LOCUST REPORT, 22ND FEBRUARY, 1934. Kenya.

The Red Locust.

Coast.—The situation in the Coast Province remains unchanged. Crops have been wiped out throughout the greater part of Digo district and the swarms now appear to be concentrating on Kwale, perhaps being attracted by the forest. A recent report from Malindi indicates that the swarm which crossed the Sabaki River flying north on the 7th instant, reached Shakadulo and the Lukole Lalo of Bungale on the 9th, remained there two days and then returned southwards. These locusts are now moving backwards and forwards between Shakadulo and Kakoneni, all maize has been destroyed in that area, while bananas, cassava and cotton have also been attacked.

Some damage has been done to mature maize in the Teita Hills where there are several diffuse swarms. The crops lower down being less advanced have suffered to a greater extent, together with grazing.

Masai-Machakos.—The area of infestation in Kajiado district remains much the same and no further invasions from over the border have been reported. On the 14th instant, however, as was briefly indicated in last week's report a strong easterly movement was noticed and swarms have been crossing the railway line between Kapiti Plains and Sultan Hamud since that date. These swarms are in general light and scattered, and on their reaching the locations of Machakos reserve their direction of flight has become uncertain and they are circling in three or four locations. No signs of mating or egg-laying had been observed by the beginning of this week.

Narok-Sotik-Kisii.—The position in Trans Mara and Sotik remains unchanged, but later reports indicate more clearly the extent of the infestation. Locusts are thinly scattered throughout the south and west of North Sotik, maize is being destroyed by small swarms which are circling round the district. Behind the Kisii hills swarms of varying density exist down to the Amala River on the Tanganyika border, the swarms being very dense by the Ramoja River and near Lolgorien. Laying is spasmodic over the whole area, little concentration being noticed at present. Small showers have fallen and laying may be expected to become more general as the rains increase. In Kisii, diffuse swarms, doing but little damage, are circling on a wide area, and laying has taken place in five Luo locations.

General.—As far as is known no further invasion from Tanganyika Territory has occurred and the Coast and Narok-Sotik-Kisii infestations have not increased in size or intensity. The Kajiado infestation has developed on the eastern side and spread into Machakos district, but it is not indicated as yet that there will be any great extension of the sphere of infestation either to the north-east to Kitui or to the north-west to Kikuyu.

TANGANYIKA TERRITORY.

The Red Locust.

Lake Province.—Swarms are in all districts; extensive laying has taken place in Shinyanga, Kahama and Maswa and hoppers have emerged in Uvinza.

Western Province.—Egg-laying and hoppers are reported.

Northern and Tanga Provinces.—No further flying swarms have arrived; the swarms previously reported are drifting about and laying is almost completed. Laying has taken place over wide areas in Masailand south-west of Arusha, in Ngare Olmotoni extending up to Arusha township, east of Moshi along the lower slopes of Kilimanjaro to Himu, on as far as Asseri, and at Arusha Chini, Weru Weru and Ngare Nairobi. Hatching commenced at several places on the 4th February. In Tanga Province, there is a large infestation in Handeni district, which will not be obliterated as the population besides suffering from famine has largely moved into adjoining areas.

Eastern Province is heavily laid over but hatching is patchy. In many areas active measures are in progress, but it is reported that an unsatisfactory response to instructions is manifested in several areas.

Central and Lindi Provinces.—Egg-laying has occurred in many districts and small hopper bands are general in all parts of Lindi Province.
