His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the following Bill being introduced into the Legislative Council

#### H E BADER,

Acting Clerk of the Legislative Council

#### A Bill to Make Provision for the Adoption of Infants

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

- This Ordinance may be cited as 'the Adoption of Short title Children Ordinance, 1933 "
- In this Ordinance "the Court" shall mean the Interpretation Supreme Court of Kenya
- 3 (1) Upon an application in the prescribed manner by Power to make iny person desirous of being authorized to adopt an infant who adoption orders has never been married, the Court may, subject to the provisions of this Ordinance, make an order (in this Ordinance referred to as ' an adoption order') authorizing the applicant to adopt that infant

(2) A person so authorized to adopt the infant and an Adopter, infant authorized to be adopted are in this Ordinance referred defined to as an "adopted" and an "adopted child" respectively, and "infant" means a person under the age of twenty-one

(3) Where an application for an adoption order is made Joint adoption by two spouses jointly, the Court may make the order authoriz- by spouses ing the two spouses jointly to adopt, but save as aforesaid no adoption order shall be made authorizing more than one person to adopt an intant

4 (1) An adoption order shall not be made in any case Restrictions where—

on making adoption orders

- (a) the applicant is under the age of twenty-five years, or
- (b) the applicant is less than twenty-one years older than the infant in respect of whom the application is made

Provided that, where the applicant and the infant are within the prohibited degrees of consanguinity, it shall be lawful for the Court, if it thinks fit, to make the order notwithstanding that the applicant is less than twenty-one years older than the infant

Sole applicant male and infant female

(2) An adoption order shall not be made in any case where the sole applicant is a male and the infant in respect of whom the application is made is a female unless the Court is satisfied that there are special circumstances which justify as an exceptional measure the making of an adoption order

Consents required

(3) An adoption order shall not be made except with the consent of every person or body who is a parent or guardian of the infant in respect of whom the application is made or who has the actual custody of the infant or who is liable to contribute to the support of the infant

Power of Court to dispense with consent Provided that the Court may dispense with any consent required by this sub-section if satisfied that the person whose consent is to be dispensed with has abandoned or deserted the infant or cannot be found or is incapable of giving such consent or, being a person liable to contribute to the support of the infant, either has persistently neglected or refused to contribute to such support or is a person whose consent ought, in the opinion of the Court and in all the circumstances of the case, to be dispensed with

Application by one of two spouses

(4) An adoption order shall not be made upon the application of one of two spouses without the consent of the other of them

Provided that the Court may dispense with any consent required by this sub-section if satisfied that the person whose consent is to be dispensed with cannot be found or is incapable of giving such consent or that the spouses have separated and are living apart and that the separation is likely to be permanent

Applicant not resident or domiciled in the Colony

(5) An adoption order shall not be made in favour of any applicant who is not resident and domiciled in the Colony or in respect of any infant who is not a British subject and so resident

The Court before making an adoption order shall be Matters with satisfied—

respect to which Court

- (a) that every person whose consent is necessary under this Ordinance and who consent is not dispensed with has consented to and understands the nature and effect of the adoption order for which application is made, and in particular in the case of any parent understands that the effect of the adoption order will be permanently to deprive him or her of his or her parental rights, and
- (b) that the order if made will be for the welfare of the Welfare of infant due consideration being for this purpose given to the wishes of the infant, having regard to the age and understanding of the infint, and
- (c) that the applicant has not received or agreed to No considerareceive, and that no person has made or given, agreed to make or give to the applicant, any payment or other reward in consideration of the adoption except such as the court may sanction

7 (1) Upon an adoption order being made, all rights, Effect of duties, obligations and habilities of the parent or parents, guardian or guardians of the adopted child, in relation to the tuture custody, maintenance and education of the adopted child including all rights to appoint a guardian or to consent or give notice of dissent to marriage shall be extinguished, and all rights, duties obligations and liabilities shall vest in and be exercisable by and enforceable against the adopter as though the adopted child was a child born to the adopter in lawful wedlock, and in respect of the same matters and in Adopted child respect of the hability of a child to maintain its parents the in position of lawful child adopted child shall stand to the adopted exclusively in the of adopter position of a child born to the adopter in lawful wedlock

