His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the following Bill being introduced into the Legislative Council.

A Bill to Legalize the Payment of a Gratuity and a Reduced Pension to Captain Ernest John Sharland, Member of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “the Sharland Pension Ordinance, 1933.” Short title.

2. Anything in the European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1927, and the European Officers' Pensions (Consolidation) Regulations, 1930, to the contrary notwithstanding, it shall be lawful for the Treasurer to pay out of the revenue of the Colony to Captain Ernest John Sharland, Member of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, such gratuity and reduced pension as would have been payable to him if he had exercised his option to receive a gratuity and a reduced pension in manner provided by Regulation 16 of the European Officers' Pensions (Consolidation) Regulations, 1930.

Payment of gratuity and reduced pension to Capt. E. J. Sharland.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The object of this Bill is to enable effect to be given to Captain Sharland's wish to receive on ultimate retirement a gratuity and reduced pension in respect of his service under the Government of Kenya. Captain Sharland's pensionable service dates back from the 1st April, 1920, on which date he was appointed Pay and Quartermaster of the 4th King's African Rifles which regiment was stationed in Uganda. He is now stationed in Kenya. He exercised his option to receive a gratuity and reduced pension on retirement so far as his service in Uganda is concerned, but, being an officer of the Northern Brigade, he wrongly assumed that it was unnecessary for him to exercise the option separately in Kenya.

Owing to lack of sufficient data it is not possible to calculate accurately the financial effect of the Bill.

Section 39 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to be replaced :—

39. Every forest guard on the recommendation of the Conservator, and with the sanction of the Governor, shall, after nine years' continuous good service, be exempted from paying hut tax for one hut for life, or alternatively from paying poll tax in respect of himself for life.

A Bill to Amend the Forest Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “ the Forest (Amendment) Ordinance, 1933 ”, and shall be read as one with the Forest Ordinance (Chapter 149 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as “ the Principal Ordinance ”.

Short title.

2. Section 39 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—

Repeal and replacement of section 39 of the Principal Ordinance.

39. (1) Subject to the approval of the Governor on the recommendation of the Conservator, every forest guard enrolled on or before the thirty-first day of December, 1932, shall, after nine years' continuous good service, be exempt from payment of poll tax in respect of himself for his life, or alternatively, he shall be exempt from the payment of hut tax in respect of one hut for life;

Exemption from hut or poll tax or gratuities in lieu thereof.

Provided that any forest guard, to whom exemption from paying poll tax or hut tax has been granted under this sub-section, may, on discharge after continuous good service extending to a period of twelve years and at his option exercisable at the time of such discharge, be paid in lieu of such exemption a gratuity of ten pounds.

(2) Subject to the approval of the Governor on the recommendation of the Conservator, every forest guard enrolled on or after the first day of January, 1933, shall be granted, on discharge after continuous good service extending to a period of twelve years, in addition to any other gratuity payable on discharge under the provisions of this Ordinance, a gratuity of ten pounds.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

Under the present law every forest guard on the recommendation of the Conservator, and with the sanction of the Governor, is, after nine years' continuous good service, exempted from paying hut tax for one hut for life, or alternatively from paying poll tax in respect of himself for life.

Under the Bill the exemption from hut tax is retained for all persons who enrolled on or before the thirty-first day of December, 1932, as forest guards, but for future entrants a system of gratuities will be instituted to take the place of the tax exemption. Provision has also been made for similar payment of gratuities to persons who enrolled on or before the thirty-first day of December, 1932, who opt to forgo the exemption from hut and poll tax.

Apart from the payment of gratuities, which it is not possible to estimate, no expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

CONDITIONS

The High Commissioner shall not be liable for any loss, damage, deviation, misdelivery, delay or detention to the consignment or any part thereof except upon proof that the same arose from the wilful misconduct of his servants:

Provided that nothing in this condition shall exempt the High Commissioner from any liability he might otherwise incur in the following cases:—

- (a) Non-delivery of the whole of a consignment or of any separate package forming part of a consignment, properly packed and addressed, unless such non-delivery is due to accidents to trains or to fire;
- (b) Pilferage from packages or merchandise protected otherwise than by paper or other packing readily removable by hand, provided the pilferage is pointed out to a servant of the High Commissioner on or before delivery;
- (c) Misdelivery, where merchandise properly addressed is not tendered to or placed at the disposal of the consignee within 56 days, or in the case of perishable merchandise within a reasonable time, which shall not be less than six days after the delivery of the consignment by the sender to the High Commissioner;

Provided, however, that the High Commissioner shall not be liable in the said cases of non-delivery, pilferage or misdelivery upon proof by him that the same has not been caused by his negligence or misconduct or that of his servants.

RABIES PROGRESS REPORT.

14TH JUNE, 1933.

A further case of rabies in a jackal has been reported from the Sotik area, and confirmed.

The history is as follows:—

On the 7th June, a jackal entered a labour camp on a European-owned farm at Chemagel, appeared aggressive, but did not bite anybody, and made its escape before it could be destroyed.

On the following day a jackal appeared on another farm in the neighbourhood and bit three natives and a cow before it was destroyed. The brain of the jackal was immediately despatched to the Veterinary Research Laboratory, Kabete, and Rabies confirmed.

The three natives were sent to hospital for treatment immediately after the incident, and the cow was destroyed.

It appears likely that the same jackal was involved in both incidents, and it is a fortunate circumstance that he was promptly destroyed.

The campaign is proceeding vigorously in the Lumbwa and Kavirondo areas.

LOCUST REPORT.

15TH JUNE, 1933.

Tanganyika Territory.—The Migratory Locust: Flying locusts are general in the north-west and south-east of the Territory. The general direction of the latter is southwards into Portuguese Territory. Peripatetic swarms are reported in Mwanza district and a few in Shinyanga, while Biharamulo has been invaded by flyers from the south.

The Red Locust: Small swarms are reported in Tabora district.

Uganda.—No report has been received recently.

Kenya.—Flying swarms: A small scattered swarm was reported early in the month at Logitanyala, close to the Suk-Uganda border. This swarm was sexually mature and some members had appeared to have laid.

A large flying swarm is reported in the lower Mara Valley, Narok district, as having crossed the border from Ikoma.

Hoppers.—Small hatchings of hoppers are reported from Njoro and Elgon, but the latter, from specimens submitted, are believed not to be the migratory locust.
