GENERAL NOTICE No. 228

LOCUST REPORT, 15TH FEBRUARY, 1934. Kenya Colony.

Coast.—The Red Locust. Swarms of varying density continue to infest Digo district and two large swarms were reported flying south-east across the railway on the 11th February. In Mombasa district, crops, fruit and coconuts have suffered damage. Cotton has been attacked in Kilifi where there are large swarms throughout the greater part of the reserve; swarms crossed the Sabaki River on a six-mile front near Kakoneni on the 12th February, but the majority of the swarms in the district show a tendency to go north and then to return.

Several small and medium scattered swarms persist in Teita district between Bura and Taveta and also from Mwatati to Voi. These are circling in all directions and laying is generally reported. Hoppers are reported over the Tanganyika border between Lake Jipe and Kahe. Owing to the drought in the lower parts of the district, there have been few crops to suffer damage.

Masai.—Locusts are still present in the area of the Kajiado infestation, described in last week's report, in fluctuating sporadic swarms of no great intensity. There is at present no movement in any given direction and certainly none northwards. Both mating and laying are reported.

Narok-Sotik.—Scattered swarms with no definite direction of flight are present in Trans-Mara, and over a wide area in Sotik from the Kisii hills to the Amala River. The swarms near Ramoja River and Lolgorien are reported as dense. In North Sotik circling swarms are causing damage to maize and are mating and laying.

General.—It will be seen from the above that there has been no report of any fresh invasions and, except in Kilifi and Sotik, no enlargement of the areas infested. In all areas direction of flight appears to be indefinite; mating is general and laying is now frequently reported.

Hoppers may be expected shortly in Digo, and preparations are being made for anti-hopper campaigns where necessary and practicable.

P.S. Since the above report was drafted, news has been received that a large swarm crossed the railway line at Sultan Hamud flying east into Machakos district on the 14th February. These locusts were part of the Kajiado infestation.
