A Bill to make Special Provision in Regard to the Pension of Walter Harragin.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Harragin Short title. Pension Ordinance, 1934.
- 2. Notwithstanding the proviso to Regulation 10 of the Pensionability European Officers' Pensions (Consolidation) Regulations, of service of 1930, the service of Walter Harragin from the 5th day of from the 5th October, 1933, to the 24th day of January, 1934, both days October, 1933, to the 24th inclusive, shall be deemed to be pensionable service for the January, 1934. purposes of the European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1927, No. 11 of 1927. as if during that period he were the substantive holder of the office of Attorney General, and shall count for pension and gratuity under the said Ordinance.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

Mr. Harragin, the Attorney General, was appointed to Kenya Colony with effect from the 5th October, 1933, although Mr. MacGregor, who was on leave, was the actual holder of the office until his leave expired on the 24th January, 1934.

It is thus necessary to make special legislative provision regarding Mr. Harragin's pensionable service during that period, and this Bill is designed to achieve this object.

The amount of public money involved if the provisions of this Bill become law will amount to approximately £21 per annum, but this expenditure will not of course be incurred until Mr. Harragin's ultimate retirement from the Colonial Service.

LOCUST REPORT, 1st FEBRUARY, 1934.

This report should be read in conjunction with the report issued by the Department of Agriculture, Tanganyika Territory, which is published below.

The Red Locust.—Since writing the last report the swarms which entered the Digo District are still remaining in that area and south of Mombasa and are extremely voracious and doing severe damage to crops.

The swarm which entered Kenya near Taveta passed over the Voi-Taveta railway at Bura on about the 25th January, and proceeding in an easterly direction crossed the railway from north to south near Samburu about 28th January and is still in that area. Another swarm however, crossed the railway at Mariakani flying from south to north on the 29th and was seen at Rabai on the same date flying in a north-easterly direction towards the coast north of Mombasa.

All those swarms in the Teita and Digo districts appear to be heading towards the coast where the moist conditions, which it is reported that they like, are to be found.

The swarms which were referred to in the last report as being at Kajiado on the 23rd continued to fly in a westerly direction as far as Lake Magadi where they were reported on the 24th of January. Later reports indicate that these swarms appear to be flying in no particular direction and are remaining in that area.

Swarms have also been reported on 28th January at mile nine on the Konza-Magadi railway line, also thirty-six miles south-south-west of Ngong, both flying in no particular direction. These two swarms may originate from those previously reported as flying between Kajiado and Magadi.

A report has just been received that another swarm has entered Kenya from Tanganyika Territory at Pusi Moru which is about seventy miles west of Magadi and about fifty miles south-southwest of Narok. This swarm is flying in an easterly direction.

From all the information so far received it would appear that the present infestation of locusts has reached its northernmost limit and that the swarms which have penetrated thus far are either flying in no particular direction or in an easterly or westerly one. Laying may be anticipated in about a month's time or earlier.

The red locust as far as is known has a very wide range of food plants but no records are yet to hand of destruction of coffee or cotton and these may be the only exceptions.

The thanks of this Department are due in particular to Provincial Commissioners and District Commissioners and the officers of the Railway Administration who have sent in constant reports and specimens during the past week.

LOCUST REPORT UP TO JANUARY 19TH.

The Territory now shows an infestation of flying red locusts stretching east to west from the sea to Lake Tanganyika. The swarms have moved on parallel lines from the south of the Territory and have now crossed its northern boundary near Tanga, and are approaching Mwanza and Biharamulo. Swarms may be found on a line from Mwanza to Tanga at various points.

There is another series of swarms following up which have now reached the border of the Rufiji district

Laying has been reported fairly extensively but it is too early to indicate the extent of the laying.

Dispositions are being made for an anti-hopper campaign in various infested areas. Villagers are at present planting their crops and will be doing so throughout February and early in March. The object should be to destroy all hopper bands within a radius of 6 to 10 miles of the villages or settlements to avoid the invasion of cropped areas by hopper bands. Where possible operations further afield may be organized, but planting should not be seriously interrupted and the wisdom of planting underground food plants like muhogo and sweet potatoes should be stressed.

It is reported that large stocks of foodstuffs are held in the Lindi and the Western Provinces, and it is hoped that the Territory will produce a sufficiency of native foodstuffs for its needs during 1934, to avoid importation.
