- 9. (1) When the arbitrators or umpire have made their award, they shall sign it, and shall give notice to the parties of the making and signing thereof, and of the amount of the fees and charges payable to the arbitrators or umpire in respect of the arbitration and award.
- (2) The arbitrators or umpire shall, at the request of any party to the submission or any person claiming under him, and upon payment of the fees and charges due in respect of the arbitration and award, and of the costs and charges of filing the award, cause the award, or a signed copy of it, to be filed in the court; and notice of the filing shall be given to the parties by the arbitrators or umpire.
- (3) Where the arbitrators or umpire state a special case under section eight, clause (b), the court shall deliver its opinion thereon; and such opinion shall be added to, and shall form part of, the award.

A Bill to Amend the Arbitration Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

This Ordinance may be cited as "the Arbitration Short title. (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934", and shall be read as one with the Arbitration Ordinance (Chapter 18 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance."

2. Sub-section (3) of section 9 of the Principal Ordinance Amendment is hereby amended by inserting after the words "clause (b)" in the second line thereof, the words "or under section fourteen A."

The following section is hereby inserted in the Principal Ordinance as section 14A:-

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This amending Bill gives the Court power to compel an arbitrator to state a case when it appears that he has given a wrong decision on a point of law; this is in accordance with the practice in England.

A Bill to Amend the Tax on Imported Packages Ordinance, 1933.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "the Tax on Imported Packages (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934," and shall be read as one with the Tax on Imported Packages Ordinance, 1933, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance", and shall be deemed to have come into force on the first day of December, 1933.

Authority to enter into agreement for allocation of tax.

No. 38 of 1933.

2. The Governor in Council may enter into an agreement with the Government of the Tanganyika Territory to provide that one party to the agreement shall transfer to the other party a portion of the tax collected under the Principal Ordinance, or under any Ordinance to the same intent which may be in force in such territory, in respect of articles which, having been imported into the territory of the one party in packages on which such tax has been collected, are removed into the territory of the other party.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

There is no provision in the Tax on Imported Packages Ordinance, 1933, in regard to the disposal of tax paid on packages entering Kenya and which are subsequently removed to Tanganyika Territory.

This Bill empowers the Governor in Council to enter into an agreement with the Government of Tanganyika Territory in connexion with the transfer of such payments.

A similar provision exists in the Tanganyika Ordinance.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

A Bill to Amend the Land and Agricultural Bank Ordinance, 1930.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "the Land and Agricultural Bank (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934," and shall be read as one with the Land and Agricultural Bank Ordinance, 1930, as amended by the Land and Agricultural Bank No. 3 of 1931. (Amendment Ordinance, 1933, hereinafter referred to as No. 4 of 1933. "the Principal Ordinance."

2. In this Ordinance unless the context otherwise Interpretation requires—

"co-operative society" means a co-operative society as defined in the Co-operative Societies (Registration) Ordinance, No. 24 of 1931 1931, or any Ordinance amending or replacing the same;

"farmer" includes—

- (a) the duly authorized attorney of such farmer;
- (b) an executor or administrator of a deceased farmer if authorized by will or by an order of the court or otherwise by law to mortgage lands;
- (c) a trustee appointed by deed or will if authorized by such deed or will or by an order of the court or otherwise by law to mortgage lands; and
- (d) for the purposes of temporary advances under sections 3 and 4 of this Ordinance an executor or administrator of a deceased farmer, a trustee appointed by deed or will, and a receiver appointed by an order of the court or by a mortgage, even though such persons may not have been specifically authorized to mortgage lands.

Temporary advances.

- 3. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Principal Ordinance it shall be lawful for the Board out of the funds of the bank to make temporary advances to farmers for such purposes as may be prescribed by the Governor in Council and on such conditions as the Board may see fit in any case to impose: provided, however, that no advance of a sum exceeding five hundred pounds shall be made and every such advance shall bear interest at such rate per annum as may from time to time be fixed by the Board with the consent of the Governor in Council.
- (2) No advance shall be made under this section of a sum which together with advances made to the same farmer under paragraphs (a) and (b) of section 18 of the Principal Ordinance exceeds the maximum advance which can be made under section 27 (3) of the Principal Ordinance.
- (3) Every such advance made under this section with interest thereon shall become due and payable on the thirtieth day of June next following the date of the advance: provided, however, that the Board may, at its discretion, from time to time postpone the date of repayment for a total period not exceeding three years.
- (4) All moneys advanced under the provisions of this section, and all interest thereon and charges incidental thereto, shall be a charge on the lands in respect of which the advance is made and upon the crops and produce grown or to be grown thereon, when reaped or gathered therefrom, and on the product or article to be cured, made or manufactured from such crops and produce; and such crops and produce upon severance from the land and the product or article to be cured, made or manufactured therefrom shall not be deemed to be chattels No. 24 of 1930. within the meaning of the Chattels Transfer Ordinance, 1930; and the charge hereby created shall have priority both in law and in equity to all encumbrances whatsoever, save and except debts due to His Majesty, as from the date on which notice of the resolution to make such advance is published in the Gazette:

Provided, however, that before any advance is made under the provisions of this section the farmer shall first obtain the consent in writing of the several encumbrancers (if any) of the lands in respect of which the advance is applied for to such advance being made; and no charge created under the provisions of this section shall have priority to an encumbrance where the farmer has omitted to obtain the consent in writing of the encumbrancer.

