days. For the purpose of this Rule premises not occupied for human habitation shall not be deemed to be occupied on any day in which they are not actually occupied after the hour of 4 p m

5 If any nuisance shall exist upon or near any premises, by reason of domestic refuse, the local authority or Medical Officer of Health, or person acting on his behalf shall serve upon the occupier of such premises a notice in writing requiring him to remove the nuisance within such period as may be specified in the notice, and to prevent its recurrence, and if, after the expiry of the time specified in such notice

as aforesaid, such nuisance shall continue or shall, by the act, default or sufferance of the person upon whom such notice shall have been served, recur, then in either of such cases such person shall, be guilty of an offence

6 If there shall be any accumulation or deposit of any trade refuse upon or near any premises used or occupied by any person or used or occupied by any person for or on behalf of any such person as aforesaid for the purposes of any trade or business whatsoever, which shall, in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health or a person deputed by him be or is likely or calculated to be injurious to health, then and in any of such cases the local authority or Medical Officer of Health or other person acting on his behalf shall serve upon the person using or occupying the said premises, or upon the person using or occupying the said premises for or on behalf of such person as aforesaid, a notice requiring him or them to remove the said accumulation or deposit within such period as may be specified in the notice, and to prevent the recurrence of such accumulation or deposit, and if after the expiry of the time specified in the said notice as aforesaid, such accumulation or deposit shall not be removed or, by the act, default or sufferance of the person so using or occupying the said premises as aforesaid or of the person using or occupying the said premises on his behalf as aforesaid shall recur then in either of such cases, such person shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence

#### *Latrines*

7 Every owner of a house or building used as a dwelling or otherwise shall provide such house or building with proper and sufficient pail-closets and pails to the satisfaction of the local authority, and any owner who, on notice from the local authority, fails to supply the same within the period prescribed in the notice shall be guilty of an offence, provided that any earth-closet inside a building shall not be deemed to be a sufficient compliance with this Rule. The occupier of such building shall provide a proper and sufficient supply of earth, sand, ashes or disinfectants for use in such pail-closets to the satisfaction of the Medical Officer of Health

8 The Medical Officer of Health or Sanitary Inspector or any authorised Government servant may enter upon any premises and examine any pail-closet, waste-water tank, refuse receptacle or cesspool, and any sink, pipe or other works or apparatus in connexion therewith for the purpose of ascertaining the compliance with Rules 7-15

9 The owner of every well, tank or cistern shall cleanse the same once in every year to the satisfaction of the local authority and, in addition at any time that the local authority may deem necessary for purpose of health

10 The local authority may condemn any latrine, earth-closet, cesspool, urinal or privy on or within any premises and may call upon the owner thereof by notice to reconstruct such latrine, earth-closet, cesspool, urinal or privy according to a plan approved by the local authority within the time specified in the said notice. If the said owner fails to comply with any of the terms of the said notice he shall be guilty of an offence

11 No latrine, earth-closet, urinal or privy that has been condemned by the local authority shall be used until such

time as the local authority certifies that the same has been reconstructed to his satisfaction, and the occupier of any premises upon which any latrine, earth-closet, urinal or privy has been used in contravention of this Rule shall be guilty of an offence

12 Any person on whose premises there is any escape of night soil or urine from any latrine, closet, or privy shall be guilty of an offence

13 Any person who is guilty of digging or constructing any hole for the reception of night soil, urine, dirty water or rubbish of any description, except as authorised under these Rules or by written permission of the local authority, or of throwing any foul matter or thing or dirty water or allowing any such foul matter or thing or dirty water to flow on to any yard, plot, street, footpath or public place or into any drain not constructed for the purpose of receiving such foul matter or thing or dirty water shall be guilty of an offence

14 The local authority may for purposes of health serve a notice upon the owner or occupier of any premises to cause the same to be limewashed or otherwise cleansed or disinfected and should the said owner or occupier fail to comply with any of the terms of the said notice he shall be guilty of an offence and the local authority may enter upon the said premises and cause such acts to be performed as specified in the notice and recover the costs of the same from the same owner or occupier

15 Every person causing any house, building or work to be erected, altered or demolished shall, if so required by the local authority, forthwith erect in an approved position and thereafter maintain for such time as workmen are engaged thereon good and sufficient latrine accommodation for such workmen, to the satisfaction of the local authority who may order pail-closets and pails with proper supply of earth, sand, ashes, or disinfectants to be provided by such person notwithstanding that conservancy fees may be exigible in respect thereof, and every person who causes any such erection, alteration or demolition to be begun without having erected latrine accommodation as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence

#### *Congregation of Natives*

16 Every native who—

- (a) not being a servant housed therein by his or her employer or the husband, wife or child of such servant, is found or remains by day or by night, in or upon any house, tent, warehouse, coach-house, garage, stable, outhouse, yard, garden or other premises without the written consent of the owner or occupier of such house, tent, warehouse, coach-house, garage, stable, outhouse, yard, garden or other premises, or without other lawful excuse (the proof whereof shall be on such native),
- (b) without valid excuse, the proof whereof shall be on such native, is found lying, wandering or loitering in any highway yard or other place during the night, or is found wandering abroad and/or lodging in any barn or outhouse or in any deserted or unoccupied building or in the open air or under a tent or in any cart or wagon



(c) is found by night having in his possession without lawful excuse (the proof whereof shall be on such native) any dangerous or offensive weapon, firearm or instrument, or any key, picklock, crowbar, jemmy, jack, bit or other implement of housebreaking, or having his or her face disguised,