Provided that, in any case where two spouses are the adopters, such spouses shall, in respect of the matters aforesaid and for the purpose of the jurisdiction of any court to make orders as to the custody and maintenance of and right of access to children, stand to each other and to the adopted child in the same relation as they would have stood if they had been the lawful father and mother of the adopted child, and the adopted child shall stand to them respectively in the same relation as a child would have stood to a lawful father and mother respectively

Effect of order on proprietary rights

(2) An adoption order shall not deprive the adopted child of any right to or interest in property to which, but for the order, the child would have been entitled under any intestacy or disposition, whether occurring or made before or after the making of the adoption order, or confer on the adopted child any right to or interest in property as a child of the adopter, and the expressions "child", "children" and "issue" where used in any disposition whether made before or after the making of an adoption order, shall not, unless the contrary intention appears, include an adopted child or children or the issue of an adopted child

Disposition defined

(3) For the purposes of this section "disposition" means an assurance of any interest in property by any instrument whether inter vivos or by will including codicil

Power to make interim orders

8 (1) Upon any application for an adoption order, the Court may postpone the determination of the application and may make an interim order (which shall not be an adoption order for the purposes of this Ordinance) giving the custody of the infant to the applicant for a period not exceeding two years by way of a probationary period upon such terms as regards provision for the maintenance and education and supervision of the welfare of the infant and otherwise as the Court may think fit

Consents necessary for interim order (2) All such consents as are required to an adoption shall be necessary to an interim order but subject to a like power on the part of the Court to dispense with any such consent

Power to make subsequent order in respect of infant already subject to an order An adoption order or an interim order may be made in respect of an infant who has already been the subject of an adoption order, and, upon any application for such further adoption order, the adopter or adopters under the adoption order last previously made shall, if living, be deemed to be the parent or parents of the infant for all the purposes of this Ordinance

The Court may make Rules for directing the manner Rules to be in which applications to the Court are to be made

made by the Court

Such Rules may provide for application for adoption orders being heard and determined otherwise than in open Court

I of the purpose of any application under this Appointment Ordinance and subject to any Rules made thereunder, the Court shall appoint some person or body to act as guardian ad litem of the infant upon the hearing of the application with the duty of safeguarding the interests of the infant before the Court and where the body so appointed is a local authority the Court may authorize the authority to incur any necessary expenditure, and may direct out of which fund or rate such expenditure is to be defrayed, but nothing in this section shall be deemed to authorize the Court to appoint a local authority to act as a guardian ad litem of an infant except with the consent of that authority

of guardian ad litem for purpose of applications under the Ordinance

It shall not be lawful for any adopter or for any Restriction on parent or guardian except with the sanction of the Court to receive any payment or other reward in consideration of the adoption of any infant under this Ordinance or for any person to make or give or agree to make or give to any adopter or to any parent or guardian any such payment or reward

Where at the date of the commencement of this Provision as Ordinance any infant is in the custody of, and being brought up, maintained and educated by any person or two spouses jointly as his, her or their own child under any de facto adoption, and has for a period of not less than two years before such commencement been in such custody, and been so brought up, maintained and educated, the Court may, upon the application of such person or spouses, and notwithstanding that the applicant is a male and the infant a female, make an adoption order authorizing him, her or them to adopt the infant without requiring the consent of any parent or guardian of the infant to be obtained upon being satisfied that in all the circumstances of the case it is just and equitable and for the welfare of the infant that no such consent should be required and that an adoption order should be made

adoptions

14 (1) The Registral shall establish and maintain a Adopted register to be called the Adopted Children Register, in which Register shall be made such entries as may be directed to be made therein by adoption orders but no other entries

Direction in to Registiar General

- (2) Every adoption order shall contain a direction to the idoption order Registral General to make in the Adopted Children Register an entry recording the adoption in the form set out in the Schedule hereto
  - (3) If upon any application for an adoption order there is proved to the satisfaction of the Court —
    - (a) the date of the birth of the infant, and
    - (b) the identity of the infant with a child to which any entry or entries in the Register of Births relates,

the adoption order shall contain a further direction to the Registral General to cause such birth, entry or entries in the Register of Buths to be marked with the word "Adopted", and to include in the entry in the adoption register recording the adoption the date stated in the order of the adopted child's buth in the manner indicated in the Schedule hereto

