THE ROADS PROTECTION ORDINANCE, 1924

ORDER

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Roads Protection Ordinance, 1924, His Excellency the Governor has, with the concurrence of the Naivasha District Council, being the local authority within the meaning of the said section, been pleased to order that the constructed and cambered carriage way on the roads described in the Schedule hereto shall be closed to all traffic except the following —

- (a) Pedal cycles
- (b) motor cycles, with or without sidecar attachments,
- (c) light buckboards or carts designed for carrying passengers only,
- (d) motor vehicles fitted with pneumatic tyres and not exceeding $6\frac{1}{2}$ tons gross weight

and that all other vehicles shall use those portions of the said roads which have been made for use by wagons

THE KENYA AND UGANDA RAILWAYS AND HARBOURS ASIAN SERVANTS GRATUITY REGULATIONS, 1929

REGULATIONS

IN EXERCISE of the power conferred upon him by Article 7 (c) of the Kenya and Uganda (Transport) Orders in Council, 1925 and 1927, His Excellency the High Commissioner for Transport for the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya and the Protectorate of Uganda has been pleased to make the following Regulations —

These Regulations may be cited as "The Kenya and Uganda Railways and Haibouis Asian Servants Gratuity Regulations, 1929" and shall be deemed to be part of and shall be read as one with the Uganda Railway Provident Fund Rules, dated 1st June, 1914

- 1 Subject to these Regulations, the General Manager may at his discretion grant to an Asian servant on retirement a gratuity from revenue for efficient, faithful and continuous service, or in the event of the death of a servant grant a gratuity to his dependents as provided in Regulation 10
- 2 Only Asian servants who, at the time of retirement or death, are contributors to the Provident Fund shall be eligible for a gratuity under these Regulations
- 3 A gratuity may be granted under one of the following conditions
 - (a) Returement on completion of twenty-five years' service, or
 - (b) retirement by the General Manager after fifteen vears service, or
 - (c) retirement with less than fifteen years' service due to—
 - (1) permanent physical or mental incapacity not due to the servant's own misconduct and certified by a medical board, or
 - (11) letlenchment, or
 - (111) death, if still in the eniployment of the High Commissioner at the time of death,
 - (d) retirement on attainment of the age of fifty years after not less than ten years' service
- 4 For the purpose of these Regulations leave of absence if on pay shall be regarded as qualifying service towards a gratuity, but leave of absence without pay shall not be so regarded
- 5 Service for gratuity shall be deemed to commence from the date upon which a servant entered the employ of the High Commissioner

- 6 A break in the service of a servant may, at the discretion of the General Manager, be disregarded for the purpose of computing qualifying service towards a gratuity, subject to the following provisions
 - (a) That a break of three years has the effect of excluding all previous service
 - (b) That if at any time the breaks in service aggregate seven years all previous service shall be excluded
- 7 The amount of gratuity payable shall be computed in the following manner
 - (a) In cases falling under Regulation 3 (a), (b), and (d), half a month's pay for each year of qualifying service, provided that no gratuity shall be granted in respect of any year over thirty years service
 - (b) In cases falling under Regulation 3 (c), a gratuity limited ordinarily to half a month's pay for each year of qualifying service, but in special cases, of which the General Manager shall be sole judge, a gratuity of not more than one month's pay for each year of qualifying service subject to a maximum of twelve months' may be granted
- 8 For the purpose of Regulation 7, "pay" means monthly substantive pay and personal allowance at the time of retirement or death and does not include any other allowances whatever, provided that in the case of running staff drawing pay and allowances and not consolidated pay, the gratuity payable shall be one-and-a-half times that payable under Regulation 7 (a) and (b)

In cases of servants whose salaries were adjusted in accordance with Special Notice 698, issued by the General Manager on the 20th October, 1923, gratuities on retirement will be calculated on the salary drawn prior to adjustment if such salary was higher than the salary on completion of service, except in cases where, subsequent to regrading, there has been a reduction of salary, or stoppage of increment for misconduct, or methorency, or other causes not connected with adjustments of salary, under the Special Notice referred to

- 9 Any gratuity which may be granted ordinarily shall be payable on final retirement or transfer from the Service, but at the discretion of the General Manager may be paid before the exprise of any leave granted to a servant immediately prior to the date of his actual retirement
- 10 In the event of a servant dying while in the Service, any gratuity which may be payable under these Regulations may be paid wholly or in part to his widow or children or other member of the deceased's family dependent upon him at the time of his death at the entire discretion of the General Manager and in such proportion as he may think fit
- 11 A granuity cannot be attached by courts of law, but any moneys due by the servant to the High Commissioner may be deducted therefrom. This applies also to a gratuity which may be payable under Regulation 10
- 12 These Regulations shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of January, 1929