(d) remains within the Township of Thika for a longer period than forty-eight hours without employment (the proof whereof shall be on such native) provided that the provisions of this sub-paragraph shall not apply to any native who is in possession of a valid permit to reside in the Township of Thika issued by the local authority, and provided that the said local authority may issue to any native showing good or sufficient cause a permit in the form of Schedule I hereto, and such permit shall constitute the authority of such native to reside within the Township of Thika for the period stated on such permit,

and every person wilfully aiding or wilfully assisting such native aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence

17 Any police officer may take into custody without warrant any person found or reasonably suspected of committing or attempting to commit or wilfully aiding or wilfully assisting any native to commit any offence against these Rules

18 When there is reasonable cause for so doing, any European police officer of or above the rank of Assistant Inspector, or any police officer authorised in writing by him, may enter any house, tent, warehouse, coach-house, stable, outhouse, yard, garden or other premises at any time to ensure that the provisions of these Rules are being complied with

#### *Fees*

19 The fees mentioned in Schedule II shall be levied in the Township of Thika

20 Schedule II of the Thika Township Rules, appearing on page 672 of the Revised Subsidiary Legislation, is hereby revoked

## REVISION OF CUSTOMS TARIFF

## NOTICE

IT is hereby notified for public information that at the Governors' Conference held at Nairobi on 7th January, 1930, the following resolution was adopted —

That a Customs Tariff Revision Committee be appointed at once with the following terms of reference —

(1) To examine in detail the existing Customs Tariff common to Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika Territory in the light of experience gained of its operation during the past six years and to recommend such alterations as may be deemed necessary in the mutual interests of all concerned, subject to the proviso that no serious diminution in the revenue accruing to the several territories is entailed and that the duties on articles specially protected through the medium of the Customs Tariff are outside the scope of this inquiry

(2) To examine in particular the following matters, namely—

(a) the specific rates of duty under Table I of the Tariff in the light of current prices as compared with those ruling in 1923 when the existing tariff was framed,

(b) the duty imposed on vehicles and parts and accessories thereof, with special reference to motor trucks, speed wagons, delivery vans, and parts and accessories thereof,

(c) the duty on proprietary medicines and other items over which difficulties of interpretation have been experienced,

(d) any alteration or modification in the tariff which may from time to time have been suggested to the several administrations or which may be submitted to the Committee either by memorandum or by oral evidence

(3) To take oral evidence at such centres as may be considered to be desirable

(4) To examine the possibility of formation of a permanent Inter-Colonial Tariff Board and to make recommendations in regard to the personnel of such a Board and the scope of its activities

## LOCUST REPORT TO 15 1 30

Reports now indicate that swarms of young fliers are appearing in infested districts but that they are not as yet leaving the areas where hoppers remain. They are being successfully baited with the hopper bands.

Some fear is now entertained as to what the locust position is in the inaccessible parts of the Sankuni District, where it is impossible to carry out any method of hopper destruction on an economical scale. It is probable that flying swarms will emanate from this area.

## HOPPER AREAS

*Northern Frontier Province*—The evacuation of stores and equipment has commenced as all hoppers not destroyed have reached the flying stage. Swarms of young fliers are reported from near Isiolo, 30 miles north of Archer's Post, and also east of Maissabit. All are flying south.

*Meru*—No report.

*Embu*—There has been a large concentration of hoppers and young fliers on both banks of the Matongo River. Intensive operations are taking place here, and great destruction is being carried out.

*Kitui*—All swarms now consist of 4th stage hoppers and young fliers. Further large bands of hoppers have been discovered at Ngazzi and Nuui, and local staff is being transferred to deal with them.

*Voi*—The locust train has destroyed hoppers the whole way from mile 107 to Ndi, and from Tsavo to Kiani, with the result that no delay in railway traffic has occurred.

Hoppers are for the most part in the last stage before flight. Fresh bands continue to appear out of the thick bush and to concentrate on bare patches of ground where baiting operations are taking place.

Farmers in the Machakos District, and the natives in the eastern reserves of the Colony are again warned to expect swarms of locusts by the end of this month. Smudge fires should be prepared round all crops. Swarms may also appear over Nanyuki and the N. Nyeri District generally, so that similar precautionary measures should also be taken in that area.

## AUCTION OF FARMS

THE grants of the farms specified in the Schedule hereto, will, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140 of the Revised Laws of Kenya) be offered for sale at the Railway Club, Nairobi, commencing at 10 a.m., on Monday, the 31st March 1930. Plans of the farms may be seen at the Public Map Office, Survey and Registration Department, Nairobi, or may be had on application to the Surveyor General on payment of Shs 3, post free, in respect of each plan required.

The right to withdraw any farm from the auction is reserved to the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement.

## CONDITIONS OF SALE

1 Each farm will be auctioned separately.

2 With the exception of subdivisions of L.R. Nos. 1596 and 1597, Kibos, these farms are in the Highlands. Except for the aforementioned subdivisions, the purchase will be confined to Europeans only (or their accredited agents), in conformity with the decision of His Majesty's Government.

3 The highest bidder will be the purchaser, and if any dispute arise as to any bidding, the farm will be put up again at the last undisputed bid.

4 The amount of the advance of each bid will be regulated by the auctioneer, and no bid shall be retracted.

Provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the time stated or thereafter unless and until the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement can present to the purchaser the grant duly executed.

7 Subject to the proviso contained in Condition No 6, if the amounts therein mentioned are not paid as therein laid down within seven days from the date of sale the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited, and the purchaser shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

## (b) GENERAL

1 The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantees shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

2 No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings) drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the Authority, and by the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement or such other person as he may appoint. building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick, concrete or wood and iron, on proper foundations

4 If at any time during the term of the grant a main building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick, or concrete on proper foundations be erected on any plot, the grantee shall be entitled to an extension of the term of the grant to 99 years from the 1st March, 1930

5 Verandahs may be erected within a road reserve with the previous consent of the Authority, and must conform to a building line decided upon by such Authority
