#### 2 In this Ordinance—

"nursing sister" means a nurse, nursing sister, health visitor or mation who has received an appointment in the public service, or in a public hospital in the Colony, or in a public hospital elsewhere to which she received an appointment through the Overseas Nursing Association,

"public service" means service under the Government of Kenya or under any Government or local authority in His Majesty's Dominions or in a British protectorate or a territory in respect of which His Majesty has accepted a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations,

"public hospital" includes any hospital controlled by a regularly constituted governing body, and not conducted for private profit,

"year 'and "month" have the meanings assigned to No 11 of 1927 them in the European Officers' Pensions Ordinance 1927

- This Ordinance may be cited as "the Nursing Short title (Returns Allowances) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1933 " and shall be read as one with the Nursing Sisters No 21 of 1931 (Retning Allowances) Ordinance, 1931, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance"
- The definition of "nuising sister" contained in Amendment of section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and section 2 of the following is substituted therefor —

' 'nursing sister' means a person who is a nurse, health visitor, or mation whose parents are both Europeans and who has received an appointment in the public service or in a public hospital in the Colony, or in a public hospital elsewhere to which she received an appointment through the Overseas Nursing Association "

#### OBJECTS AND REASONS

The definition of "nursing sister" in the Principal Ordinance applied to all nursing sisters irrespective of race It has been pointed out, however, to this Government that in Ceylon and in certain East African Dependencies where the Principal Ordinance has been passed, its operation has been confined to European nursing sisters This Bill so confines the Ordinance in this Colony

No expenditure of public money will be involved if the provisions of the Bill become law

# Appointment of Central Board

#### OBJECTS AND REASONS

It is proposed to amend the Land and Agricultural Bank Ordinance 1930, to empower the Land Bank Board in the interests of economy and subject to adequate safeguarding of the funds of the Bank to act as the Central Agricultural Advances Board also If that proposed amendment of the law is approved this amendment is a necessary corollary

This Bill abolishes the existing Agricultural Advances Board and substitutes therefor the Land Bank Board together with such other persons as the Governor may nominate, the object of this addition being to give the Land Bank Board the assistance of those who have long been identified with the work of the Agricultural Advances Board

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

Section 11 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

Renumeration of members of Board

11 (1) Every member of the Board, other than the Chairman and other than members who are officers in the public service, shall be paid out of the funds of the Bank a fee of three pounds for each day or portion of a day while he is engaged upon the business of the Bank and the Chairman

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

This Ordinance may be cited as "the Land and Short title Agricultural Bank (Amendment) Ordinance, 1933," shall be read as one with the Land and Agricultural Bank No 3 of 1931 Ordinance, 1930, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance ''

(2) The Board when engaged in such agency work shall not be deemed to be engaged on the business of the Bank and the members of the Board shall in respect of such agency work be remunerated at such rates as the Governor in Council may approve

- (3) Provided that no such sale shall take place until the expiry of at least thirty days from the date of a notice in the Gazette and in some newspaper circulating in the district stating the date, hour and place, and the terms and conditions of the sale and provided that every reasonable endeavour shall be made by the Board to communicate to persons interested that such sale is intended
- (4) The provisions of section 9 of this Ordinance shall not apply to a transfer of land or other security by the Board to a purchaser under this section "

#### OBJECTS AND REASONS

This amending Bill is the outcome of suggestions made by the Land and Agricultural Bank Board

- 2 Clause 2 provides that the Land Bank Board may be appointed and act as agents for Government in the administration of any advances to farmers or others. This amendment is proposed with a view to economy and contemplates the Land Bank taking over at a future date the activities of the Agricultural Advances Board
- 3 Clause 3 empowers the Board to pay out of the funds of the Bank reasonable travelling expenses incurred by a member when engaged on the business of the Bank
- 4 The amendment in Clause 4 is proposed with a view to facilitating the work of the Land Bank should foreclosure at any time become necessary
- 5 No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

#### RABIES PROGRESS REPORT

21st January, 1933

No further extension of rabies has occurred since the last report and one further case has been contrimed from the Kaniamkago I ocation, South Kavirondo. The brain from a suspect dog from Molo Settled Area was found negative by miscroscopic examination, but the biological test is not yet completed.

