KENYA PROCLAMATIONS, RULES AND REGULATIONS

Section 22 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

Marriage in licensed place of worship by recognized minister

Between hours of 8 a m and 6 p m Witnesses 22 Marriages may be celebrated in any licensed place of worship by any recognized minister of the church, denomination, or body to which such place of worship belongs, and according to the rites or usages of mairiage observed in such church, denomination, or body, provided that the marriage be celebrated with open doors between the hours of 8 o'clock in the forenoon and 6 o'clock in the afternoon, and in the presence of two or more witnesses besides the officiating minister

### A Bill to Amend the Marriage Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

- 1 This Ordinance may be cited as "the Marriage Short title (Amendment) Ordinance, 1933," and shall be read as one with the Marriage Ordinance (Chapter 167 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance"
- 2 Section 22 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following is substituted therefor Repeal and replacement of Section 2

"22 Mairiages may be celebrated in any licensed place of worship by any recognized minister of the church, denomination or body to which such place of worship belongs and according to the rites and usages of marriage observed in such church, denomination or body, or with the consent of a recognized minister of the church, denomination or body to which such place of worship belongs by any recognized minister of any other church, denomination or body according to the rites and usages of mairiage observed in the church, denomination or body to which such last mentioned recognized minister belongs, provided that the mairiage be celebrated with open doors between the hours of 8 o'clock in the forenoon and 6 o'clock in the afternoon, and in the presence of two or more witnesses besides the officiating minister."

### OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of the Bill is to enable a minister of one denomination to many persons in a licensed place of worship of another denomination with the consent of the authorities of such denomination

In some districts there are no places of worship of some denominations, and persons like to be married in accordance with their own faith

- 2 The Bill has the approval of the representatives of Protestant denominations in the Colony
- 3 No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

Any objection to the motion must be sent in writing to the undersigned within one month from the date hereof

The right of any person to ply for hire within the Municipality with any public vehicle or motor vehicle for the unexpired period of any licence issued prior to the date hereof will not be affected by the motion, nor the right of any person to carry for hire or reward passengers departing to or arriving from any place outside the limits of the Municipality

### RABIES PROGRESS REPORT

21st February, 1933

Since the last report a case of rabies in a jackal has come to notice, and has been confirmed by the Kabete Laboratory. The jackal was killed on a European tarm in the Lumbwa area. The history of the case is as follows, the jackal attacked a voung goat, and a native woman who endeavoured to rescue the goat was bitten by the jackal, the goat died and the jackal was killed. The native woman was taken into Lumbwa by the owner of the farm for treatment.

Further reports from this area state that previous to this incident a jackal bit i native herder and the animal escaped, later i European-owned dog was bitten outside the house of his owner by a jackal the dog was destroyed and again the jackal escaped. The native was sent for treatment

It is suspected, however, that in each instance the same jackal was concerned, and it is fortunate that the animal has been destroyed

It has also come to notice that a native child was bitten in the Loliondo district in Tanganyika Territory by a jackal. The child was sent to Nairobi for treatment the jackal was destroyed. It is suspected that the jackal was rabid but unfortunately no material was collected for confirmation.

No reports have been received of suspected rabies on the Kenya side of the Kenya-Tanganyika border

Lumbwa —A total of 131 dogs have been shot in Songhor district, and it is hoped shortly to commence poison baiting in that area

Baiting is being carried out in the Songhor Police district

Poison baits were distributed on the farm on which the above-mentioned positive case of rabies in a jackal occurred, and it is reported that there are now no dogs on that farm. Adjoining farms were also baited and in addition the Lumbwa township

South Kavnondo —Poison baiting has been completed in the Bassi location, and the following animals have been found dead 549 dogs, 12 hvenas 53 jackals, 42 civets, 9 mongooses

Baiting has been carried out along the Kisii-Lumbwa border as far as Police Post No 3 in North Mugirango location, in the Nyaribari location on the Kisii-Masai border, and in South Kitutu 971 dogs, 8 hyenas, 62 jackals 37 civets, 4 mongooses have been found dead

The baiting of the Nvaribari location will complete the whole of the Kish territory

2,347 poison baits have been distributed in the Karmgu location with a known destruction of 152 dogs 8 hyenas and 6 wild cats

2,540 poison baits have been distributed in the Kadem location with a known destruction of 125 dogs 12 hyenas and 8 mongooses

Natives in the Marungu, Kadem and Gwassi locations has been destroying their own dogs with the result that the number left is not great

Baiting has been commenced in the Gwassi location, and since a suspicious case of lables was reported in this location some time ago, the Chief issued instructions that all dogs are to be destroyed,

and he is willing to give every possible support to the campaign

More than 8,000 baits were distributed in the Bunyabassi location, and some further baits were distributed in the Buregi location. The chief of the latter reports finding carcases of a further 57 hyenas and 20 dogs. The chief of the Bunyabassi location reports that the following animals has been found dead. 110 hyenas, 1 leopard, 60 dogs 15 juckals, 35 small cuts, etc. This completes the distribution of buts in the Bunyabassi location and buting is being commenced in the Bukiria location.

Sould—Baits have been distributed as follows since the last report 3,590 baits on occupied farms in the Sould area 7,000 baits in the Lumbwa Reserve chiefly on the boundary of that reserve with the Mau Forest area where it is believed that wild carnivora abound, 1,915 baits in the Lutein nea 1,700 baits in Location No 10, 3,800 baits in the Amal area, and re-baiting has also been carried out in the Kericho district

Kibigori —Baiting has been continued in the East Kano location with a further destruction of 415 dogs

Molo-Mau Summit Area —Arrangements have been made to commence operations in this area at an early date

### DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE Locust Report, 23rd February, 1933 UGANDA

Except to the Eastern Province which is reported to be clear of fliers, there has been a general increase in the number of flying swarms maturing from hopper bands which have escaped destruction. Wet weather has hampered anti-hopper measures in the Northern Province.

Further hopper bands have been reported in the Eastern and Northern Provinces, and some mature flying swarms are present in Buganda where further egg-laying has occurred. Considerable kills of both hoppers and settled fliers have been recorded.

### TANGANYIKA TERRITORY

Reports of egg-laying and hatching are now general, but destruction campaigns are in progress and the situation is not regarded as serious. All Provinces are affected except the Northern and Tinga Provinces which are reported clear

Flying swarms—Four young adult swarms entered Trans Nzora last week from Uganda, but no report has been received as to their present position. Young swarms have been reported flying from the east near Donyo Sabuk, and a large swarm has done considerable damage to grazing at Athi River.

Hoppers —Small hopper bands have been reported from Nyeri, Sagana, Runu and North and Central Kavirondo, and local anti hopper measures are being taken. All hoppers in Machakos and in the Cheran gani have now been destroyed
