A Bill to Amend the Local Government (Rating) Ordinance, 1928.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

This Ordinance may be cited as "the Local Govern-Short title ment (Rating) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1930," and shall be lead as one with the Local Government (Rating) Ordinance, 1928, heremafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance"

Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended Addition of 5 by the addition thereto at the end thereof of the following section 5 of proviso ---

the Principal Ordinance

"Provided that in the case of the first valuation roll prepared for any local authority the Commissioner for Local Government may by certificate under his hand declare that the value of any improvements as required to be shown by paragraph (e) of this section need not be included in such valuation roll and such valuation roll shall be deemed to be a valid and proper valuation roll notwithstanding that it does not contain a valuation of such improvements "

OBJECTS AND REASONS

Section 5 (e) of the Local Government (Rating) Ordinance, 1928, requires that a valuation roll must contain a valuation of improvements

In practice both in Nanobi and Mombasa it has been found impossible to complete the valuation of improvements within the time anticipated and a similar position may arise elsewhere It is, therefore, proposed to amend the Ordinance so as to provide that the first valuation roll prepared under section 5 may be certified to be a valid and proper valuation roll notwithstanding that it does not contain a valuation of *improvements*

 - "(5) No person shall import into the Colony any rifle with a bore of 303 or its ammunition, unless such rifle has been previously registered under these Rules, without the express sanction of the Governor

Provided that the provisions of this sub-rule shall not apply to rifles using 303 rimless cartridges and their ammunition "

RULES OF COURT MADE BY THE CHIEF JUSTICE UNDER SECTION 63 OF THE TRUSTEE ORDINANCE, 1929

- 1 These Rules may be cited as "the Rules of Court (Trustee Ordinance, 1929) No 1 of 1930"
- 2 Except as hereinafter in these Rules or by Ordinance otherwise provided all applications to His Majesty's Supreme Court of Kenya (hereinafter referred to as "the Court") under the Trustee Ordinance 1929 (hereinafter referred to as "the Ordinance") or amendments thereto shall be by originating summons, except where the application is made in a pending matter when an ordinary summon is sufficient
- 3 Every such summons shall be intituled "in the matter of the Will, Settlement, Trust, or Property" as the case may be, to which the summon relates, and in the matter of the Trustee Ordinance 1929 (and any amendments thereto) and in the body thereof shall specify the particular section or sections of the Ordinance or Ordinances under which relief is sought
- 4 An order under the Ordinance for the appointment of a new trustee or concerning any interest in land, stock, or thing in action subject to a trust may be made on the application of any person beneficially interested in the land, stock, or thing in action whether under disability or not or on the application of any person duly appointed trustee thereof
- 5 Where a trustee or other person desires to make a lodgment in Court under the Ordinance he shall make and file an affidavit intituled in the matter of the trust (described so as to be distinguishable) and of the Ordinance and setting forth
 - (a) A short description of the trust and of the instrument creating it
 - (b) The names of the persons interested in and entitled to the money or securities and their places of residence to the best of his knowledge and belief
 - (c) His submission to answer all such enquiries relating to the application of the money or securities paid into Court as the Court may make or direct
 - (d) The place where he is to be served with any petition, summons, or order or notice of any proceedings relating to the money or securities
- 6 The person who has made the lodgment shall forth-with give notice thereof by prepaid registered letter to the several persons whose names and places of residence are stated in his affidavit as interested in or entitled to the money or securities lodged in Court or in such other manner as the Court may direct
- 7 No petition or summons relating to the money or scenific, shall be answered or issued unless the petitioner or applicant has named therein an address for service within the jurisdiction of the Court

- 8 Service of any application under the Ordinance shall be made on such persons as the Court may duect
- 9 The Court fees payable on proceedings under the Ordinance shall be the same as those payable under Rules of Court for the time being in force relating to fees payable in the Supreme Court

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

LOCUST REPORT TO 29-1-30

With the exception of the Voi District, there are now no hopper areas in the Colony, and the Locust Staff has been greatly reduced

Northern Frontier Province—Two swarms of young flying locusts are reported from Isiolo, flying south-west. The swarms are thin, and followed by numerous birds. They are reported to be continuing movement towards. Baringo

Meru -- No fliers reported

Embu—All staff withdrawn A few small swarms of young fliers have entered the district from Tharaka These have moved along the face of Mt Kenya to Kenuguya, presumably on account of run between Kitui and Thika, preventing a southerly movement which had commenced

Kitui—The last Locust Officer left this district on the 27th January He reports the presence near Ukazı of a medium flying swarm which has not as vet taken any direction of flight

Rumunuti—The District Commissioner reports a swarm of pink lousts in the Arabel Valley and at Lariak, which has come from the north

Voi —Flying locusts in thin streams have been observed moving in a south-easterly direction Complete destruction will not be effected in this area and further swarms will arise, although operations continue

All indications point to a minimum of damage being done by escapes, and the situation gives little cause for anxiety