There have been no further suspected cases from the settled areas

The baiting campaign in the native reserves is still proceeding according to the original plan and a greater desire is shown by the natives generally in supporting the sanitary control measures which are being taken

In South Kavirondo, Burigi Location, a total of 5,540 baits were laid and the following numbers of carcasses were found hvenas 143 dogs 123 lackals 59, cat tribe 38

It is reported from Burigi Location that natives have taken dogs into Tanganyika Territory and handed them over to friends for temporary care, other natives are keeping their dogs fastened up in their huts pending developments

The Tanganyika veterinary authorities have been requested to render assistance by preventing the interchange of dogs between natives over the border

In addition baiting has been carried out by other members of the staff and big "sweeps" are reported covering several locations in the southern, eastern and western portions of the South Kavnondo Reserve and it is hoped to complete the first "comb out" in a short while

The number of rabies carriers accounted for is considerable. Suspected cases of rabies are still being reported from the South Kavirondo Reserve, and in five locations reports state that baits have accounted for 3 737 dogs. 116 hyaenas, 89 civets and 14 mongooses.

In the southern halt of the Lumbwa Native Reserve a large number of barts have been laid and reports are received that wild carnivora are causing damage to the native flocks

The roads between Chemegel and Kericho and the Lutein and Ngoiria Roads have been heavily baited

Further activities are being initiated in the Sotik-Amala area, at the request of the natives, owing to the presence of a large number of jackals in the area

Sickness of the staff caused a limitation in the activities of the campaign in the northern half of the Reserve but it is hoped to resume them almost immediately

In Central Kavirondo a limited baiting was carried out in the East Kano Location

In the Songhor district, with the co-operation of the local Police Officer, a baiting campaign in the iminediate vicinity of the recently reported outbreak was organized and 25 jackals, 5 hyaenas, etc., were accounted for

In general, the position is that the campaign against rabies carriers has been intensified, with the result that great destruction of canines and small carnivora has taken place, but cases of suspected rabies are still reported from the native reserves

## DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE Locust Report, 26th January, 1933 UGANDA

Buganda—There is little change in the situation There are three reports of fliers, and one of egg living. Further hopper bands have been observed Destruction of hoppers continues

Eastern Province —The number of flying swarms appears to have increased particularly in Bugwere where egg laying has occurred at several places Few additional hoppers are recorded

Northern Province—There is an increase in numbers of fliers in Gulu and West Nile districts Some hoppers are still present in parts of Gulu, Chua and Lango

Western Province—An increase of fliers is recorded in Toro district, some of the swarms are mature, and further layings are expected in the western areas

#### TANGANYIKA

Hopper emergencies are now being reported from various areas, and locust destruction campaigns are being organized. The heaviest infestation is in the Lake Province, where large hopper bands have emerged on the Bukoba Uganda border. A heavy infestation of hoppers is reported on the Nyassa I ake shore

Large swarms of mature locusts are reported in the Lake Province, and one swarm at Singida in the Cential Province on the 29th December Slight damage to maize is reported in the Taveta area by a moderate sized swarm moving north-east. No locusts are reported in other areas in the Northern Province

Belgian Congo reports that in October, large dense swarms were present in Lualaba and Tanganyika districts, while scattered swarms were circling in Luapula district. An emergence of hoppers occurred in Kisengwa, Londiani district, and measures were taken for their destruction

Nigeria reports an increase in flying swarms in the Northern Provinces, while the Southern Provinces and the Colony were invaded by several swarms from the west. These swarms were not yet sexually mature. Hopper infestation was slight in the Northern Province, while the Southern Province was reported to be clear.

#### KENYA

Most districts in the Colony have been reported clear of flying swarms during the last fortnight. A large swarm is reported between Myanga and Mulaba in North Kavirondo, while one or two swarms have been circling in Central Kavirondo.

Hoppers—The Machakos infestation is being cleared up by beating, and the extent of the Makuyu hatching is being investigated, together with a reported hatching on the Maragua ridge. The Meiu infestation is small compared with last year's, and considerable destruction of hoppers is being effected by birds. Small hatchings are reported in Emberre, the hoppers being dealt with by beating. Kitale also reports hatching of hoppers.
