DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.
RABIES PROGRESS REPORT.

THE rabies position in the Lumbwa District has assumed a much more serious aspect during the last fortnight.

Three further cases of rabies have been definitely confirmed by the Veterinary Research Laboratory during that time, two of which occurred in dogs and one in a jackal. The cases of rabies in dogs occurred one in the Koru district and one in the Masai-Kisii area, and the case in the jackal occurred in Location No. 10 of the Buret Reserve.

In addition to these confirmed cases an incident of an extremely suspicious nature also occurred in the Buret Reserve, but material was not available for confirmation. A jackal attacked a native child; other natives coming to the rescue observed two jackals one of which was killed, the other escaped. Unfortunately the incident was not reported until some days later when the dead animal was too decomposed for diagnosis.

As a result of these occurrences Europeans and natives have been obliged to undergo treatment.

It is now established that rabies infection exists in widely separated areas of the Lumbwa district and attention is drawn to the necessity of exercising the greatest caution to keep dogs under control, particularly at night, and to ensure that they do not come in contact with jackals. Sufficient evidence has been obtained to believe that infection exists to a considerable extent amongst jackals in the infected district, and it is desirable whenever possible that these animals should be destroyed.

Europeans and natives are again requested to render every possible assistance and to co-operate with this Department by reporting immediately all incidents of a suspicious nature; by the destruction of jackals and stray dogs, and to render assistance in every possible way.

There is nothing to report from the Kavirondo Reserves or the Molo-Mau Summit area.

11. At no time during the term of the grant shall any plot or any portion thereof or any building erected on the plot be used for the purpose of carrying on any trade or business which has been or may be declared to be dangerous or offensive by notice in the Official Gazette.

12. Verandas may be erected within a road reserve with the previous consent of the Municipal Council and must conform to a building line decided upon by them.

13. The term of each grant will be 99 years from the first day of September, 1933.
14. Under the provisions of section 60 (b) of the Crown Lands Ordinance, grantees will be required to pay Municipal rates upon the whole of the rateable interest and Government's contribution in lieu of rates assessed on these plots. A clause will, therefore, be embodied in each grant providing for the necessary adjustment between the grantee and Government.
15. The cost of the construction of tar grouted macadam roads, murrum sidewalks and main sewers to the Municipal Council's specification is included in the upset prices of those plots which are not served by constructed roads. The construction of these roads and sewers will be undertaken with-

out additional charge to the purchasers when, in the opinion of the Municipal Council, the work is required.