Provided further that notwithstanding anything in the Registration of Titles Ordinance or in any other Ordinance Cap. 142. contained, or any provision of law or equity to the contrary, immediately upon the publication in the Gazette of the making of an advance authorized by this section, all persons dealing with the lands or any interest therein shall be deemed to have notice of such advance, and all such dealings shall be and be construed to be subject to the charge and priority created by this section.

4. (1) As soon as possible after the fixing of any advances Notification to to be allowed under the last preceding section the Board shall fill up a notification in the form to be prescribed by the Board Titles. and shall sign and forward the same to the Principal Registrar of Titles, who shall file the same in a register to be kept for the purpose, and such book shall be open to the public for inspection free of cost: Provided that where the advance to be allowed is in respect of lands held under the provisions of the Registration of Titles Ordinance the Principal Registrar of Titles shall also endorse a memorandum of the advance upon the Crown grant or certificate of title.

(2) No advance shall be made under this section until the requirements of sub-section (1) of this section have been complied with and notice of the resolution to make such advance has been published in the Gazette.

5. Upon the repayment by the farmer of any advance Repayment of made under section 3 of this Ordinance together with interest advances. at the rate prescribed to the date of such repayment, the Board shall give a receipt for the same; and the Principal Registrar of Titles shall, upon production to him of such receipt, write the word "Cancelled" across the notification filed in the register and across the memorandum (if any) endorsed on the Crown grant or certificate of title, and thereupon the charge created by this Ordinance in respect of the said advance shall be extinguished. Notice of the extinguishment of any advance shall be published in the Gazette as soon as possible after the date of such extinguishment.

6. (1) If any farmer shall make default in the payment Enforcement of any sums due by him under section 3 of this Ordinance of security. it shall be lawful for the Board to sell the lands in respect of which such advance was made.

(2) The provisions of section 45A of the Principal Ordin-No. 4 of 1933. ance as amended by the Land and Agricultural Bank (Amendment) Ordinance, 1933, shall apply to advances made under section 3 of this Ordinance as if they were advances made under Part II or Part III of the Principal Ordinance.

Consent by trustee to temporary advance.

7. The consent by a trustee to the postponement of his security to enable an advance under section 3 of this Ordinance to be made shall not itself be deemed improper or a breach of trust so as to render such trustee liable in respect of any loss or consequences resulting from such advance having been made, any rule of law or equity to the contrary notwithstanding.

Advances to co-operative societies.

- 8. (1) A co-operative society may, upon written application made in the form prescribed by the Board, obtain from the Bank on such condition as the Board may determine an advance for the erection of buildings and equipment and the purchase of land for any one or more of the objects which that society is legally competent to pursue. Such application, when signed by the chairman and secretary of the society, or by any persons purporting to act in those capacities, shall bind the society and all members of such society at the time of the making of the application, jointly and severally, for the repayment of any advance made by the bank in pursuance of such application.
- (2) Anything to the contrary notwithstanding in any law governing co-operative societies, any such society, subject to any other provisions contained in its rules, regulations or articles of association, may apply for such advance when authorized by a resolution passed by a majority of two-thirds of the members of the society present at a meeting duly convened.
- (3) The advance shall be made upon the joint and several liability of the members of the society at the time of the making of the application referred to in sub-section (1) hereof, and upon such additional security as the Board may require and shall bear interest at such rate as the Governor in Council may determine, payable periodically in advance, upon such dates as the Board may prescribe. The advance shall be repayable in half-yearly instalments, together with all interest due thereon, within ten years from the date thereof, unless the Board extend the period of repayment.
- (4) Any bond to secure an advance under this section shall be in the form prescribed by the Board.

- (5) Any co-operative society making an application as in sub-section (1) of this section shall at the same time lodge with the Registrar of Co-operative Societies a list of those persons who were members of the society at the time when the resolution was taken to make the said application.
- (6) The Registrar of Co-operative Societies shall, at the request of the Board, furnish such lists and other information as the Board may require regarding any society registered by him.
- The Board shall at all times have full access to all Examination accounts, documents, papers and books of any co-operative society to which an advance has been made by the bank or from which an application for an advance has been received, and may cause all such accounts, documents, papers or books to be examined by a member of the staff or by any person appointed thereto. The Board shall not make an advance to a co-operative society unless satisfied that all such accounts, documents, papers and books are in order.

10. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained Members of in any law, every member of a co-operative society shall remain liable after his withdrawal from the society for every debt or obligation to the bank which was incurred by the society while he was a member thereof and was undischarged at the date of his said withdrawal until the Board is satisfied that the society and its remaining members are capable of discharging the debt or obligation and to this end such members on withdrawal from the society shall provide full and sufficient security to the satisfaction of the Board for the due fulfilment of the said obligations.

Where the Board is satisfied that the retiring member has provided full and sufficient security for the due fulfilment of his debts and obligations under this Ordinance, the Board may issue to such member a certificate to that effect and such certificate shall be deemed to be a full discharge from all debts and obligations incurred by such member under the provisions of this Ordinance at the date of his withdrawal from the society.

11. Where a co-operative society is a limited liability company incorporated or registered in the Colony in accordance with law the liability of the shareholders of such company shall company. be limited to the amount (if any) of the share capital not

called up, and the provisions of section 10 of this Ordinance shall not apply to a person who has ceased to be a shareholder in such company.

Secretary empowered to administer oaths, etc. 12. Notwithstanding anything contained in any other law the Secretary to the Board is hereby empowered to administer oaths and take solemn declarations in matters where statements upon oath and solemn declarations are required by the Principal Ordinance or by anything prescribed by the Board:

Provided that any fee payable in respect of any such oath or declaration shall be paid into the general revenues of the Colony or be accounted for by stamps.

Waiver of priority.

13. Any mortgagee, chargee or other encumbrancer may by instrument under his hand agree that any mortgage, charge or encumbrance in favour of the Bank shall have priority, either for the purposes of section 3 of this Ordinance or for any of the purposes of the Principal Ordinance over his mortgage, charge or encumbrance, and such agreement shall for all purposes be binding upon the person agreeing, and his successors in title.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

On consideration of the Report of the Sub-Committee of the Board of Agriculture on Agricultural Credits, which was adopted by the Board in January, 1933, Government has decided to introduce this Bill into Legislative Council.

The objects of this Bill are three-fold, namely:-

- (1) To enable short-term loans up to a maximum of £500 to be made on adequate security but without charge to the borrower on acount of the preparation of mortgage deeds;
- (2) to enable advances to be made to Co-operative Societies for the erection of buildings and equipment and the purchase of land ancillary thereto; and
- (3) to empower the Secretary of the Land Bank Board to administer oaths and to take solemn declarations where statements upon oath and solemn declarations are required by the Principal Ordinance or by anything prescribed by the Board.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

LOCUST REPORT, 18TH JANUARY, 1934.

The Red Locust.—A large swarm of red locusts was reported on the 14th January, flying north-bywest between Arusha and Mbulu (about 130 miles south of the Kenya-Tanganyika border). In Kenya, a swarm is reported ten miles north-west of Vanga; Digo. No other reports of swarms in Kenya have been received this week, and no information has been received as to the present position of that swarm reported last week to have crossed the border forty miles from the coast. The swarms in the Moshi-Handeni area are mostly mature and egg-laying has taken place in Handeni; considerable damage has been done to crops in some areas.

The Migratory Locust.—Hoppers are reported in Maji Mazuri and Kampi-ya-Moto. Apart from the Nakuru district, the Colony is believed to be free from this locust.

RABIES PROGRESS REPORT.

One fresh case of suspicious rabies in the Colony has been reported in a dog from the Kakamega district since the last report was published on 22nd December last, making the second case in this outbreak. This area has been in quarantine since 13th September, 1933; further poison baiting is being carried out.

It was considered advisable to place certain forest reserves, contiguous to the Burnt Forest area, in provisional quarantine, where a case of rabies in a jackal was diagnosed, in order to enable poison baiting to be carried out.

Poison baiting is still being carried out in the Miwani-Kibigori, Kaimosi, Uasin Gishu districts and in the Mteitei Valley of the Songhor District.

The position of rabies in other settled areas and native reserves remains unaltered since the publication of the last report.

The following progress report is for public information giving a general outline of the rabies position up to the end of 1933.

Since August, 1931, to December 31st, 1933, forty-six positive cases of rabies have been confirmed by laboratory methods and a number of highly suspicious cases have also been reported.

The last positive case occurred in a bovine in the Eldoret district on the 13th December, 1933.

In the proclaimed areas 632,007 baits have been distributed and the known destruction of rabies carriers is: dogs, 29,040; jackals, 1,413; hyenas, 1,602; other animals, 1,446.

It has been estimated that approximately 5 per cent of the baits have been effective but it is considered that a very much higher mortality has resulted. Experiments in trapping have been carried out and so far have proved successful.

Reports also indicate that 61 natives have been bitten by rabid animals, and that 58 have received anti-rabid treatment. Also that two Europeans have been bitten by rabid animals and six have received treatment.