Adoption order to be communicated to Registrar General

(4) The Court shall cause every adoption order to be communicated in the prescribed manner to the Registrar General, and upon receipt of such communication the Registiai General shall cause compliance to be made with the directions contained in such order in regard both to marking any entry in the Register of Buths with the word "Adopted", and in regard to making the appropriate entry in the Adopted Children Register

Certified copy of entry in register evidence of adoption

- (5) A certified copy of any entry in the Adopted Children Register if purporting to be sealed or stamped with the seal of the Registral General's Office shall without any further or other proof of such entry -
  - (a) where the entry does not contain any record of the date of the birth of the adopted child, be received as evidence of the adoption to which the same relates, and

Certified copy of entry as evidence of date of buth

(b) where the entry contains a record of the date of the buth of the adopted child, shall be received not only as evidence of the adoption to which the same relates but also as evidence of the date of the birth of the adopted child to which the same relates in all respects as though the same were a certified copy of an entry in the Register of Births

Index of 1 egistei

(6) The Registral General shall cause an index of the Adopted Children Register to be made and kept in the Registral General's Office, and every person shall be entitled

to search such index and to have a certified copy of any entry in the Adopted Children Register upon payment of such fee 15 may be prescribed

(7) The Registrar General shall, in addition to the Adopted Children Register and the index thereof, keep such other registers and books, and make such entries therein as may be necessary to record and make traceable the connexion between any entry in the Register of Births which has been marked 'Adopted' pursuant to this Ordinance and any corresponding entry in the Adopted Children Register, but such list mentioned registers and books shall not be, nor shall any index thereof be open to public inspection or search, nor except under an order of the Court shall the Registrar General furnish any person with any information contained in or with any copy or extract from any such registers or books

Registers and books to be kept and entries to be made by Registrar General

The Governor in Council may make regulations for Power of any matter, save the matter to be prescribed by the Court under section 10, which is by this Ordinance required to be make prescribed

#### A Bill to Make Special Provision for Mining in Proclaimed Areas

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenva, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows —

Short title

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "the Mining in Proclaimed Areas Ordinance, 1933," and shall come into operation upon such date as the Governor may by notice in the Gazette appoint

Application to proclaimed areas

2 This Ordinance shall apply to such areas of the Colony as the Governor by proclamation may declare to be proclaimed areas for the purpose of this Ordinance

Fee for prospecting in proclaimed areas No 1 of 1931 Ordinance, 1931, or in any Ordinance amending the same, no holder of a prospecting right shall be entitled to prospect within a proclaimed area unless he has paid to the Commissioner of Mines or to such other officer as the Governor may appoint a fee of five pounds, in addition to the fee of twenty shillings prescribed by section 12 of the Mining Ordinance, 1931

Fee for exclusive prospecting licences in proclaimed meas

4 No exclusive prospecting licence shall be granted over land within a proclaimed area unless the applicant has paid in addition to the registration fee and conveyancing fee prescribed by section 18 of the Mining Ordinance, 1931, a fee according to the schedule hereto

Fees for alluvial prospecting licences in proclaimed ireas No 1 of 1931 No 52 of 1932 5 Where under the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 20 of the Mining Ordinance, 1931, as amended by the Mining (Amendment) (No 2) Ordinance, 1932, the Commissioner of Mines consents to alluvial mining in existing rivers within a proclaimed area by the holder of an exclusive prospecting before such holder shall, in addition to any fee which

may be imposed under section 8 of the Mining (Amendment) (No 2) Ordinance 1932, pay for such consent a fee of such sum as the Commissioner of Mines may determine, not exceeding in any case fifty pounds per running mile of river frontage

6 Save as provided in the preceding sections of this Saving clause Ordinance, all the provisions of the Mining Ordinance, 1931, and of all Ordinances amending the same, shall apply to mining in a proclaimed area
