RABIES PROGRESS REPORT.

7TH MARCH, 1933.

No fresh case of rabies has come to notice since the last report, nor has any incident of a suspicious nature been observed. The campaign is, however, proceeding without relaxation.

SOUTH KAVIRONDO.

Some re-baiting was carried out in the Bukiria, Bunyabassi and Buregi locations, and altogether 6,540 baits were distributed.

The following mortality was reported by the chief of the Bunyabassi location or otherwise observed: 80 hyenas, 70 dogs, 10 jackals, 8 cats, etc., total 168.

It is of interest to note that most of these dogs had presumably been hidden in huts while the first baiting was proceeding and afterwards released.

It is reported that at least five of these dogs belonged to natives of Tanganyika Territory who had brought them over the border when cutting building material in the area.

It is also of interest to note that in the Buregi location, negligible destruction has been observed amounting to only 3 hyenas and 2 domesticated dogs.

On the other hand in the Bukiria location at least 45 dogs were destroyed by their owners, and the chief took some pride in stating that he had caused his own three dogs to be destroyed. In all, over 400 dogs, hyenas, jackals, etc., were destroyed in the Bukiria location.

The baiting of the Nyaribari and Kitutu locations has been completed and the following destruction has been reported: 410 dogs, 71 jackals, 58 civets and 4 mongooses. The Kisumu country has now been completely baited.

Re-baiting has been commenced in the Mumbo and part of the Karachony locations, and the reported destruction to date is: 54 dogs, 14 jackals and 12 civets. Upon the completion of this area re-baiting will be commenced in the Kabondo location.

Poison baiting has been completed in the Gwasssi, Karungu and Kadem locations, and the following further destruction has been noted:—

Kadem: 15 dogs, 3 hyenas, 2 cats and 1 jackal.

Karungu: 7 dogs, 3 hyenas, 2 cats and 1 jackal.

GWASSI.

4,700 poison baits have been distributed and the known mortality amounts to: 216 dogs, 47 hyenas, 16 cats, 3 jackals and 19 other small animals.

In these three locations valuable assistance has been given by the native population.

Some re-baiting has been carried out in the Kanyadoto location with a known destruction of: 47 dogs and 2 hyenas; also in the Kanyamwoa location: 81 dogs, 2 hyenas and 2 jackals have been destroyed.

Poison baiting has been carried out in the vicinity of Homa Bay where 950 baits were distributed.

Baiting has been commenced in the Kasigunya location.

CENTRAL KAVIRONDO.

Poison baiting is being continued in the East Kano location.

SOTIK.

3,000 poison baits have been distributed in the Kapsamolo area. As a result of previous baitings: 40 hyenas, 20 jackals, 12 cats and 4 wild dogs have been found dead.

Baiting is being carried on in the Sigor and Kabosuru areas, and 2,900 baits were distributed in Locations 1 and 2, also 800 baits in Location 9.

An influx of native dogs in the Sotik post, which were apparently hidden during recent baiting operations, is reported, and the situation is receiving attention.

Baiting has been carried out on the farms in the Kericho area, also the native reserves, especially along the border of the Kisumu-Londiani settled areas.

LUMBWA.

Poison baiting in this area has been carried out on a large scale.

Baits have been distributed on a number of farms, and in addition the Londiani and Fort Ternan townships and main roads; the Lumbwa township has been re-baited.

The reports to hand reveal a destruction of: 18 dogs, 47 jackals, 10 wild cats and 1 mongoose, but full reports are not yet available.

Poison baiting has been commenced in the Tinderet Forest near Wandorobo settlements and along the southern edge of the forest where large numbers of vermin and squatter-owned dogs are still believed to exist. This area is in close proximity to farms in the North Lumbwa, Fort Ternan, Koru and Songhor districts.

Locust Report, 9TH MARCH, 1933

UGANDA

Further hatchings have occurred in the Mengo district of Buganda, and hoppers are still present in Toro. There are large numbers of fliers in Buganda, the swarm movement being westward and northward. In the Northern Province, fliers are present in Bunyoro, Gulu and Lango where a westerly direction is indicated. Flying swarms also continue prevalent in Toro, and a mature swarm from the Belgian Congo entered the district and settled south of Lake Albert.

Some slight damage by fliers has occurred to food crops and to cotton.

Tanganyika Territory reports little change in the situation. In the Lake Province, large scale hopper destruction has been carried out, all reported bands having been dealt with. Satisfactory anti-hopper measures are also being taken in Central and Lindi Provinces, while further egg-laying, mating and flying locusts are reported in Iringa Province, all in small numbers. Northern and Tanga Provinces remain clear of locusts.

KENYA

The Nzoia and Rift Valley Provinces are reported clear, except for hopper bands at Mau Summit. The Coast, Turkana and Northern Frontier Provinces are also clear except for a mature swarm which is reported to have landed at Bura (Garissa district).

Hopper destruction continues in North Kavirondo, South Nyeri, Fimbu and Machakos, and the situation in each case is well in hand. Locusts have matured in the Yatta Plains and young flying swarms have been in parts of Machakos and Kitui during the last two weeks. Some damage to crops is reported, the swarms appear to have a general southerly tendency and one large swarm has passed south into the Masai Reserve. A small swarm was reported flying southwards over Kakamega. Nyanza is otherwise reported clear of fliers.