A servant employed at the date of the commencement of these Regulations, whose service would render him eligible in due course for a gratuity under the Provident Fund Rules in force previous hereto, may elect to remain a contibutor to such fund subject to such rules or to these Regulation. Notice of such election, which shall be irrevocable, must be forwarded to the Chief Accountant within six months of the date upon which these Regulations are published. If notification is not received within the specified period the servant will be subject to these Regulations, which shall apply to all servants of the High Commissioner eligible for a gratuity engaged subsequent to the date of the publication hereof

LOCUST REPORT FOR THE TWO WEEKS ENDING 19rh February, 1930

Anti-hopper operations in the Colony were finally terminated by 12th February, and the Locust Staff reduced to a minimum. The campaign at Voi closed down on the 10th February, after an additional 300 acres of hoppers and young fliers had been destroyed by means of bran bart. A few scattered swarms escaped and flew in a southerly direction

FLYING SWARMS

Nyen —A pink swarm was reported two miles north of Nveri by Flight Lieut Swoffer, of Wilson Anways, on 13th February The swarm was dense in places, but was for the most part thin Its length was between 3 and 4 miles, and it was flying in a north-westerly direction towards Naivo Moru

Thiha -A small swarm of locusts entered this district on 15th February, and is considered to be the same swarm as that reported earlier in the week on Manbre Estates, Ruiru

Machahos -On 10th February, a swarm of locusts passed up the Kilungu Valley, travelling north-west, another swaim, after spending the night at Kiteta and Lower Mboom, passed down the Kalama Valley, going south, on 11th February Both these swarms have emanated from the maccessible regions of the Kitui District

Voi -- Thin swaring of locusts are reported as having passed over this district for several days, all flying in a south-westerly direction

 W_{ϵ} , t = Suh —Reports from travellers on the Lodwar Kitale road indicate the presence of several swainis in this district

As a whole, there are very few locust swarms in the Colony, and as yet no reports of damage to crops have been received by the Department

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India To all to whom these Presents shall come Greeting

WHEREAS We did, by Royal Wairant under Our Sign Manual, dated 31d June, 1918, institute and create two decorations designated the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Air Force Cross, and two medals designated the Distinguished Flying Medal and the Air Force Medal to be awarded to Officers and Airmen in Our Air Force and in the Air Forces of Our Self-governing Dominions beyond the Seas in recognition of acts of valour, courage and devotion to duty, and did make regulations governing the said decorations and medals

AND WHEREAS the said Royal Waiiant was subsequently amended by Royal Waiiants dated 24th July, 1919, 27th August, 1919, and 20th April, 1921

AND WHEREAS We deem it expedient that the said Royal Wairant dated the 3rd June, 1918, with the amendments aforesaid and those now promulgated shall be incorporated in a Royal Wairant under Our Sign Manual

NOW THEREFORE We do by these Presents for Us, Our Hens and Successors, ordain that the following regulations shall be substituted for those promulgated in the said Royal Warrant dated 3rd June, 1918, as amended by subsequent Royal Warrants and We do hereby direct that the following regulations shall henceforth be the regulations governing the said decorations and medals —

Firstly, it is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Cross shall be granted only to such Officers and Warrant Officers of Our said Forces as shall be recommended to Us by or through Our Secretary of State for An for an act or acts of valour, courage, or devetion to duty performed whilst flying in active operations against the enemy

Secondly, it is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Cross shall be silver and shall consist of a Cross flory terminated in the horizontal and base bars with bombs, the upper bar terminating with a rose, surmounted by another cross composed of aeroplane propellers charged in the centre with a roundel within a wreath of laurels a rose winged ensigned by an Imperial Crown thereon the letters R A F On the reverse the Royal Cypher above the date 1918. The whole attached to the clasp and ribbon by two sprigs of laurel

Thirdly, it is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Cross shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a ribbon one inch and a quarter in width which shall be in colour violet and white in alternate diagonal stripes of one-eighth of an inch in width running at an angle of 45 degrees downwards towards the wearer's left

Fourthly, it is ordained that the award of the Distinguished Flying Cross shall entitle the recipient to have the initials DFC appended to his name

Fifthly, it is ordained that the Air Force Cross shall be granted to such Officers and Warrant Officers of Our said Forces as shall be recommended to Us by or through Our Secretary of State for Air for an act or acts of valour, courage or devotion to duty whilst flying though not in active operations against the enemy, and may also be granted to individuals not belonging to such Forces who render distinguished service to Aviation in actual flying

