SUPPLEMENT.

KENYA PROCLAMATIONS, RULES AND REGULATIONS

Section 79 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend :—

### Registration of charges.

- 79. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Part of this Ordinance, every charge created after the fixed date by a company registered in the Colony and being a charge to which this section applies shall, so far as any security on the company's property or undertaking is conferred thereby, be void against the liquidator and any creditor of the company, unless the prescribed particulars of the charge, together with the instrument, if any, by which the charge is created or evidence, or a copy thereof verified in the prescribed manner are delivered to or received by the registrar for registration in manner required by this Ordinance within forty-two days after date of its creation, but without prejudice to any contract or obligation for repayment of the money thereby secured, and when a charge becomes void under this section the money secured thereby shall immediately become payable.
  - (2) This section applies to the following charges—
  - (a) a charge for the purpose of securing any issue of debentures;
  - (b) a charge on uncalled share capital of the company:
  - (c) a charge created or evidenced by an instrument which, if executed by an individual, would require registration as an instrument under the Chattels Transfer Ordinance, 1930;

His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the following Bill being introduced into the Legislative Council.

#### A Bill to Amend the Companies Ordinance, 1933.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Companies Short title. (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934, and shall be read as one with the Companies Ordinance, 1933, hereinafter referred to as the No. 28 of 1933. Principal Ordinance.
- 2. Section 79 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of amended by repealing sub-section (5) thereof and by renumbering the remaining sub-sections thereof accordingly.

  Amendment of section 79 of the Principal Ordinance.

- (d) a charge on immovable property, wherever situate, or any interest therein;
- (e) a charge on book debts of the company;
- (f) a floating charge on the undertaking or property of the company;
- (g) a charge on calls made but not paid;
- (h) a charge on a ship or any share in a ship;
- (i) a charge on goodwill, on a patent or a licence under a patent, on a trade mark or on a copyright or a licence under a copyright.
- (3) In the case of a charge created out of the Colony comprising solely property situate outside the Colony, the delivery to and the receipt by the registrar of a copy verified in the prescribed manner of the instrument by which the charge is created or evidenced, shall have the same effect for the purposes of this section as the delivery and receipt of the instrument itself, and forty-two days after the date on which the instrument or copy could, in due course of post, and if despatched with due diligence, have been received in the Colony, shall be substituted for forty-two days after the date of the creation of the charge, as the time within which the particulars and instrument or copy are to be delivered to the registrar.
- (4) Where a charge is created in the Colony but comprises property outside the Colony, the instrument creating or purporting to create the charge may be sent for registration under this section notwithstanding that further proceedings may be necessary to make the charge valid or effectual according to the law of the country in which the property is situate.
- (5) Where a charge comprises property situate outside the Colony and registration in the country where the property is situate is necessary to make the charge valid or effectual according to the law of that country, the delivery to and the receipt by the registrar of a copy verified in the prescribed manner of the instrument by which the charge is created or evidenced, together with a certificate in the prescribed form stating that the charge was presented for registration in the country where the property is situate on the date on which it was so presented shall, for the purposes of this section, have the same effect as the delivery and receipt of the instrument itself.

- (6) Where a negotiable instrument has been given to secure the payment of any book debts of a company the deposit of the instrument for the purpose of securing an advance to the company shall not for the purposes of this section be treated as a charge on those book debts.
- (7) The holding of debentures entitling the holder to a charge on immovable property shall not for the purposes of this section be deemed to be an interest in immovable property.
- (8) Where a series of debentures containing, or giving by reference to any other instrument, any charge to the benefit of which the debenture holders of that series are entitled pari passu is created by a company, it shall for the purposes of this section be sufficient if there are delivered to or received by the registrar within forty-two days after the execution of the deed containing the charge or, if there is no such deed, after the execution of any debentures of the series, the following particulars—
  - (a) the total amount secured by the whole series; and
  - (b) the dates of the resolutions authorizing the issue of the series and the date of the covering deed, if any, by which the security is created or defined; and
  - (c) a general description of the property charged; and
  - (d) the names of the trustees, if any, for the debenture holders,

together with the deed containing the charge or a copy thereof verified in the prescribed manner, or, if there is no such deed, one of the debentures of the series:

Provided that, where more than one issue is made of debentures in the series, there shall be sent to the registrar for entry in the register particulars of the date and amount of each issue, but an omission to do this shall not affect the validity of the debentures issued.

(9) Where any commission, allowance or discount has been paid or made either directly or indirectly by a company to any person in consideration of his subscribing or agreeing to subscribe, whether absolutely or conditionally, for any debentures of the company, or procuring or agreeing to procure subscriptions, whether absolute or conditional, for any such debentures, the particulars required to be sent for registration under this section shall include particulars as to the amount

or rate per cent of the commission, discount or allowance so paid or made, but omission to do this shall not affect the validity of the debentures issued:

Provided that the deposit of any debentures as security for any debt of the company shall not for the purposes of this sub-section be treated as the issue of the debentures at a discount.

