KENYA PROCLAMATIONS, RULES AND REGULATIONS

Sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend :—

(2) The first appointments of members of the Board under paragraphs (c), (d) and (e) of sub-section (1) of this section shall be made by the Governor on the recommendation of the Director. The Board shall convene a conference in the first half of each calendar year after the passing of this Ordinance at which elections of such members to the Board as is provided in sub-section (5) of this section shall be made.

A Bill to Amend the Coffee Industry Ordinance, 1932.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “the Coffee Industry (Amendment) Ordinance, 1933,” and shall be read as one with the Coffee Industry Ordinance, 1932 (hereinafter called “the Principal Ordinance”), and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 31st day of December, 1932.

Short title.

2. Sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the deletion of the word “first” which appears in the fifth line thereof and the substitution therefor of the word “second”.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

As it stands at present the Principal Ordinance provides that the Coffee Board shall convene a conference in the first half of each calendar year after the passing of the Ordinance, at which conference elections of members of the Coffee Board shall be made. It is considered by the Coffee Board that from a seasonal point of view in relation to the collection of the levy provided for by the Principal Ordinance the second half of the year would be much more convenient and appropriate for the convening of the conference, and this Bill makes the desired amendment.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

Sub-section (2) of section 4 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend :—

Premium on
butter
exported.

(2) As soon as may be after the last day of each year the Treasurer shall, out of the butter levy fund, pay such sum as has been properly expended during the preceding year on the manufacture of stamps or wrappers or such other device as may be prescribed for indicating the payment of the levy, and such further sum, if any, as has been expended during the said year on the administration of the provisions of this Ordinance, and from the balance of the fund, after payment of such sums as aforesaid, shall pay to each person who during the preceding year has exported from the Colony butter manufactured in the Colony a bounty or premium which shall bear the same proportion to the amount of the fund then in the hands of the Treasurer as the amount of butter exported by such person bears to the total amount of butter exported from the Colony during such year.

Section 8 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend :—

Offences.

8. Any person who—

(a) contravenes or fails to comply with any requirement of this Ordinance or any prohibition, direction, or order issued under this Ordinance; or

(b) when furnishing any information for the purposes of any provision of this Ordinance furnishes information which is false; or

(c) in any manner obstructs or hinders or intimidates any person in the performance of any act which he is authorized to perform by virtue of this Ordinance,

shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds.

A Bill to Amend the Butter Levy Ordinance, 1931.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “the Butter Levy (Amendment) Ordinance, 1933,” and shall be read as one with the Butter Levy Ordinance, 1931, hereinafter referred to as “the Principal Ordinance”.

Short title.

No. 22 of 1931.

2. Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding at the end of sub-section (2) thereof the following proviso :—

“Provided that if the value of butter exported from the Colony, free on rail Kenya railway stations, together with the bounty or premium payable in respect of such butter under this sub-section exceeds the average price, as determined from time to time by the Treasurer, at which butter of fair average quality is sold wholesale in the Colony less the amount of the levy for the time being in operation there shall be paid in respect of such butter so exported so much only of the bounty or premium payable under this sub-section as will bring the price of such butter up to the price at which butter of fair average quality is sold wholesale in the Colony, and if at the close of any year there is a balance standing to the credit of the fund the Treasurer may carry forward such balance to meet the purposes of the fund for the ensuing year or may expend the whole or any part of such balance on such purposes in the interest of the dairy industry as the Governor may approve.”

3. Section 8 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding after paragraph (c) thereof the following paragraph :—

“(d) by the use of any wrapper bearing the levy stamp in which butter has previously been sold or by any other means falsely indicates that the levy imposed by this Ordinance has been paid in respect of the butter contained in any tin or package sold or exposed for sale.”

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This amending Bill gives power to regulate the amount of the bounty or premium payable under the Principal Ordinance in accordance with the average wholesale price of butter in the Colony.

Provision is further made for the disposal of a credit balance in any year, and for dealing with dishonest practices calculated to defeat the objects of the Principal Ordinance.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of the Bill become law.

THE MINING ORDINANCE, 1931.

THE MINING IN PROCLAIMED AREAS
ORDINANCE, 1933.

NOTICE.

IT is notified for general information that Government is now prepared to receive applications from companies, syndicates or individuals in the terms of Sir Albert Kitson's Report for exclusive prospecting licences in respect of the areas in the Nyanza Province numbered 3 and 4 in that Report.

In accordance with section 18 of the Mining Ordinance, 1931, applications must be in the prescribed form and applicants must give evidence of sufficient capital to ensure proper prospecting and must furnish details of the methods which they propose to pursue if their application is granted. Licences will be granted for one year but may be renewed at the discretion of the Governor for further terms of one year up to a maximum of three years on submission of a programme of further development.

The fees prescribed by the Mining in Proclaimed Areas Ordinance, 1933, will be payable in respect of each licence granted in these areas.

For the convenience of applicants these areas have been divided up into sections each of which has a road or river boundary easily discoverable on the ground. A key plan showing these divisions and the description of their boundaries may be obtained from the Government Printer, Nairobi, and enlarged and coloured copies of this plan may be inspected at the office of the Commissioner of Mines, Nairobi, and also at the offices of the Warden of Mines, Kisumu, Kakamega and Kisii.

Applications in respect of one or more or of all these divisions will be considered and should be in the hands of the Commissioner of Mines on or before September 15th.

Applications for areas which do not conform with the boundaries of these divisions will not be entertained.

