LOCUST REPORT

23RD MARCH, 1933

Uganda —Hoppers and flying swarms are present in Buganda and the general movement of swarms has been westwards. Hoppers, but no fleas, are present in Eastern Province. Flying swarms, hoppers and egg-laying are reported from the Northern and Western Provinces, a small swarm of young fleas flew from Tanganyika northwards towards Ankole, while in Northern Province a tendency for flying swarms to move in a north-westerly direction has been observed

Tanganyika —Emergence of hoppers is generally reported from infested provinces, measures for destruction are being continued and little serious damage is anticipated. Further egg-laying is reported in Lake Province. Northern and Tanga Provinces are clear of hoppers and fleas

KENYA

Flying swarms have been reported recently, circling through South Kitui and Machakos and southwards through Eastern Masai, and a large swarm was seen in the lower reaches of the Tana. Slight hopper activity continues in Nyeri district, and young fleas have been seen in Embere and Mwea

As far as can be ascertained the Colony is otherwise free of fleas and hoppers
