## DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

LOCUST REPORT, 12TH JANUARY, 1933

## UGANDA

*Buganda* reports only one flying swarm has been observed. No further egg laying is reported. Hatchings have continued, but the bands are small, and the hoppers are being destroyed in most areas without difficulty.

*Eastern Province*—A number of flying swarms continue to be present in Busoga, and some further egg-laying has taken place. In other parts of the province eggs have been laid in two places. Additional hatchings have been observed in some fourteen places.

*Northern Province*—A few old generation swarms are present in Lango and West Nile. Some further scattered hatchings have occurred in all districts, excepting in Gulu where surviving hoppers are becoming winged.

*Western Province*—Two swarms from the Semliki Valley have laid in north-western Toro. No other fliers have been seen. Hoppers have appeared in a number of additional places.

*General*—Flights of the old generation have almost ceased. It is expected that few hoppers will survive, apart from those in Gulu district where the large uninhabited areas have been more intensely infested than previously at this season, and where the unusually wet conditions have rendered burning impossible.

## TANGANYIKA

*General*—Hopper emergencies are now being reported from various areas, and locust destruction campaigns are being organised. The Lake Province at present is the most heavily infested, but other areas are showing increased activity.

*Irunga Province*—Hoppers have appeared in four areas of the Tukuyu district and operations for their destruction are in progress. A heavy infestation of hoppers is reported on the Nvasa lake shore.

*Northern Province*—Slight damage to maize is reported in the Taveta area by a moderate sized swarm which is moving north east. No locusts reported in other areas.

*Lake Province*—Large hopper bands have emerged on the Bukoba-Uganda border. Large swarms of mature locusts are reported moving south-west in Biharianiulo, and scattered swarms in the Maswa, Kahawa and Tabora districts. Hopper emergencies in scattered areas are also reported.

*Central Province*—A flying swarm estimated at seven miles long and three miles in depth flying south south-west over Singida was reported on the 29th December.

## KENYA

The majority of districts in the Colony report that no locusts have been observed during the past fortnight.

Swarms are reported as having been present in the North and Central Kavirondo, Nakuru, Naivasha, Kitui and Machakos districts. Some of these swarms are said to be almost mature, but the majority are not of large size. Hoppers have hatched at Songhor, Makuyu, in the Cherangani area at Lower Molo, and in Kitui and Machakos. In no case are the areas over which hatching has taken place large, in some cases the hoppers have

already been destroyed, and all should be cleared without difficulty and without resort to poisoning methods. The District Commissioner, Meru, reports heavy hatchings in the Shabba-Igembe area, but their extent has not yet been determined.

Several reports have been received of large flocks of birds following swarms, and in some cases swarms have been destroyed completely by this agency.

## QUARRYING RIGHTS, PLOT 2729/10 -- NAIROBI

NOTICE is hereby given that a licence for quarrying rights over Plot No 2729/10, Quarry Reserve, Nairobi, will be offered for sale at the office of the District Commissioner, Nairobi (Land Section), on Friday the 27th January, 1933, at 11 a.m.

A plan of the plot may be seen at the office of the District Commissioner, Nairobi, or may be had on application to the Surveyor General on payment of Sh 1 post free.

The right to withdraw the plot from auction is reserved to the Commissioner of Lands.

## CONDITIONS OF SALE

## (a) Auction

- 1 Bidding will be on the basis of a rent per annum.
- 2 The highest bidder will be the purchaser, but if any dispute arise as to any bid the plot will be re-offered at the last undisputed bid.
- 3 The amount of the advance of each bid will be regulated by the auctioneer, and no bidding shall be retracted.
- 4 No bid of less than Sh 120 will be accepted.
- 5 The purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer, a deposit equal to the rental due for the first period of eleven months. In default of such payment the plot may be immediately re-offered for sale, and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.
- 6 The purchaser shall on paying the deposit inform the auctioneer of the name or names of the person or persons on whose behalf the licence is purchased, the licence will be issued in accordance with this information.
- 7 The fees payable for the preparation of the licence (Sh 100) and the stamp duty payable in respect of the licence, and all other expenses if any, shall be paid to the Surveyor-General, Nairobi, all the amounts to be paid within seven days from the date of the sale, and upon such payments being duly made, the purchaser shall, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140, Revised Edition), be entitled to the licence which shall be presented to him for execution as soon as conveniently may be.
- 8 If the amounts mentioned in Condition No 7 are not paid as therein laid down within seven days from the date of sale the Commissioner of Lands may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited, and the purchaser shall have no further claim to the grant of the licence.

## (b) General

1 The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the licensee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

2 The licensee shall not at any time subdivide his interest in the licence, or assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of any portion of such interest without the previous written consent of the Commissioner of Lands.

