A Bill to Amend the Prisons Ordinance, 1930

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

This Ordinance may be cited as "the Prisons (Amend-Short title ment) Ordinance, 1933," and shall be read as one with the No 37 of 1930 Prisons Ordinance, 1930, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance "

2 (1) Subject to the approval of the Governor on the Exemption recommendation of the Commissioner every African subordinate officer who has been enlisted on or before the thirty- gratuities in first day of December, 1932, shall, after nine years' continuous good service, be exempt from payment of poll tax in respect of himself for his life, or alternatively, he shall be exempt from the payment of hut tax in respect of one hut for life

from poll or hut tax and lieu thereof

Provided that any such African subordinate officer to whom exemption from paying poll or hut tax has been granted under this sub-section may, at his option exercisable at the time of discharge, be paid in lieu of such exemption, a gratuity, VIZ -

£s (a) In the case of such African subordinate officer on discharge after a continuous good service extending to a period of nine years 7 10

(b) In the case of such African subordinate officer on discharge after a continuous good service extending to a period of twelve years 10 0

(2) Subject to the approval of the Governor on the recommendation of the Commissioner every African subordinate officer who has been enlisted on or after the first day of January, 1933, shall be granted, in lieu of exemption from paying poll or hut tax and in addition to any other gratuity payable on discharge under the provisions of the Principal Ordinance or any regulation thereunder, gratuities, viz —

Commence ment 3 This Ordinance shall be deemed to have commenced and come into operation on the first day of January, 1933

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of this Bill is to introduce a system of gratuities in lieu of exemption from hut or poll tax for future entrants into the prisons service. Provision has also been made for payment of gratuities to men already serving on the first January, 1933, who opt to forgo the exemption from hut or poll tax.

Apart from the gratuities in lieu of hut or poll tax, which it is not possible to estimate, no expenditure of public money will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

GENFRAL NOTICE No 132

RABIES PROGRESS REPORT

31st January, 1933

IT is again satisfactory to report that no fresh outbreaks of rables have come under notice since the last report and consequently there has been no extension of infected or suspected areas. Barting is generally proceeding with material success as instanced by the mortality records, and as in the case of the Sotik area, where re-barting has resulted in a very small mortality amongst dogs and wild carnivora

Reports from South Kaynondo state—In the Majogi location bailing has been carried out, and the following mortality has resulted 460 dogs 31 hyenas, 33 jackals, 37 civets and 19 mongooses also in the Kibuti location a mortality of 4.74 dogs has been reported. In the Merogi district many natives are voluntarily bringing in dogs for destruction

Poison baits have been distributed over the whole of the Kabwoch location resulting in the destruction of 490 dogs. It will be seen therefore that the baiting in the South Kavirondo Reserve during the past week has accounted for a total of 1,544 dogs and wild carnivora

Extensive 16-baiting of farms in the southwestern Sotik area has resulted in the destruction of 34 hyenas, 22 jackals, 1 leopaid, 3 monkeys, 21 serval cats and 1 skunk

In south-eastern Sotik re baiting has been carried out over a wide area around the Sotik post, and the campaign is being continued towards the Amali-Masai boider. Results of this re baiting are not yet available.

In the Kibigori area 1,000 poison baits have been distributed in the east Kano location and have resulted in a mortality of 953 dogs

In the Songhor district there is a reported mortality of 14 jackals by poisoning

In the South Kish-Tanganyika boider are a 8,460 poison baits have been distributed and the following results have been reported to date 91 livenas, 80 dogs, 30 jackals, 28 other animals

These distributions were made in the Burigi and Bunyabassi locations and it is expected that the final report will reveal a much heaver destruction


