A Bill to Make Provision for the Expulsion from Certain Areas of the Colony of Persons whose Presence Therein is Deemed to be Undesirable

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as “ the Expulsion from Proclaimed Areas Ordinance, 1933 ” Short title

2 In this Ordinance — Interpretation
‘ Board ’ means the Board established for any proclaimed area under section 4 of this Ordinance
‘ proclaimed area ’ means an area to which this Ordinance has been applied by proclamation of the Governor ,
“ expulsion order ” means an order made under section 5 of this Ordinance

3 This Ordinance shall apply to such areas of the Colony as the Governor by proclamation may from time to time declare Application

4 (i) For every proclaimed area the Governor shall appoint a Board, which shall consist of the Provincial Commissioner of the Province in which such area is situated, who shall be the Chairman of the Board, and such persons unconnected with the public service as the Governor may appoint, who shall, whenever possible, be persons resident in or connected with such area Appointment of Board for a proclaimed area

(ii) If the Provincial Commissioner is prevented from attending any meeting of the Board he may depute the District Commissioner of the district in which the proclaimed area is situated to attend such meeting and in that case the District Commissioner shall be Chairman of the Board during the absence of the Provincial Commissioner Provincial Commissioner to depute District Commissioner to act as Chairman

(iii) The Chairman and three members of the Board shall constitute a quorum

(iv) The Chairman shall have a casting vote as well as a deliberative vote

5 (1) If complaint is made to the District Commissioner of a proclaimed area or if he has reason to believe that the presence within such proclaimed area of any person, other than a native of such proclaimed area, is undesirable, he may notify such person of the grounds on which it is considered that his presence is undesirable, and shall in such notification inform him of the place at which and the date on which his case will be investigated by the Board (which date shall not be less than seven days after the service upon him of such notification) and that he may appear personally before the Board or may in writing show cause why he should not be ordered to leave and to continue to absent himself from such proclaimed area, and that if he does not appear personally or submit grounds of excuse in writing the Board may proceed to a decision in his absence

(ii) The Board shall have the powers of the Supreme Court to summon witnesses and to call for the production of books, plans and documents and to examine witnesses and parties concerned on oath. All summonses for the attendance of witnesses or other persons, or the production of documents, may be in such form as the Board may determine and shall be signed by the Chairman, and oaths may be administered by any member of the Board

(iii) The Board after considering the case against such person and any representations made by him, may, if it is satisfied that the presence of such person within the proclaimed area is undesirable, by order declare that such person shall, within a time to be limited by such order, remove himself from such proclaimed area, and continue to absent himself from such area or any other proclaimed area within the same Province so long as such order shall remain in force

(iv) Any person against whom an expulsion order has been made by the Board may within seven days of the making of such order appeal against such order in writing to the Governor, whose decision shall be final

- 6** An expulsion order may be expressed to be in force for a time to be limited therein or for an unlimited time

Duration of expulsion order
- 7** If a person against whom an expulsion order from a proclaimed area has been made wilfully neglects or refuses to leave such area within the time limited by the said order, or while the expulsion order is still in force enters or attempts to enter such area or any other proclaimed area within the same Province without the written consent of the Board, which consent may be given subject to any terms as to security for good behaviour or otherwise as to the Board may seem good, such person shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months
- 8** If a person against whom an expulsion order has been made has been sentenced to a term of imprisonment such sentence of imprisonment shall be carried out before the expulsion order is carried into effect

Sentence of imprisonment to be served before expulsion order is enforced
- 9** The expenses of expulsion from a proclaimed area may be defrayed from the public revenues of the Colony

Expenses of expulsion
- 10** In any prosecution for an offence against this Ordinance the production of an expulsion order purporting to be signed by the Chairman on behalf of the Board shall be conclusive evidence that the same is valid and lawfully made

Evidence
- 11** No action shall be brought by any person against whom an expulsion order has been made with reference to anything bona fide done or omitted to be done in the execution or purported execution of that order or of the provisions of this Ordinance

Indemnity
- 12** No court of law in the Colony shall have any jurisdiction to review, quash, reverse or otherwise interfere with any proceeding, act or order had, done or made under this Ordinance

