GENERAL NOTICE No. 448

RABIES PROGRESS REPORT.

Information received since the last report indicates that the existence of rabies is still prevalent in certain areas, and that the campaign in the Eldoret and Central Kavirondo districts must be continued.

Three positive cases are reported since the date of the last report; two occurred in the Eldoret district and one in Maseno district. The following are the details of the Eldoret outbreaks:—

Case No. 1 occurred on a farm about twelve miles from Eldoret, on the Londiani Road. A jackal attacked and injured four dogs and some fowls. The jackal was captured and destroyed and the brain sent to Kabete where it was diagnosed as positive to rabies. All in-contacts were destroyed.

Case No. 2 occurred on a farm in the Kipkarren area. A jackal again attacked a native and bit him in the hand. The jackal was killed by other natives and the brain was forwarded by the Veterinary Officer to Kabete, where it was diagnosed as positive to rabies. The native was sent to hospital for treatment.

A highly suspicious case is reported on a Songhor farm, in close proximity to the Nandi Escarpment, when a jackal entered a native hut and attacked and bit three natives inside. The jackal was killed and thirteen natives, closely associated with the jackal's destruction, have been sent to Kisumu Hospital for treatment. The skull of the animal was so badly damaged that no brain tissue could be obtained. A piece of spinal cord was, however, obtained and has been used for diagnostic purposes.

Poison baiting is being carried out on the affected farms and surrounding areas in all cases.

A further suspicious case was reported in the Nandi Native Reserve. A child was attacked by a jackal and bitten on the hand. Unfortunately no material was collected for diagnosis.

LOCUST REPORT, 29TH MARCH, 1934.

KENYA.

The Red Locust.

Coast Province.—Small and scattered hatchings are reported to have taken place on the 27th instant in the Digo area in the vicinity of Shimba and Mwachi; these are being dealt with locally. Otherwise there is no change in the situation.

Masai-Machakos Area.—Recent layings over a large area in the Machakos Reserve are reported to have taken place, and in order to keep in close touch with the position and at the same time to obtain all possible data regarding this infestation, an officer has been despatched to thoroughly investigate and report upon the whole situation in that district. A small supply of poison bait has been sent to Machakos to cope with any sudden emergences.

Sotik-Kisii Area.—No change of any importance is reported from this area.

The Migratory Locust.

Various minor swarm movements are recorded, principally in the Kakamega District, but no definite news of any layings has been received. The general movement of swarms in this area appears to be in a southerly direction.

General.

There is no material change in the general situation since last week's report.

TANGANYIKA.

The following is an extract from a report received from Tanganyika and dated 24th March:—

"Western Province.—Since the advent of general rains hatching accelerated and a fairly heavy infestation was revealed particularly in the Nzega District. The excellent organization evolved, assisted particularly by the scouting done by detachments of King's African Rifles and their officers, has enabled the administration to take a good grip of the situation and it is anticipated that the efforts being made in this province will successfully bring the pest under control in the hopper stage, but the campaign is proving somewhat arduous.

Rufiji.—The reports still indicate that the infestation will not come under control whilst in the Kiberege area the long grass effectively hides the hopper bands so that oversight is rendered difficult and escapes will be numerous. Crop losses to date are fairly serious.

Kilosa.—Vigorous measures comprising poisoning, beating and trenching continue in all infested areas, but as reported from other parts of the Eastern Province, there is a continuous emergence of hopper bands from the bush. Serious crop

damage has been occasioned by hoppers; up to 70 per cent of the grain crops being damaged whilst large cotton plants and young cassava are attacked by the hopper.

Over the border in Kenya between Taveta and Lake Jipe a flying swarm laid heavily. A large hatching took place near Lake Jipe, where we have a power spraying unit operating. The country from Rombo to Bura is clear, and the department is concentrating on the Taveta-Jipe outbreak. This should be cleared up quickly if the dry weather continues.

Lindi Province.—No report to hand.

General.—Considering that hatching commenced on 25th January by this date the first hatched hoppers should be moulting into flyers. So far no reports of this transformation are to hand from any district. During April it is expected that a number of flying swarms will arise but the anticipated rains will pin the swarms down. It is satisfactory to record that at long last birds have appeared in numbers and it is hoped that the birds reported as consuming hoppers in Masailand, in Kenya, will spread southwards."
