LOCUST REPORT, 2ND JUNE, 1933.

Uganda.—Locusts have been present in most districts, but comparison with records of a year ago shows that in general the locust infestation is lighter, swarms being smaller and hoppers more localized.

Eastern Province shows more flying swarms than other provinces, but nowhere are they remarkable for their size or frequency; there are no indications of a uniform direction of flight. Egg-laying is reported from North Busoga, and West Nile, and it is anticipated that further egg-laying will occur in Eastern Province.

The main hopper infestation is in Western Buganda and Bunyoro, the hopper bands being dense in some areas.

Tanganyika Territory.—The Migratory Locust: Lindi and Central Provinces are practically clear of locusts. Immature swarms are reported in certain districts of Lake and Western Provinces, the general direction of flight being to the north-west. No egg-laying has occurred.

The Red Locust.—The red locust is present in small scattered swarms in the area south of the Central Railway and west of 35° longitude. These swarms took wing during the early part of May, from hoppers which escaped destruction in Tabora and Iringa. This is the greatest extension of the sphere of this locust from its focus in the Lake Rukwa area that has so far been observed, and during the present dry season further extension is anticipated. A close check is being kept on swarm movements.

Kenya.—No reports of locusts have been received during the past fortnight, and as far as is known the Colony is clear.

RABIES PROGRESS REPORT

27th MAY, 1933.

Since the publication of the last progress report in April last, the campaign against rabies carriers has been rigorously carried on.

One fresh case of rabies has been recorded from Sotik, affecting a jackal, and two suspected cases were reported in the Lumbwa Native Reserve.

The South Kavirondo Native Reserve, and the neighbouring locations of the Central Kavirondo and Lumbwa Native Reserves have been re-baited and the South Kavirondo-Masai boundary has been heavily baited by the Game Department.

The Kisumu-Londiani District and neighbouring Forest Reserves have been similarly treated.

In view of the improved condition the original quarantine area has been reduced in size and several units of the staff have been withdrawn.

Kennels have been erected to give facilities for the quarantining of dogs, etc., for the period of incubation to fulfill conditions required for movement from the infected to the clean areas.

It has been decided to concentrate further efforts in the Lumbwa Native Reserve as it is considered that this area is the key position of the rabies control on account of its geographical position and so thereby creating a corridor between the infected areas on the west from the free areas in the east.