- (10) In this Part of this Ordinance-
- (a) the expression "charge" includes mortgage;
- (b) the expression "the fixed date" means in relation to the charges specified in paragraphs (a) to (f), both inclusive, of sub-section (2) of this section, the 1st day of April, 1922, and in relation to the charges specified in paragraphs (g) to (i), both inclusive, of the said sub-section, the commencement of this Ordinance.

Section 146 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend:—

Particulars with respect to directors in trade catalogues, circulars, etc. 146. (1) Every company to which this section applies shall, in all trade catalogues, trade circulars, showcards and business letters on or in which the company's name appears and which are issued or sent by the company to any person in any part of His Majesty's dominions, or in any country under the protection of His Majesty or in respect of which His Majesty has accepted a mandate, state in legible roman letters with respect to every director being a corporation, the corporate name, and with respect to every director being an individual, the following particulars—

- (a) his present Christian name and present surname;
- (b) any former Christian names and surnames;
- (c) his nationality, if not British;
- (d) his nationality of origin, if his nationality is not the nationality of origin:

Provided that, if special circumstances exist which render it in the opinion of a judge of the Supreme Court expedient that such an exemption should be granted, a judge of the Supreme Court may grant, subject to such conditions as he may specify, exemption from the obligations imposed by this sub-section.

- (2) This section shall apply to—
- (a) every company registered under this Ordinance or the Indian Companies Act, 1882, as applied to the Colony, and the Companies Ordinance; and

- 3. Section 146 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by repealing sub-section (1) thereof and by substituting therefor the following:-
  - "146. (1) Every company to which this section ap- Particulars plies shall, in all trade catalogues, trade circulars, showcards and business letters on or in which the company's name appears and which are issued or sent by the catalogues, company to any person in any part of His Majesty's dominions, or in any country under the protection of His Majesty or in respect of which His Majesty has accepted a mandate, state in legible roman letters with respect to every director being a corporation, the corporate name, and with respect to every director being an individual, the following particulars:

with respect to directors in trade circulars, etc.

- (a) his present Christian names or the initials thereof, and present surname;
- (b) any former Christian names and surnames;
- (c) his nationality, if not British;
- (d) his nationality of origin if his nationality is not the nationality of origin:

Provided that if special circumstances exist which render it, in the opinion of the registrar, expedient that such an exemption should be granted, the registrar may grant, subject to such conditions as he may specify, exemption from the obligations imposed by this subsection.

Any person aggrieved by a refusal to grant an exemption under this sub-section may appeal to a judge of the Supreme Court sitting in chambers."

- (b) every company incorporated outside the Colony which has an established place of business within the Colony;

- (c) every company licensed under the Money-lenders Ordinance, 1932, whenever it was registered or whenever it established a place of business.
- (3) If a company makes default in complying with this section, every director of the company shall be liable on summary conviction for each offence to a fine not exceeding five pounds, and, in the case of a director being a corporation, every director, secretary and officer of the corporation, who is knowingly a party to the default, shall be liable to a like penalty:

Provided that no proceedings shall be instituted under this section except by, or with the consent of, the Attorney General.

- (4) For the purposes of this section—
- (a) the expression "director" includes any person in accordance with whose directions or instructions the directors of the company are accustomed to act;
- (b) the expression "Christian name" includes a forename;
- (c) in the case of a peer or person usually known by a title different from his surname, the expression "surname" means that title;
- (d) references to a former Christian name or surname do not include—
  - (i) in the case of a peer or a person usually known by a British title different from his surname, the name by which he was known previous to the adoption of or succession to the title; or
  - (ii) in the case of natural born British subjects, a former Christian name or surname where that name or surname was changed or disused before the person bearing the name attained the age of eighteen years; or
  - (iii) in the case of a married woman the name or surname by which she was known previous to the marriage;
- (e) the expression "showcard" means cards containing or exhibiting articles dealt with, or samples or representations thereof.

#### OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill is designed to amend the Companies Ordinance, 1933, in two respects—

- (a) by repealing sub-section (5) of section 79 of the Ordinance which deals with charges comprising property situated outside the Colony. The provisions of sub-sections (3) and (4) as to these charges make the retention of this sub-section unnecessary;
- (b) by altering the requirements of section 146 as to the printing of the names of directors of companies on the companies' stationery, etc. Power is given to the Registrar to grant exemption from the provisions of the section, and to a Judge in chambers to hear appeals from the Registrar's decision on such matters.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

HIS Excellency deeply regrets to announce the death in England on the 10th April, 1934, of Major Arthur Tremayne Miles, D.S.O., O.B.E., M.C., Regular Army Reserve of Officers.

