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## SUPPLEMENT

KENYA PROCLAMATIONS, RULES AND REGULATIONS

Section 30 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

30 (1) A local native fund shall be devoted only to such purposes as may be prescribed by any resolution which has been approved by the Governor under section 26

Provided that in any case where Government has expended public funds or incurred any liability in consideration of a resolution of a local native council by virtue of which the local native council has undertaken to pay to Government a capital or recurrent contribution from a local native fund, the Governor in Council may, if such local native council refuse or fail to make due payment in accordance with such resolution, order that such payment be made from such local native fund and may further order that any rate necessary to produce the sum required be levied on and collected from the inhabitants of the area in which such local native council is established

(2) The provisions of sub-sections (2) and (3) of section 26 of this Ordinance shall apply to a rate imposed under this section in the same manner as if it had been imposed by a resolution of a local native council and approved by the Governor in Council

## A Bill to Amend the Native Authority Ordinance

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows —

**1** This Ordinance may be cited as ‘ the Native Authority (Amendment) Ordinance 1933,’ and shall be read as one with the Native Authority Ordinance (Chapter 129 of the Revised Edition) hereinafter referred to as ‘ the Principal Ordinance ’

**2** Section 30 of the Principal Ordinance as amended by section 7 of the Native Authority (Amendment) Ordinance, 1928 is hereby further amended by adding the following proviso at the end of sub-section (1) thereof —

“ Provided further that if the Governor in Council is satisfied that a decree for the payment of money has been made by a competent court against a local native council, or that for other good and sufficient reason money is due and payable from a local native council and such local native council refuses or fails to make due payment, he may order that such payment be made from such local native fund and may further order that any rate necessary to produce the sum required be levied on and collected from the inhabitants of the area in which such local native council is established ”

## OBJECTS AND REASONS

There is no legal provision for meeting the case of a local native council refusing to pay a sum lawfully due. A recent case has shown the need for such provision

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

## RABIES PROGRESS REPORT

27TH MARCH, 1933

Since the last report no case of rabies has been confirmed and there is no further extension of the rabies infected areas

An incident, however, of a significant nature has been reported from the Songhor district the history of which is as follows. A stray dog wandered on to a European-owned farm and bit two natives. The dog was speared to death and the carcass buried. Unfortunately the police officer to whom the matter was eventually reported was on *safari* at the time the incident occurred and was therefore unable to procure material for the diagnosis of rabies. The two natives are undergoing medical treatment.

*Central Kavirondo* —As a result of previous baiting in West Kano over 1 100 dogs were destroyed. A further 1 120 baits have been laid, but the results are not yet available.

*South Kavirondo* —Re baiting has been continued in the Kabondo Location with a further destruction of 74 dogs, 6 hyenas and 4 jackals. Arrangements are being made to bait the remaining locations in the South Kavirondo Reserve.

*Sotik* —Poison baiting in the Chepalungu Forest on the border of the Sotik and Masai District is now almost completed. A report states that 4 000 baits have been distributed with a known destruction of 23 hyenas, 11 jackals and 1 leopard.

*Lumbwa* —Poison baiting has been carried out around Kedowa and on the Lumbwa slopes of the Mau Forest with a known destruction of 21 dogs, 2 hyenas, 17 jackals and 1 leopard. Also some 4 000 poison baits have been distributed in the Londiani District.

The distribution of over 8,000 poison baits has completed the southern edge of the Tinderet Forest. The final count shows a destruction of 31 dogs, 6 hyenas, 5 jackals and 4 wild cats, but as previously stated the dense undergrowth has prevented an accurate estimate of the mortality being obtained.

Poison baiting has been commenced in the Mau Summit Londiani area, and will be continued in a southerly direction towards the Tinnet Forest.

Arrangements are being made to carry out poison baiting in the Songhor District upon the completion of the Sotik area.

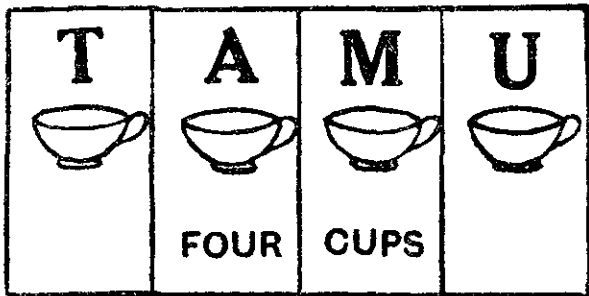