## (c) Special

1 The licences will be granted for a period of twelve months from the 1st day of February, 1933, and thereafter will be held subject to three months' notice to be given by either party.

2 A royalty of Sh 18 per 1,000 cubic feet of stone taken will be payable to the District Commissioner, Nairobi, monthly settlements to be made in this respect.

3 No stream or natural drainage course shall be disturbed in any way and all excavations shall be filled in or drained to the satisfaction of the Medical Officer of Health, Nairobi.

4 No quarrying operations shall be carried on within 100 feet of any public road, and all responsibility for damage to any person or animal or to any public or private property whether movable or immovable due to quarrying operations or transport from quarry to public road shall rest with the licensee.

5 The licensee shall be responsible for the construction and upkeep of at least one access road from a public road to the quarry area.

6 The licence will be restricted to quarrying only, but natives employed on quarrying operations may reside within the area provided the accommodation and sanitation are approved by the Medical Officer of Health, Nairobi.

7 All operations relative to the purpose for which the licence is granted must be confined within the area demarcated.

8 The licence may be cancelled on one day's notice for failure to comply with any of the foregoing terms and conditions.

- 1 Each plot will be auctioned separately.
- 2 The amount of the advance of each bid will be regulated by the auctioneer, and no bidding shall be retracted.
- 3 The highest bidder will be the purchaser, but if any dispute arise as to any bid, the plot will be reoffered at the last undisputed bid.
- 4 Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer, a deposit of 25 per cent of the purchase money. In default of such payment, the plot may be immediately reoffered for sale, and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.
- 5 Each purchaser shall on paying the deposit inform the auctioneer of the name or names of the person or persons on whose behalf the plot is purchased, the grant will be issued in accordance with this information.
- 6 The balance of the purchase money, together with the rent due to the 31st December, 1933, shall be paid to the District Commissioner, Nairobi, while the survey fees, the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh 120) and the stamp duty payable in respect of the grant, and all other expenses, if any, shall be paid to the Surveyor-General, Nairobi, all the amounts to be paid within seven days from the date of the sale, and upon such payments being duly made, the purchaser shall, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140, Revised Edition), and to the Conditions of Sale having been complied with, be entitled to a grant of the plot, which grant shall be presented to him duly executed as soon as conveniently may be. Provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the time stated or thereafter, unless and until the Commissioner of Lands can present to the purchaser the grant duly executed.

7 Subject to the proviso contained in Condition No 6, if the amounts therein mentioned are not paid as therein laid down within seven days from the date of sale, the Commissioner of Lands may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited, and the purchaser shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

*(b) General*

1 The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantees shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

2 No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the authority, and by the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the District Commissioner, North Nyeri, for necessary action.

3 Grants will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance. The term of the grants will be 25 years from the 1st day of February, 1933, subject to extension to 99 years as provided in Special Condition No 2.

4 The grantee shall not at any time subdivide the plot, or assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of any portion of the plot without the previous written consent of the Governor.

5 Any building erected shall conform to a building line decided upon by the authority.

*(c) Special*

1 Each purchaser of a plot shall erect, within two years of the commencement of his grant a building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick, concrete or wood and iron on proper foundations.

2 If at any time during the term of the grant a main building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick or concrete on proper foundations be erected on any plot, the grantee shall be entitled to an extension of the term of the grant to 99 years from the 1st day of February, 1933.

3 No building shall at any time during the term of the grant be used for any other purpose than a dwelling house.

4 At no time during the term of the grant shall more than one dwelling house with the necessary offices and out-buildings be erected on any plot without the consent of the Governor.

5 The grantee shall not at any time during the term of the grant erect any building or buildings so as to cover more than one-half of the area of the plot.

6 All out-buildings, offices, etc., shall be properly sited and screened from view to the satisfaction of the authority or such other person as may be appointed and shall be kept so screened during the term of the grant.

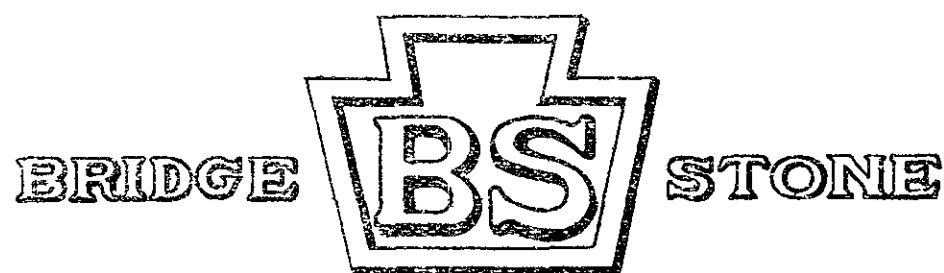