Major Miles arrived in this country in 1909. After service in the Great War with the East African Mounted Rifles, the East African Somali Scouts and the King's African Rifles, Major Miles continued to serve with the latter force until 1923 when he was appointed His Britannic Majesty's Consul for Southern Abyssinia, which post he was holding at the time of his decease. From 1928 to 1930 he was seconded to Government House as Senior Aide-de-Camp.

By his untimely death at the age of 45 years Government has lost a courageous, efficient and popular officer who had endeared himself to all with whom he came in contact.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

Commencing at the trigonometrical station Niahumbe;

thence by a straight line to the trigonometrical station Akarra;

thence southerly by a straight line to the point of intersection of the centre line of the Yala River with the centre line of the Otodo River;

thence by a straight line to the mouth of the unnamed stream situated to the north of Kadimo Trading Centre and at the most north-easterly point of Kadimo Bay;

thence generally south-easterly and easterly by the lake shore to the mouth of the unnamed stream which enters the Kavirondo Gulf about one mile north of Kisumu Railway Station;

thence by the centre line of that stream to its intersection with the eastern boundary of the Kisumu-Mumias main road.

thence northward by the eastern boundary of that road and the Mumias-Malikisi main road to its intersection with a line parallel to 250 feet distant from and on the south side of the left bank of the Nzoia River;

thence generally south-westerly by that parallel line to a point due north of the trigonometrical station Niahumbe;

thence by a straight line to the point of commencement.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE.

1. A strip a mile wide and bounded as follows. Commencing at the mouth of the unnamed stream situated to the north of Kadimo Trading Centre and at the most north-easterly point of Kadimo Bay;

thence by a straight line towards the intersection of the centre line of the Yala River with the centre line of the Otodo River for a distance of one mile;

thence by a line parallel to the lake shore to its intersection with the eastern boundary of the Kisumu Mumias main roads;

LOCUST REPORT, 12TH APRIL, 1984.

KENYA.

The Red Locust.

Coast Province.—Scattered swarms are still present in the Ngao-Kao neighbourhood while the principal infestation is at Golbanti, where the locusts have remained for a month and are reported to be laying. Though this oviposition will, if normal conditions prevail, be flooded in April the hatchings will merely be delayed by such flooding, as submergence for any reasonable period will not destroy the eggs.

It is reported that during the north-easterly flights from Kau to Garsen, previously reported, maize was young and entirely stripped or at least the tassel was eaten; the buds and flowers of green gram were consumed and bananas stripped.

From the Voi-Taveta region it is reported that flyers are thickest at the moment in Western Teita and that many are in the laying stage. Some of the earlier layings have failed to hatch out, though emergences have occurred on a small scale. The hoppers are being systematically destroyed as they appear by beating and burning.

Masai-Machakos Area.—As mentioned in my report of the 29th March, an officer was despatched to Machakos to investigate the whole position on the spot. The officer now reports that hatchings have taken place over a large area, notably in the vicinity of Mataliko where several hundred acres of hoppers have emerged, it is expected that further hatchings of considerable extent will occur in this district during the next few weeks.

A destruction campaign has been organized and is now in operation in the Emali-Mukaa-Nzani portion of the reserve. The assistance by co-operation of the neighbouring Ukamba chiefs has been obtained, and a European officer appointed to supervise the work. The operations will consist of beating and the distribution of poison bait.

Some opposition on the part of the natives to the use of poison was encountered, owing to rumours of serious cattle losses during previous campaigns, but this prejudice was overcome by means of a personal demonstration of the correct methods of using and laying poison bait, which was carried out in the presence of the assembled native chiefs. After witnessing the demonstration it was agreed by all concerned that no danger to their stock need be feared.

Small swarms of flyers are still present in the Machakos reserve and layings are taking place.

Sotik-Kisii Area.—Considerable emergences are reported, principally in Kiss-Sotik-Masai border area, during the last few days. As hatchings are not yet complete it is difficult to estimate the size of the infestation, but though it would appear to be larger than previously reported it is anticipated that the hoppers should be fairly easy to control. At present they are being satisfactorily dealt with on European farms and the local administrative officers are dealing with native areas. The necessary steps for the organization of a more intensive campaign, should such be required, have been taken and will be put into effect as soon as the necessity arises.

The Migratory Locust.

No reports of any movements have been received during the past week.

#### TANGANYIKA TERRITORY.

The following is extracted from the Tanganyika report for week ending 7th April:—

Northern Province.—The emergence of hoppers in the Moshi and Arusha d'stricts follows the scattered showers of rain, and is no longer attractive as the hoppers prefer green grass. Taveta-Jipe infestation has been brought under control and is reported free of hoppers, staff and equipment have been moved and are operating at Himo. Reports from Masailand indicate hatchings in widely separated localities, and there is a heavy hopper hatching at Ndarumu.