Sixthly, it is ordained that the Air Force Cross shall be silver and shall consist of a thunderbolt in the form of a cross the aims conjoined by wings, the base bar terminating with a bomb surmounted by another cross composed of aeroplane propellers, the four ends enscribed with the letters G V R I In the centre a roundel thereon, a representation of Hermes mounted on a hawk in flight bestowing a wreath. On the reverse the Royal Cypher above the date 1918. The whole ensigned by an Imperial Crown and attached to the clasp and ribbon by two sprigs of laurel

Seventhly, it is ordained that the Air Force Cross shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a ribbon one inch and a quarter in width which shall be in colour red and white in alternate diagonal stripes of one-eighth of an inch in width running at an angle of 45 degrees downwards towards the wearer's left

Eighthly, it is ordained that the award of the Air Force Cross shall entitle the recipient to have the initials AFC appended to his name

Ninthly, it is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Medal shall be granted only to such Non-commissioned Officers and Animen of Our said Forces as shall be recommended to Us by or through Our Secretary of State for Air for an act or acts of valour, courage or devotion to duty performed whilst flying in active operations against the enemy

Tenthly, it is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Medal shall be in silver and oval-shaped, bearing Our Effigy on the obverse and on the reverse within a wreath of laurel a representation of Athena Nike seated on an aeroplane, a hawk rising from her right aim above the words "for Courage". The whole ensigned by a bomb attached to the clasp and ribbon by two wings

Eleventhly, it is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Medal shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a nibbon of one inch and a quarter in width, which shall be in colour violet and white in alternate diagonal stripes of one-sixteenth of an inch in width running at an angle of 45 degrees downwards towards the wearer's left

Twelfthly, it is ordained that the award of the Distinguished Flying Medal shall entitle the recipient to have the initials DFM appended to his name

Thirteenthly, it is ordained that the Air Force Medal shall be granted to such Non-commissioned Officers and Airmen of Our said Forces as shall be recommended to Us by or through Our Secretary of State for Air for an act or acts of valour, comage or devotion to duty performed whilst flying though not in active operations against the enemy, and may also be granted to individuals not belonging to such Forces who render distinguished service to aviation in actual flying

Fourteenthly, it is ordained that the An Force Medal shall be silver and oval-shaped, bearing Our Effigy on the obverse and on the reverse within a wreath of laurel a representation of Hermes mounted on a hawk in flight bestowing a wreath. The whole ensigned by a bomb attached to the clasp and ribbon by two wings

Fifteenthly it is ordained that the Air Force Medal shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a ribbon one inch and a quarter in width which shall be in colour red and white in alternate diagonal stripes of one-sixteenth of an inch in width running at an angle of 45 degrees downwards towards the wearer's left

Sixteenthly, it is ordained that the award of the Air Force Medal shall entitle the recipient to have the initials A F M appended to his name

Seventeenthly, it is ordained that Foreign Officers and gradings of an equivalent rank to those above-mentioned, who have been associated in operations with Our Forces, shall be eligible for the award of the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Air Force Cross, the Distinguished Flying Medal and the Air Force Medal

Eighteenthly, it is ordained that in cases where an individual who has been awarded one of the above decorations or medals shall be recommended for a further act of valour courage or devotion to duty, he shall be awarded a bar to be attached to the ribbon by which the decoration or medal is suspended, and for every additional such act an additional bar may be awarded

Nineteenthly, it is ordained that the names of those upon whom We may be pleased to confer the above decorations and medals shall be published in the London Gazette, and that a Register thereof shall be kept in the Office of Our Secretary of State for Air

Twentiethly, it is ordained (1) That it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors by an Order under Our Sign Manual and on a recommendation by or through Our Secretary of State for An to cancel and annul the award to any person of the above decorations or medals, and that thereupon the name of such person in the Register shall be erased, but that We, Our Hens and Saccessors shall at all times have power to restore any decoration or medal which may have been forferted when such recommendation shall (2) That the forfeiture shall involve have been withdrawn the cessation of any gratuity or pension in lieu thereof to which the possession of any of the aforesaid decorations or medals might entitle the recipient, but no such forfeiture shall extend to any sum of money which has already been paid (3) That when a forfested decoration or medal shall have been restored, any gratuity or pension in lieu thereof which attaches to it shall also be restored (4) That a notice of forfeiture or of restoration shall in every case be published in the London Gazette

Lastly, We reserve to Ourself, Our Hens and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting, or dispensing with these Regulations or any part thereof by a notification under Our Royal Sign Manual
