#### DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

Locusi Report 29th Dycember, 1932

Uganda Buganda—Fewer flying swarms have been observed and very few further layings are recorded. Hatchings continue, the hoppers are being killed by beating

Eastern Province—A few flying swarms, new egg areas and hopper bands are recorded from Teso

Northern Province—Flying swarms are recorded in reduced numbers, and additional lavings have been correspondingly small. Some further hatchings have occurred. The hopper bands in the inhabited areas are being destroyed. In the extensive uninhabited areas of Gulu the hoppers will shortly reach the winged stage.

Western Province —Numerous new hopper bands are recorded from Ankole

#### KENYA

No change in the general situation has been reported during the past fortnight. Flying swarms have been present in all Kavirondo districts.

Kisumu Londiani Nandi, Elgevo, Ravine, Baringo, Nakuru Nuvisha and Machikos. Although a few luge swarms have been observed, the numbers of locusts have diminished in most cases.

Some futher living has taken place in North Kaynondo and small numbers of hoppers have hatched there, also in the Kama Koiwa area. So tar as is known at present, no hatching on a large scale has occurred in the Colons.

The District Commissioner Rummuti, reports his district ilmost free of flying swarms, and that the locust position is giving less cause for anxiety than for some months past

It would appear that no breeding on a large scale is now likely to take place in the Colony during the present season, and that unless swarms again enter Kenya from elsewhere any intestation during 1033 may be on a small scale in comparison with the past two years

The right to withdraw the plot from auction is reserved to the Commissioner of Lands

#### CONDITIONS OF SALE

#### (a) Auction

- 1 Bidding will be on the basis of a rent per annum
- The highest bidder will be the purchaser, but it any dispute arise as to any bid the plot will be re offered at the last undisputed bid
- 3 The amount of the advance or each bid will be regulated by the auctioneer, and no bidding shall be retracted
  - 1 No bid of less than Sh 120 wll be accepted
- The purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the haminer, a deposit equal to the rental due for the first period of eleven months. - 5 The licensee shall be responsible for the construction and upkeep of at least one access road from a public road to the quarry area.