Restriction of jurisdiction of courts of law
- 13** The Governor may make Rules for the better carrying out of the provisions of this Ordinance

Rules
- 14** This Ordinance shall continue in force for two years from the date of its coming into operation, and shall then expire. Provide that the Governor may by proclamation declare that this Ordinance shall remain in force until a date to be fixed in such proclamation

Duration of Ordinance

OBJECTS AND REASONS

In view of the probable increase in mining activities which are at present predominantly concentrated in the North Kaimondo Native Reserve it is considered most desirable in the interests both of the miners and of the natives concerned that the administration should be equipped with the necessary power to deal summarily and expeditiously with any person or persons whose presence is likely to lead to undesirable incidents. At the same time it is considered advisable that so far as possible such arbitrary powers should not be exercised without the consent of representative members of the unofficial community interested in the development of the mining areas.

It is therefore proposed to confer on Provincial Commissioners powers of expulsion from those areas of persons whose presence therein is for any reason undesirable and at the same time it is proposed to establish Advisory Boards of unofficial residents by whose advice Provincial Commissioners will be guided.

Appeal against an order of expulsion lies to the Governor.

If the Bill becomes law it may involve Government in some small expenditure in the payment of travelling expenses, but on the other hand it is hoped that it will have a salutary effect in the preservation of law and order and thereby save additional expenditure which would otherwise be necessitated by the maintenance of additional police in the areas concerned.

LOCUST REPORT

6TH APRIL, 1933

Uganda — Flying locusts and hoppers are present in all Provinces except Eastern Province which reports only a few flying swarms at Teso. In the Northern Province flying swarms are present in all districts, and swarms have entered the West Nile District from the Congo

Tanganyika Territory — There are extensive infestations of hoppers in parts of Lake Province, and large bands of hoppers have hatched out in Iringa Province. Further hatchings have also occurred in Central Province. Destruction campaigns continue. Certain areas in Lake Province have suffered much damage to food crops by flying swarms

Northern and Tanga Provinces are reported clear

Kenya — The situation remains unchanged, except that Machakos is now clear. No reports have been received of flying locusts or hoppers since the last report was issued

RABIES PROGRESS REPORT

7TH APRIL, 1933

It is again satisfactory to report that no fresh case of rabies has occurred nor has any incident of a suspicious nature been reported since the last report.

The campaign from the routine point of view is proceeding as follows —

Central Kavondo —As a result of previous baiting in West Kano 748 dogs were destroyed, a further 200 poison baits have been distributed in this Location. 1,016 poison baits have been distributed in the Nyakach Location.

South Kavondo —Re baiting has been carried out in portions of the Kaniamago and Sakwa Locations, resulting in the destruction of 8 dogs, 22 jackals, 6 hyenas and 25 other animals.

Re baiting has also been carried out in the North Mugungo Location and along the Kisii-Lumbwa border, some 2,200 poison baits being distributed. The mortality reports are not yet available.

Re baiting has been carried out in the Kaniada Location where there is a reported destruction of 12 dogs and 1 hyena. 300 poison baits were distributed.

In South Kaniada and Kabwoch Locations 750 poison baits have been distributed with a known destruction of 83 dogs, 5 hyenas and 2 jackals.

In the northern portion of the Gem Location and along the Kaniada and Kaniamwa border a distribution of 600 poison baits resulted in the known destruction of 23 dogs and 1 leopard.

Re-baiting has also been carried out in the Kabwoch, Kwalwa and Kaniadoto Locations with satisfactory results.

Molo-Mau Summit —The poison baiting campaign in this area has been commenced with the

distribution of 5,080 poison baits in the neighbourhood of the Mau Summit block of farms. Also in the forest area south of the main road in the vicinity of Mount Blackett 2,320 poison baits were distributed.

Early reports indicate a destruction of 60 dogs and a serval cat.

Lumbwa —In the Koiu and Fort Ternan districts 4,000 poison baits have been distributed.

While the position remains satisfactory it is proposed to issue quarterly reports only.