The attention of applicants is drawn to the fact that 5 divisions are shown in the plan of the Lake within the Colony's boundary. Applications are similarly invited in respect of these areas, but the fees prescribed in the Mining in Proclaimed Areas Ordinance, 1933, will not apply to licences granted for them, which will be subject to the terms prescribed in the Mining Ordinance, 1931.

THE following notice by the Bank of England calling in transferred currency notes is published for general information:—

WHEREAS it is enacted by sub-section (1) of section 4 of the Currency and Bank Notes Act, 1928, that all currency notes issued under the Currency and Bank Notes Act, 1914, certified by the Treasury to be outstanding on the appointed day, namely the 22nd November, 1928 (but not including currency notes called in but not cancelled), shall for the purpose of the enactments relating to bank notes and the issue thereof be deemed to be bank notes and the Bank of England shall be liable in respect thereof accordingly:

And whereas it is enacted by sub-section (2) of section 4 of the Currency and Bank Notes Act, 1928, that the currency notes to which sub-section (1) of that section applies are referred to in the said Act as "the transferred currency notes":

And whereas it is enacted by sub-section (3) of section 4 of the said Act that the Bank of England shall have power on giving not less than three months' notice in the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes to call in the transferred currency notes on exchanging them for bank notes of the same value:

And whereas certain of the transferred currency notes still remain in circulation and it is desirable that they should be called in:

Now, therefore, the Bank of England, in pursuance of their powers in that behalf, hereby call in the transferred currency notes on the 31st July, 1933, for exchange for bank notes of the same value: accordingly, as from the 1st August, 1933, transferred currency notes will cease to be current or legal tender within the United Kingdom.

WITH reference to General Notice No. 862, dated 24th June, 1933, the following notice published in the Press in the United Kingdom on the 29th April, 1933, is published for general information:—

The Bank of England have given notice in the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes calling in, on the 31st July next, Currency Notes (or Treasury Notes as they are sometimes called) of the Third Series, the liability for which was transferred to the Bank when the Note Issues were amalgamated in November, 1928, and the present £1 and 10s. Bank Notes were first issued. Notes of the First and Second Series were called in by His Majesty's Treasury in June, 1920.

The £1 Currency Notes of the Third Series were first issued in February, 1917, and were printed in

brown; the 10s. Currency Notes were first issued in November, 1918, and were printed in green; the Notes each bear the facsimile signature either of Sir John Bradbury or of Sir N. F. Warren Fisher as Secretary to the Treasury.

Until the 31st July, 1933, the Currency Notes will continue to be legal tender and may be used in the ordinary way, but Members of the Public, however, would be well advised to pay any of such Notes in their possession into their Banking Accounts, or, if they have no Banking Account, to exchange them for Bank Notes at a Head Post Office, in order to avoid any inconvenience which might result from retaining them after that date.

As from the 1st August, 1933, Currency Notes will cease to be legal tender, but they will continue to be exchangeable at the Head Office of the Bank of England for Bank Notes of the same value.

The Bank of England £1 and 10s. Notes are not affected by the present notice.

All wood in the stems and branches down to 3 inches diameter to be utilized.

A minimum royalty of Sh. 4,000 in respect of the Area A and Sh. 500 in respect of Area B to be payable annually in advance, against which may be set off royalties on wood cut during the year.

(Chapter 140, Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.)

AUCTION OF FARMS.

THE grants of the farms specified in the Schedule hereto will, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140 of the Revised Laws of Kenya), be offered for sale at the District Commissioner's Office, Nairobi, commencing at 10 a.m. on Thursday, the 28th September, 1933. Plans of the farms may be seen at the Public Map Office, Survey and Registration Department, Nairobi, or may be had on application to the Surveyor General on payment of Sh. 3, post free, in respect of each plan required.

The right to withdraw any farm from the auction is reserved to the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement.

CONDITIONS OF SALE.

1. Each farm will be auctioned separately.

2. These farms are in the Highlands, and purchase will be confined to Europeans only (or their accredited agents), in conformity with the decision of His Majesty's Government.

3. The highest bidder will be the purchaser, and if any dispute arise as to any bidding, the farm will be put up again at the last undisputed bid.

4. The amount of the advance of each bid will be regulated by the auctioneer, and no bid shall be retracted.

5. Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer, immediately on the fall of the hammer, a deposit of 10 per cent of his purchase money, and should the same be tendered by cheque, such cheque must be accompanied by a banker's guarantee. In default of such payment, the farm may be immediately re-offered for sale, and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.

6. The balance of the purchase money in respect of Farms L.R. Nos. 3266, 2477, 2922, and 3351 may be paid in full to the Provincial Commissioner, Nakuru, and in respect of Farm L.R. No. 6373 to the Land Assistant, Nairobi, on or before the 1st November, 1933, or shall be paid in nine equal annual instalments, payable on the first day of January in each year, the first instalment being payable on the 1st January, 1934, and the purchaser shall inform the Provincial Commissioner, Nakuru, or the Land Assistant, Nairobi, as the case may require, on or before the 1st November, 1933, which method of payment he desires to adopt.

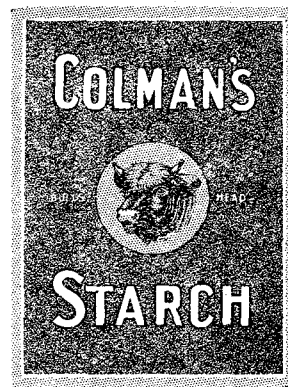
